There is also a briefing at the Frome Vale Area Forum on the 18th September at Chipping Sodbury Town Hall. Also a member from Network Rail will be giving a briefing on the Great Western Electrification programme and Bridge works. Community Grants will be decided as well as New Homes Bonus – to date no applications have been received.

Planning

The closing date for the consultation on the Draft Policy Sites and Places document has now closed. Cllr Hope tried to circulate this to residents but was made aware of the woeful state of accessing the papers on the website. Cllr Hope did try to get this improved. The Call for Sites papers has caused interest, but most of the areas are outside the current planning policies.

As circulated the application for 3 bungalows at Birgage Road has been turned down, and the application for a house in the garden of Bramble Cottage has been withdrawn.

Hospitals and Health

A document commissioned by the Public Health Committee will be presented at the next committee later in September-this gives access times to primary and secondary

health services in South Gloucestershire. It probably comes as no surprise to learn that it is quicker to get to the BRI rather than Southmead by bus. The committee will also be learning about the possible new plans for Rehabilitation at Frenchay.

Composting

Many Thanks to all those who responded to the consultation on Community Composting – a decision will be made at the communities meeting in September.
