



'Streetcare localism' scheme set for April launch

Due to South Gloucestershire Council having to reduce costs you will see a few changes in the parish effective from the 1st April 2014.

The first will be the absence of dog bins. Dog mess can now be deposited into the regular litter bins. You will see the dog bins disappearing from the 1st April with a sticker being put on the litter bins advising that it can now be used for dog mess as well. There will also be a new litter bin appearing on the alleyway between Sandpits Lane and Highfields.

The second change, which hopefully you will see little disruption, is grass cutting. There are certain areas in the parish that are currently cut by South Gloucestershire Council and these will remain with them. For the number of cuts throughout the year to be kept to the current standard, it involved an increase in the parish percept for 2014/15 of around £500.00 for the year.

All other Core Services provided by South Gloucestershire Council will remain and are a legal requirement; a list is below;

- Maintaining the highway network (including roads, footways, cycle ways, streetlights, traffic signals and road signs) in a safe, clean and usable condition
- Cutting grass on highways land twice a year for visibility and safety
- Maintaining trees that are within the highway boundary
- Maintaining highway structures, drains and street furniture such as bollards, benches and signs
- Making sure all areas are free of litter, weeds, graffiti, fly posting and fly tipping
- Responding to emergencies to ensure safety and keep the road network moving
- Providing a winter maintenance service to keep the highway clear of snow and ice

The following item was kindly send in by Dave Wilmott, who has been in contact with Douglas Sims (subscriber & regular contributor from Exeter) regarding a story about Arthur James Starling who lived in Hawkesbury Upton, who was awarded the military medal in WW1. This has been submitted to the Parish News on behalf of Sylvia Starling.

A personal appreciation was as the will never see his like again. Arthur is dead in his 90th year, full of years and honour. Everybody in a sense is part of history, but in a special sense Arthur was and is part of the history of these islands, the history of two great world wars, and the history of Hawkesbury.

A native of Hertfordshire, he early became used to the ways of horses, and early on at the outbreak of the I9I4 - I9I8 war, in the now famous phrase, he was 'economical with the truth', hid his real age and enlisted in the army at the age of I5½. He joined the hussars, the Light Cavalry, the old 'jingle jangles and went with his regiment to France and Belguim in the first six months of the I9I4 - I9I8 war, the fighting was fairly fluid, not yet the ghastly slaughter of trench warfare. There were occasional small cavalry actions and patrols. It was one of these patrols with Arthur "riding picquet" that was 'jumped' by a patrol of German Cavalry, a hand to hand fight with sabre and sword ensued. In it Arthur received a severe wound on the upper face and was unconscious. The Germans put him face down across and over the top of his horse which they sent back to our lines. In later years Arthur sometimes complained that whereas the Germans could both slash and pierce with their swords, the British could only pierce. Not the first and probably not the last British soldier to complain about the superiority of some enemy weapons.

He was transfered to "Blighty" - England. There in hospital, half delirious, he used to worry about his horse, so the Doctor to calm him, arranged for a horse to be paraded, as his, outside the hospital window. This calmed him. He was discharged as medically unfit. In later years he became almost a living legend as one of the very few surviving, to have been wounded in a hand to hand cavalry action on the Western front 1914 - 1918.

He went to work in the stable at Cross Hands. There he met his future wife, Dorothy, working at a neighbouring farm, and he began his courtship. Dorothy moved to Weston, that did'nt stop Arthur. Dorothy finally said'yes' and they got married at Hawkesbury Church. After the service coming back up the hill in the pony and trap, the pony was too feeble to pull both of them, so Arthur walked behind.

But Arthur re- enlisted in spite of being medically unfit. He joined the Royal Corps of Signals. He was sent on a little known side show of the end of the I4 I8 war, a Churchill inspired exspedition to Archangel in North Russia to help the white Russians to fight the Bolscheviks (present day Soviet) he was promoted to Sergent and was awarded the Military Medal.

After some years of peace his military life was reactivated and in the I939 -45 war, he was commissioned and commanded the Hawkesbury unit of Dads Army who found Hawkesbury Monument useful.

Local tradition has it that for several months after the end of the '39 -'45 war the top of the Monument still smelt of home made wine.....

Seven out of nine of Arthur and Dorothy's children, male and female, served in the armed forces during the last war. After this war Arthur became a leading member of the Hawkesbury Branch of the Royal British Legion, he was standard bearer. At his funeral his comrades paid him affectionate honours.

I think the beacon - light of his life was his marriage to his wife Dorothy at the end of the first world War. She was, and is a comely, handsome woman, at the time of his death in his ninetyith year at home, they made a fine couple together and had at the time of his death 28 great grandchildren.

They lived for many years at Six Cottages but in recent years moved to one of the O.A.P. bungalows in Highfields.

Arthur worked for many years in the quarries. It must not be thought that he was a sort of local "Colonel Blimp" - far from it. He had strong opinions and held and expounded them strongly. Though used to an admirer of military discipline in it's proper place he was in no sense servile or subservient. He was not an automatic admirer of "The Establishment". He was his own man and had fine natural manners. Indeed he was one of natures gentlemen

Our speaker for February was **Brian Noble** who gave a talk on '**Growing and Cooking Potatoes**'. Brian, as usual, gave much more info than is possible to record here but some details are not well known. Potatoes originated in South America and have been found in Incan tombs. In the wild they were very small in size. They did not suffer from bugs or infections because they were grown at over 600 feet above sea level which is free from noisome insects etc. Potatoes were brought to Europe by the Spanish Conquistadores and initially fed to the poor as they were not thought to be a fit food for anyone else. A Frenchman, Antoine-Augustin Parmentier, believed that potatoes were a bit special and planted a potato garden in Paris. To get his point across he began a series of publicity stunts. He hosted dinners at which potato dishes featured prominently and invited guests such as Benjamin Franklin and Antoine Lavoisier. He gave bouquets of potato blossoms to the King and Queen. He surrounded his potato patch with armed guards to suggest that he was growing valuable plants. He then instructed the guards to accept bribes and he withdrew them at night so the greedy crowd could "steal" the potatoes.

As usual Brian was eager to impart his knowledge and was ready to answer any question thrown at him. We look forward to what he will come up with next year.



Some thoughts for the April garden

The garden centres are currently over-flowing with a tempting array of plants but one needs to be cautious about planting during this month, as many of the plants on view are vulnerable to late frosts which can be with us sometimes until late May, or even early June. The message is to restrain from buying tender plants if there is nowhere to keep them in the event of a frost warning, unless fleece is available to cover plants in a cold snap. A single layer of horticultural fleece will give protection to 3 degrees of frost, so it's worth having some handy. Even in an un-heated greenhouse the temperature can drop to an unsafe level for some plants such as cucumbers and it is safer to leave the planting of these seeds until the end of April or early May.

It's worth remembering that the garden centres would love to sell to sell the same plants twice if the first lot are lost to a frost

During this busy seed planting period, the soil can often appear to be in good heart and as it dries out looks as though it will produce good crops. It should be borne in mind, however that the extra-heavy rainfall of the last few months will have leached out much of the nutrients and the soil will benefit from a good general feed such as growmore, fish blood and bone, or chicken manure pellets.

Hawkesbury Upton Neighbourhood Watch

Reducing the opportunity for crime

There have been a number of incidents recently where burglars have been impersonating Police Officers.

The Police Statement follows:

Police are warning householders after four reported incidents of thieves posing as Police officers calling on homes in **South Gloucestershire and Wiltshire** in recent weeks.

The latest incidents happened on the evening of Tuesday 4 March, in **Oldbury-on-Severn** and **Yate** in South Gloucestershire.

At about 20:00 a man with the word 'Police' on his top called on an elderly couple in Oldbury-on-Severn, claiming to be a Police officer investigating burglaries in the area. It's not yet confirmed whether anything was stolen in this incident, which was reported by a neighbour in the morning, Wednesday 5 March.

At about 21:40 on Tuesday a man called at a house in Yate making the same claim. He was said to have been wearing normal clothes under a fluorescent yellow jacket with a 'Police badge' and a black woollen hat. When the householder asked to see his warrant card, the man walked away.

The two earlier incidents happened on the same day, Saturday 22 February. Two men called on a house in **Lower North Wraxall**, Wiltshire, at about 19:00, claiming to be Police officers investigating burglaries in the area, but were not let into the property.

Within the hour, a similar incident happened in **Badminton**, South Gloucestershire. A man called at the home of an 87-year-old lady. He claimed there had been burglaries in the area and asked if her cash was safe. The man kept her talking while a second man joined them, and after they had left she found her money was missing. The men were described as follows:

Man A was White, in his late 30s, about 5ft 4ins tall and of stocky build with a round, clean-shaven face. He wore a sleeveless yellow high visibility top with the word 'Police' on the front and a woollen hat. Man B was White, in his late 30s, about 6ft tall and of slim build with an oval face.

He wore a blue hooded top with the hood up and pulled around his face and was said to look 'unkempt'.

Neighbourhood Sergeant Steve Ives said: "The people who turned these men away did exactly the right thing. A genuine Police officer will always show you their identification and give you time to check it carefully".

"Door-to-door enquiries are carried out by Police officers and PCSOs in full uniform, and we won't ask to see where you keep your valuables.

"If you have any unexpected callers, always put the chain on and if you're not sure, don't open the door and call us immediately on 999".

PS Ives asked anyone with any information which could help Police enquiries into these incidents to call **101** to speak to DC Clare Chipping of South Gloucestershire CID, quoting reference number 18516/14. Alternatively call the independent charity Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111: they never ask your name or trace your call. Anyone who is suspicious of a caller to their home, or that of a vulnerable neighbour, should call the Police straight away.

If you have information about any crime, phone the police on 101 or you can call anonymously to the independent charity CRIMESTOPPERS 0800 555 111.



These days, inspectors give only a couple of days' notice, so inspections provide a much truer picture of the quality of the school's standards.





April's Letter from the Vicar 2014

Easter

'God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all'.

St Paul writing to the Asian churches. (Ephesians 1).

Dear all,

As Easter approaches, we are reminded annually of the great event which puts everything else into perspective. The death and resurrection of Christ.

Why does the worship of Christ at Easter matter now, two thousand or so years on, have we not learnt its lesson? Many people as we know, would say 'yes' to that question and wish to forget all about it. However, in the last century we saw the consequence of a weakened religious culture both in Russia and Germany. Not only in the rampant atheism of the Communist system of the Soviet Republic which led to the Gulag camps, but also the Nazi ideology and the Holocaust. When people tell me that religion has caused all the wars in history, I remind them of Stalin and Hitler.

Believing in God matters. It matters very much. As Karl Rahner (1904-84) the German Theologian put it: 'The best reason to believe in God is to avoid believing in lesser gods.' Many of us are tempted to make gods of our children, our status, our personal wealth, our national independence, our personal health, our political creed or whatever. Whilst it is very good to care about and serve those ends, there is something that is unbalanced about making tin pot gods of them. The reality of Christ on the Cross and his subsequent resurrection, over rides them all, it both encompasses and challenges them. It puts them in their right balance with each other and with our own personal and social life.

St. Paul reminds us that Christ through his death and resurrection, is above all things. He is therefore to be worshipped by Christians, above all else. This puts God at the heart of our life. A struggle for us all, it may be, but one with which Scripture teaches us to engage. And one to which Muslims, Hindus, Buddhists and other faith groups would expect and encourage us to be committed.

He has been working with the Wotton Cinema as film booker and marketing consultant throughout 2013/14. Sam has been Operations Manager at the Curzon, and more recently Front of House Manager at the Watershed in Bristol.

Gareth said, "After years of working with independent cinemas and arts venues, I've seen how important they are for their local audiences. We don't want to move away from the cinema's community roots – we want to extend them, to offer more opportunities to see a wider range of films. We've been recruiting a new front of house team and are delighted that many of the existing volunteers will be staying with us in supportive roles."

The cinema is now showing early evening screenings and will be running family matinees daily throughout the school holidays. The range of drinks available has been extended, with the addition of Fairtrade coffee, tea and hot chocolate.

The Wotton Cinema will now move up a gear. The new team will introduce means to expand the audience by showing new films closer to release dates and providing the opportunity to see films at different times and over 7 days a week. There will continue to be a wide selection of films available to attract an even larger audience.


