Your Newts Need You!

South Gloucestershire Council is looking for volunteers to help with pond surveys during spring/summer 2015, to monitor the great crested newt populations on Hawkesbury & Inglestone Commons. No experience is needed, as full training will be provided by experts from Avon Wildlife Trust.

Throughout Europe, great crested newts are very rare, but we are lucky enough to have all three native species of newt in the ponds on Hawkesbury & Inglestone Commons. It is important to monitor our newt populations to enable the habitat management on the Commons to be evaluated. Newt surveys are undertaken after

sunset and then early the next morning. Six surveys are undertaken on each pond during spring and early summer. The surveys are great fun, and volunteers will have the opportunity to train for a great crested newt survey licence. If you would like to take part in the

surveys, please join us at our training session, led by Avon Wildlife Trust, on newt identification and survey techniques.







There is a new vegetable on the block. It is called Brukale. It is a cross between sprouts and kale. I recommend that you try it. It is delicious.

A few aides memoires for April

Potatoes

Early and maincrop potatoes can now be planted but the late frost must always be anticipated, and protection such as fleece kept handy. One of the greatest enemies of the crop apart from blight, is the keel slug which can be difficult to contain as it lives underground. A few slug pellets put into the row at planting time may help to discourage this pest.

Salad crops

If a frame or greenhouse is available, salad crops can be planted out indoors but care must be taken with cucumbers as these are very vulnerable to a cold spell and are best left until the end of this month. Peppers aubergines and chillies should also be safe now as long as long as the possibility of frosts is kept in mind.

Root crops

All seeds planted directly into the

ground will be safe enough now. Parsnips will benefit from being pre-chitted before planting, as they are notoriously unreliable in germinating. This is done by laying a sheet of wet kitchen roll in the bottom of a plastic box, scattering seed on top of this and covering with another layer of wet kitchen roll. The box lid is replaced and the box is moved to a warm spot such as the airing cupboard. It needs checking on a regular basis after about a week and when the tiny roots appear on the seeds they can be planted out every 2 inches in a shallow row and thinned later to about 4 inches. The process reduces the need to plant seed out ,some of which will not germinate.

Bedding plants

The garden centres really love April for trade, as they are stocked with a colourful array of all kinds of plants, and the customers roll in. They love

it even more when they can sell the same stuff twice, because the first lot has been frosted off due to being planted out before the cold weather has definitely finished, Mid -May is quite early enough for tender plants to be planted out after hardening off.

Tips for this month;

If seedlings have been in a pot of compost for a month or longer, bear in mind that the nutrients in the compost, only last 4-6 weeks and a general purpose feed will be useful.

When potting on tomatoes from 4 inch pot to large pot or grow-bag, wait until the first flower shows. This will become the first tomato and if this is at a fairly low point on the plant stem, it saves having a great length of empty stem on the eventual plant.

Donald Watts

1936 - 2015

Don was a founder member of Hawkesbury Local History Society when it was formed in 1998, bringing a wealth of local knowledge from his early years at Church Farm, until latterly at Didmarton. He had an intimate knowledge of the landscape and woodlands of the parish and had an the uncanny ability to find pre-historic and Roman sites such as the Badminton villa settlement and its elaborate mosaic floor.

Years of field-walking and a keen eye led to wide-ranging discoveries of flint tools, pottery and various artefacts that added to his large collection of historical books and other material. Always ready with a fund of anecdotes and reminiscences, Don was an invaluable contributor to the publication of Hawkesbury Chronicles in 2008, and will be sadly missed both as an enthusiastic supporter of the local history society and as a good friend.



Donald Watts

It was with much sadness that we learnt of the death of our dear friend Donald Watts.

Donald Watts, whom everyone in Hawkesbury must have known, was a staunch supporter of St Mary's Church and worked tirelessly to help its upkeep.

Don was born in an upper room of Church Farm House opposite St Mary's and his childhood inscription of his name can still be seen inside the door to the Malthouse.

Don was a long-time Sidesman and Churchwarden and was always present at any church function, ready and willing to help with preparations and clearing down.

He worked tirelessly in the churchyard and in helping to maintain and clip the box yews each autumn. As Forrester to the Badminton estate he had an encyclopaedic knowledge of the countryside and the surrounding villages and developed a great interest in the local history, contributing considerably to the Chronicles, published a few years ago. It was his eagle eyes that spotted fragments of mosaic in a ploughed field which led to his discovery of the Badminton Roman villa.

The whole valley of Hawkesbury was in his heart and soul. His cheeky smile and irrepressible humour will be greatly missed by all who knew him.



Archaeology with Don was FUN. If he said there was a Roman Villa there, we'd find a Roman Villa there!

Those bright eagle eyes could spot a piece of flint yards away and, whilst the rest of us were debating the questionable origin of a handful of pieces of 'grit', he'd be filling his pockets with genuine worked prehistoric arrowheads.

Never one to doubt his convictions, it was with such pride and pleasure that the few strange coloured lumps he was finding in the plough soil at Badminton turned out to be pieces of painted wall plaster from the underlying Roman villa. We were with him on that memorable day in August 2003 when, by beginner's luck, we just happened to position our first trial trench straight on top of mosaic paving. It was hot that day and dear old Rose found the cool surface of tesserae in a shady hole the ideal spot for her Siesta. Don's convictions were well founded, as we went on carefully, day after day, to uncover the large, quirky, geometric 'Badminton Mosaic'. What a treat for him to be able to tell the Duke "I told you so"!

Favourite amongst Don's excavating tools was his father's trenching tool, an ideal size and shape, especially for loosening the sticky clay soils covering the Lower Woods villa; it seemed such an appropriate use for this remnant of First World War History.

In later years it was Sadie who accompanied Don to 'digs'. Her special trick was to nudge lumps of soil, with her nose, back into the trench they'd just come from, and "Sadie, no!" would be a constant cry when his digging was interrupted to stop her eating stones.


No archaeological dig would be complete without food and whereas most of us brought a picnic, Don would retire home, but always, without exception, he would return after lunch bearing ice creams or cakes and, of course, the inevitable very large bottle of cider! Yes, he'd used his lunch break to treat the crew.

Archaeology isn't always about excavation, and it was thanks to Don's good relationships with local landowners, that we got permission to carry out geophysical surveys in fields far off the beaten track. He joined us and was a dab hand at laying out and winding up the survey tapes, no simple task in gusty winds.

During our days 'on site' or in the field, male members of the group were often captivated by tales of his youthful escapades, leaving the recipients in stitches.

Yes, young Donald Watts was a rascal, but without his nose for history of 'the old days' Hawkesbury and district would never have been able to contribute as much to the rich archaeological history of the Southern Cotswolds as it has done. We owe him a lot and are proud to have had him as a dear friend.

Last Post, Park Street

Jan and I moved into our new house on the corner of Park Street and Back Street in September 2004. The construction of the house on this former vegetable plot had been the subject of much debate and controversy between builder, Ian Jones, and local planning authorities.

However, we were now in possession and we had to meet the planning and conservation officers' strict instructions to rebuild the stone wall, and plant specific hedges and shrubs. The reasons for these directives were:

- 1) To protect the character and appearance of the area.
- 2) To ensure a satisfactory standard of external appearance.

We dutifully carried out those instructions and over the next year or two were satisfied with the end product.

Moving on to the present day, Jan and I were aware of plans to improve

the BT broadband service, and ground works had begun. However, returning from a long walk on Monday 22nd February I was horrified to find a large green metal box had been installed close to the dry stone wall fronting Back Street. (BT call it a cabinet - I call it a box!).

This cannot be possible in a conservation area can it? By the way, we had no advance warning of these works!

After an initial telephone call to Councillor Sue Hope, who I believe, shares our bewilderment of the situation, there has been much discussion between ourselves, Sue and the planning/conservation officers.

Traditionally, planning offices require 56 days notice of any works, and in conservation areas can insist upon the relocation of inappropriate development or indeed require it to be placed underground.

However, the 'powers that be', presumably the Department of the Environment, decided in 2013 that BT should have complete freedom to place these green boxes wherever they want, without reference to anyone!

The conservation people would appear to agree with our concerns but of course their hands are now tied!

During my professional life I had many dealings with planning authorities and I reflect upon the fact that they could be pretty ruthless with defenceless individuals but largely impotent when dealing with large corporate organisations! It seems that some things don't change.

Jan and I are aware of the need for improved broadband service within the village. It's just a shame that we feel let down by those who should protect us!







"The Architecture, Sculpture and Symbolism of a Victorian Garden Cemetery"



A wedding venue, a nature reserve, a landscape full of history and architecture, a learning environment for schools, a venue for musical and theatrical events, a location for photographers and film makers: just some of the reasons which attract so many visitors to Arnos Vale Cemetery in Bristol.

Opened in 1839 on the outskirts of the picturesque village of Brislington, 'Arnos Vale' was intended to be a cemetery filled with sunlight, fresh air, trees and shrubs with architecture and landscaping echoing that of classical Greece. Today this oasis of green space and peace is the only known example of a fully restored Victorian Garden Cemetery. It is home to a unique collection of listed buildings and monuments of national significance.

Alan Bambury will tell us more about the collection: the architecture of its buildings, the monumental inscriptions that depict the lives of the people they commemorate, and the sculptured images which are symbolic or have a particular personal meaning. Come and find out why Arnos Vale is such a special place.

Letter from the Vicar - April 2015

Dear all.

We are told that ten per cent of all children in school today are Muslim. If we want this country to keep its Christian heritage, we need to be more active.

Most Muslims take the discipline of their religion seriously and bring their children up with a good understanding of the faith. On the whole this helps to build a life-long respect and love for Islam. What worries me is that Christians have taken the church for granted for so long, and are so relaxed about instilling their religion, that the future looks pretty bleak for the church.

All of us bear a responsibility for this. We all know it can be boring for children to sit in a pew for 45 minutes but it teaches a child that both parents and grandparents take their religion seriously. It also reinforces the religious teaching and ethos learnt at school!

Also in the home —a child can be taught to pray. Prayers said before a family meal and at bedtime are simple things to do and very effective. Our grandparents would have sat around the fire hearing the Bible read.



Chinese Sky Lanterns



The Parish Council have been approached by the Avon Fire Authority to seek support for a campaign to discourage members of the public from using Chinese style sky lanterns in our area.

Extracts from the correspondence

Avon Fire Authority share the view of the Chief Fire Officers Association which does not support the use of sky lanterns due to the risks they pose. The floating lanterns contain a naked flame which represents a significant fire risk to life and property when they come down to earth.

In 2013 CCTV footage proved a sky lantern to be the cause of a fire at a recycling plant in the West Midlands. More than 200 fire-fighters and 39 fire engines were deployed over several days to tackle the fire involving plastics and paper.

In addition to the fire risk, lanterns are also a cause of concern to farmers who have previously called for them to be banned following cases of livestock being injured or killed from eating the metal parts accidentally chopped into animal feed during harvest, or getting caught in wire frames that have landed in fields. Lanterns have also been mistaken for distress flares at sea, placing a demand on the resources of HM Coastguard.

They are hopeful that the Parish Council would set an example by prohibiting the use of sky lanterns at any of our sites or green spaces. They have also asked that through our licensing powers we refuse approval for events where there is a planned release of sky lanterns.

Brampton Willows designed and made the original ones back in 2006 but after nine years of pounding by the horses, the Event director, Hugh Thomas, thought it was time to replace them with new ones. The 'Waves' are designed as mobile obstacles which can be moved around and used for many years. The willow has been woven around an integral steel armature for structural strength as the obstacles have to be able to withstand the impact of half a ton of horse landing on them.

The waves move on impact, only to spring back immediately afterwards. Although very solid, they have quite a bit of 'give' in them which is a good thing for both horses and riders!
