The Parish News team met together, at the end of February, to discuss the magazine contents, finances and donation requests.

We looked at the income from the adverts in the Parish News, income from annual subscriptions and from sales in the Village Shop and Post Office. We then set that against the cost of printing 400 copies each month and the annual cost of printing the Hawkesbury Christmas card, which comes with your January edition. The Parish News have also given a number of sizeable donations to village groups, over the past few years such as Pre-school, HU5K fun run, the Youth Club, HULit fest as well as sponsoring Lee's Lights and the Hawkesbury Show schedule.

After some calculations, projections and perusal of bank statements, we find that if our generosity continues in that vein, we might actually run out of funds for our own purposes!

So, readers, we have considered a number of options and have decided on the following actions:-

• <u>Price of the Parish News</u>: The cost of each issue will remain at 40p for the rest of the year, but this will increase to 50p from January 2017. If you pay for the whole year in advance, by

subscription in January, the cost for the year will be £5.50 (a saving of 50p)

 <u>Donations</u> to village groups and organisations: It has given the Parish News team, a great deal of satisfaction to be able give donations to help village organisations put on a variety of events, and to purchase new equipment. Unfortunately we will have to limit our donations this year to the following groups, to which money has already been pledged –

- *H U Lit Fest*, towards printing of their programme

- Youth Club, towards renovating the Youth Club room, upstairs in the Village Hall

- <u>Adverts</u>: According to a number of our advertisers, the cost of placing a regular advert in the Hawkesbury Parish News is extremely cheap compared to some other local Parish/Village magazines, such as Didmarton's Diddi Digest and the Wickwar Parish News. The cost of adverts will be increased as follows:
 - small advert (4cm x 6cm) will be £36 per year

- medium advert (4cm x 9cm) will be £48 per year
- large advert (8cm x 6cm) will be £72 per year

If you are a current advertiser, these changes will only start when you renew your advert (A reminder will be sent to you with the new pricing, a month or so before you need to renew.)

New advertisers will be informed of the new pricing when they apply to have an advert in the Parish News – this will come into effect from July 2016

Please remember that everyone who regularly advertises in the Parish News should pay the appropriate fee. The only free adverts, are those that advertise a particular one-off event or a fund raiser for a group or individual in the Parish, or those that give useful information.

It's always hard to put prices up but all the profits from The Parish News do get recycled back into the village. These changes are just to ensure that we secure our income for the future, so we can continue to support village events and activities.

We are happy to hear from any of our readers about the changes described above.

After days of being sent from department to department within BT (*Residential*, *Business, Openreach, Broadband*, *Repairs, Complaints*, etc.) none of which would actually resolve the problem, we are managing to run the PO system via a residential line. It is not ideal and service is slow and, at times, intermittent, but we are at least operational.

Our local MP Luke Hall has been involved and has been staggered by the utter lack of anyone to take responsibility within BT. At time of going to press, the problems are still unresolved.

Apologies for any inconvenience and your support. Hopefully, this will be resolved very soon. **Dick Blundell**

Welcome to the April issue of Hawkesbury Parish News.

It is an extraordinary tale of determination, camaraderie and the will to survive. These days, they would probably be picked up in a fraction of the time and would be sending "selfies" from the dinghy!

A few gardening thoughts for April

Vegetable garden.

This month is the time for starting off growth in earnest but always remember that late frosts are not unknown so keep some horticultural fleece handy so that tender plants can be looked after. Most root crops can be safely planted and more successful germination can be achieved if the planting area is warmed up prior to planting. This can be achieved by laying polythene, (any type) over the area for a couple of weeks prior to planting. It's a worthwhile exercise to add a few radish seeds to your root crops as they germinate very quickly, will show where the row is and allow you to keep the row clean and weed free. If they

are picked as they grow they will also provide an extra crop.



Most brassicas are safe now and those which require a long period of growth such as sprouts and

sprouting broccoli should be started. Potatoes can be planted in earnest now but remember that maincrop need more distance between the sets than earlies, about 12 inches for the earlies and 18-24 for maincrop. If you haven' grown potatoes before remember they only need 6 inches of soil above the seed potato as long as they are banked up as the plants grow.

Flower garden

A foliar feed will benefit roses now and if a tonic such as Sulphur rose can be located it will help in warding off mildew and black spot which is lurking about after such a mild winter. A handful of general fertilizer sprinkled around the roots of the plant will set it up for the season.

Snowdrops and hostas can be split and re-planted so that the show can be spread and the originals given "breathing space"

Biennials, dahlia tubers, sweet peas, and penstemons can be planted now but don't be tempted to buy summer bedding plants yet as there is plenty of time for frosts which will kill them.

How about introducing children to gardening

I remember our grandson asking his mum why the carrots she grew tasted better than the ones he had at school, and this encouraged him to grow a row for a few years afterwards to try and better his mum's efforts.

I think it's a good idea to show kids that

peas don't grow in a freezer bag, and to get some idea of the basic principles of producing food. Choose something that will produce fairly quick results like radishes or salad leaves in a tub and you never know, if they grow it they might eat it. There are other ways kids might get a bit of interest in the garden and here are a couple.

- Get them to paint a plant pot with any kind of design then fill it with some attractive plants and place the pot in a prominent spot in the garden so that they can always see their contribution.
- Cut out their initial from, say a cereal box, and peg it down on the lawn, and within a week the grass should have turned yellow and the initial will stand out. Then explain that Chlorophyll makes the grass green and it needs light which you cut off with the cardboard letter. If you remove the card the light returns as does the green.

You never know ,if you spark the interest in the garden in early years you might get someone to lend a hand to you when you're in your dotage **Brian Noble**

A good pair of gardening gloves goes some way to achieve success in the tragedy or triumph repotting stakes.

March is proving to be a busy month of actions towards saving our shop as we spread the message across the Parish and seek pledges for money. This is what is happening:

- We have met the Parish Council who are supporting the campaign both as a Council and as individuals from the Parish. We have asked the PC for additional short term funding to pay for a structural survey on the shop and for legal fees.
- We have submitted our application to the Financial Conduct Authority to be registered as a Community **Benefit Society - Hawkesbury** Community Shop Limited.
- Our Parish Survey is being issued to every household in the Parish. This will ask what people are looking for in our shop and how much money they are prepared to pledge to the campaign.
- Discussions with the owner continue. He is arranging a

valuation of the property in preparation for negotiations on purchase.

It is worth reflecting on the reasons we are running this campaign:

- the convenience of having a shop just a few hundred yards from where we live
- the investment is not just to ensure these benefits for 6 weeks or 6 months but to secure the shop in perpetuity
- the shop provides amenities for people who are not fortunate enough to be able to travel to **Tesco or Waitrose**
- the shop adds value to property prices.

The Working Group have got us this far, now we need your support in two ways:

- Please complete the Parish wide Shop Survey, this will be distributed door to door but is also available online on our Facebook Page - Search "Save Our Shop"
 - ► This will provide valuable information to build the business plan

- The last page of the survey has a pledge form, we need to understand the level of financial support within the Parish to purchase the shop, put stock on the shelves, update and modify the building and to provide working capital for the business.
 - We are hoping to raise ► between £300,000 and £400,000.
 - Pledges can be for as little as £50 and it is a pledge of support, not binding.
 - There are more details on the pledge form and full details will be circulated in the future with the offer letter

Another plea for owners to pick up their dog's poo - PLEASE!!!

Now we know that most dog owners are thoughtful and responsible people – so this message is to the irresponsible and lazy few.

Dog poo is not pleasant to look at, on the pavements and grass verges in our lovely village.

It's horrible when you step in a squelchy pile and have to scrape it off your shoe, and even worse, when it gets inadvertently walked into your house, all over the floor – and you have to clean those stinking footprints!

But think how really disgusting it must be to fall into a pile of dog poo, and have it narrowly miss your eyes and mouth!! This happened to a little boy, who was running home from our Primary School. He was with his Mum, (Mum requested that she and her son should not be named) and ran along a grass verge on the way home, tripped and fell onto the grass. A safe and soft landing, EXCEPT FOR THE PILE OF POO THAT HE FELL INTO. His Mum was able to quickly wipe the mess away but it was smelly and unpleasant, not to mention a real health risk to the child from Toxocariasis*, an infection caused by a parasitic roundworm. In dogs that have not been regularly wormed, the parasite releases eggs into the dog's gut, and these are passed out with the poo. If eggs gets into a human's digestive system, via the mouth, the eggs will hatch into microscopic larvae, which can migrate through body tissues and end up affecting the optic nerve behind the eye. In rare cases, this can lead to blindness in one eye.

Come on, Hawkesbury dog owners!! You can do better than this. Make sure that you ALWAYS leave home with doggy poo bags and USE THEM. It may be yukky to pick up poo, but it's a small price to pay for the cleanliness and safety of our village. As the little boy's Mum said to me - If the owners don't want to clean up after their dog, then maybe they should rethink whether they have a dog at all!

*Not to be confused with toxoplasmosis, which can be caught from cat faeces, cat litter trays and lambing ewes – and may lead to miscarriage and stillbirth if caught by a pregnant woman – although this is very rare in Britain.

Hawkesbury and Inglestone Commons Officer

After a wet and warm winter, Spring is here. Cattle will be turned out on to the commons once spring grass has started to grow. This is typically from mid-April, but in years when grass growth is slow it can be much later. Watch out for the cattle as they move about the common and as ever, remember to keep gates shut. Cattle will soon find their way around the commons and could be on the move at night as well as during the day, so please keep your eyes peeled and drive carefully.

Grazing rights are linked to a property rather than an individual and reflect the historic use of the common. Over time we have become a less agricultural society and most people no longer exercise their rights to graze. However, the commons were so widely used in the past that in 1899 an Act of Parliament provided authority for the then Rural District Council of Chipping Sodbury to manage "for the protection and improvement of the commons" to help regulate and manage them and this is where our current Byelaws came from.





South Gloucestershire Council's Report

The Council has agreed to an increase of 3.99% to the Council Tax; this includes 2% to help cover the increasing pressure of social care costs. The Council also agreed to a £6 reduction in the Green Bin Tax; this against the background of reduced spending on Youth Services and the imminent closure of Libraries and the ceasing of the Mobile Library.

As part of the Council's Cost Cutting, the Conservative administration has also cut the Area Forums where local community grants were allocated. At the time of writing there is no local engagement and no plans for the continuation of community grants. In the past Hawkesbury groups have benefitted greatly from community grants and New

Homes Bonus monies.

The number of committees has also been cut - Development Control Committees (Planning) and Licensing Committees will remain, as will the Health Scrutiny Committee; there will be an **Environment & Community** Committee and a Children, Adults & Health Committee as well as a Policy & Resources and Resources Committee. The Council has agreed to a Boundary Review Commission to review the number of councillors on South Gloucestershire Council. Currently there are 70 councillors representing the South Gloucestershire Area, this number is likely to be reduced. In the recent budget there was an

greater devolution for the West of England with a metro mayor being elected. This will include greater government investment in the area for economic growth and more development.





A Monumental Error

"But that looks like Italy!" "Definitely Italian." "No, that doesn't say English village at all."

Such was the feedback when I showed foreign friends the proposed cover for All Part of the Charm. This new book brings together all my Parish News columns with my essays about village life.

My friends' reaction astonished me. Like most people who live here, I'm used to the Monument serving as shorthand for Hawkesbury Upton. Its portrait is everywhere, including the cover of the Parish News. The only challenge is to find an original way to illustrate it. I was using a watercolour painted by my dad.

Then I remembered some basic facts about the Monument's 170-year history. Its architect was Lewis Vulliamy, who also designed Westonbirt House, now a private school. The Monument echoes the style of the splendid mid-Victorian House. Italian Renaissance was all the rage in those days. Classic Cotswold country cottage it ain't.

With reluctance I rejected the Monument picture. The new cover design features a more typical Cotswold scene: sheep in rolling fields (also painted by my dad). I just hope nobody thinks the sheep look French.

If you think the words *fun* and *run* don't belong in the same sentence think again!

Reignite those lapsed resolutions and put this year's HU5K Run on **18th June 2016** in your diary. If you think 5K seems 4.9K too far for your current level of fitness? Don't worry, if you start training now, by race day, you'll run it easily!

The secret of training for any long-distance run is to build up little by little. No-one starts out naturally able to run a marathon or even a 5K. Even Mo Farrah had to start training before he could do it!

Here's a quick and easy method in which you alternate running with walking, building up slowly as your fitness grows. Run just 3 times each week, which allows your body to rest on other days. Then gradually increase your running time/reduce your walking time, until you're just running all the time. There's no hard and fast rule, just go with what feels right for your body, e.g.

Week 1: run 1 minute, walk 3 minutes – 4 times (16 minutes) Week 2: run 1 minute, walk 2 minutes – 6 times (18 minutes) Week 3: run 1 minute, walk 1 minutes – 10 times (20 minutes) Week 4: run 2 minutes, walk 1 minutes – 8 times (24 minutes) and so on...


If you would like a programme to follow then visit <u>www.nhs.uk/livewell/c25k/pages/couch-to-5K.aspx</u> where you will find a 9 week training plan for complete beginners, along with podcasts that you can download to give you your own personal trainer in your ear and to provide music to train to.

Once you can manage to run for 40 minutes, you'll do the 5k easily. Then you might like to focus on running faster to get a better time. But no pressure – walkers will be welcome too!

Don't be tempted to run too far, too fast, too soon – you'll only end up injured and setting yourself back. If you're too breathless to talk, you're going too fast. Slow down and walk for a bit till you feel ready to run again. The walking is good for you too, as it gets you used to being on your feet over the distance, so there's no shame in walking if you have to.

NB This is NOT medical advice! If you haven't exercised for a while or have any doubts at all about your physical fitness, consult your doctor before starting to train.

Letter from the Vicar - April 2016

Dear Friends,

I very much hope you had a good Easter and are still feeling the spirit of Easter and have some chocolate left over! This month, I would like to tell you about our church in Didmarton. St Lawrence's church had been redundant but was restored about 30 years ago.

The interior of Didmarton church is a fantastic example of the appearance and inside of an 18th century country church: a small sanctuary, box pews and the 'three-decker' pulpit, with minister's pew, clerk's desk and oak pulpit.

There were two galleries and a row of hat pegs which can still be seen high up on the wall. The galleries would have been used by those who could not afford to rent the box pews, and for the musicians.

The font is of three periods; the circular stem is Norman work of the 12th century, the octagonal bowl dates from the 14th century, and the wooden cover was added in the 18th century.

During the repairs in 1982 the original Commandments tablet were found and returned to the present position behind the altar. In the south wall, to the right of the altar, is a 13th century piscina or drain at which the priest would have washed the communion vessels during Mass (and sometimes still does).

The painted box pews were previously matched by similar pews on the north side and in the north transept. The wooden staircase in the north transept gives access to the clock and to the bell turret.

On the walls and floor of the church are numerous memorials to the Codringtons and other local families.

It is a very interesting and unusual church and very much loved by its parishioners. Services are two a month: Matins on the 1st Sunday at 1115 and Holy Communion on the third Sunday at 8.30am.

It is a fabulous reminder of what country churches looked like 300 years ago. And you are always made very welcome at this little church.

Korean Christianity and British missionaries

Over the next few months, I would like to write a series of articles about Korean Christianity.

The Korean Protestant Church has a short history compared with other religions in Korea, about 1,550 years less

than Confucianism, about 1,500 years less than Buddhism and about 230 years less than Roman Catholicism. However, the Korean Protestant Church has grown rapidly over its short history and greatly influenced Korea.

Korean Christians own British Christians in time because although the Roman Catholic faith was first introduced into Korea through China in the 17th century, Protestantism was first introduced by the British missionary, Rev. Robert Thomas, who was executed by the army as soon as he arrived on the shores of the Taedong River in North Korea in September, 1865. From the time that the seed of the Gospel was planted in Korea by the Martyrs' blood, the Korean Protestant church started to grow. There were 25 Protestant Christians in 1886, 230,000 Protestants 36 years later in 1922, and nearly 10,000,000 Protestants 109 years later in 1995. This is the greatest movement of the Holy Spirit since Pentecost.

In particular, the Korean Church grew considerably from 1980-1990. During these times, some of the largest churches in the world appeared such as the Yoido Full Gospel Church (706,000 members), Yongnak Presbyterian Church (60,000 members), and Kwanglim Methodist Church (73,000 members). In the capital city of Seoul alone, with eleven million people, there are more than 6,533 churches.

According to the 1992 Christian Almanac, there were over 12.2 million Protestant Christians, 36,832 churches, and 67,008 pastors and evangelists in South Korea. There are more Christians among the middle class in urban cities than among the country people in rural areas. In the cities almost one third of the population claims to be Christian.

Not only is the Korean Protestant church keen on home mission, but it is also very keen on world mission. So the Korean Church has sent many missionaries around the world. Very recently the president of KWMA (The Korea World Missions Association) said that the Korean Church would send 100,000 missionaries by 2030. Today the Korean Church has become the second biggest country for sending out missionaries after the American church. This has been a most glorious time in Korean Christian history.

For such blessing, we, Korean Christians, never forget three British missionaries; Robert Jermain Thomas (1839-1865), John Ross (1842-1915) and Horace Grant Underwood (July 19, 1859 - October 12, 1916). I will write their story over the next few months. Rev. Jongsin Lee, Methodist minister

Citizens Advice clears up pension jargon baffling consumers

"Flexi-access drawdown", "open market option" and "safeguarded benefits" are some of the pension terms most confusing for consumers, reveals Wiltshire Citizens Advice

The local charity, which delivers face to face Pension Wise appointments in Wiltshire, South Gloucestershire, Bristol and Bath says people would find it easier to understand their pensions if the industry used simple, standard language to describe their products.

Some people are also unclear about terms which appear to be more straightforward, putting them at risk of missing out on the best pension options for them. For example; staff have reported cases where consumers wrongly believed that their 'selected retirement date' was set in stone as the date they could access their pension, when in fact they could have accessed their savings ahead of this date.

To help people get to grips with their pension, Pension Wise guiders have identified the pensions jargon which people find most perplexing and have explained them in simple terms.

Recent research from national Citizens Advice shows more than a quarter of people with defined contribution pensions feel that they don't understand their pension plan, while fewer than one in five feel very confident.

Albert Ball, Pension Wise Project Manager said: "Pension decisions can be hard enough without having to translate tricky wording. Many people coming to visit us are mystified by the jargon being used and our staff are here to help clear up the confusing language. Having a better understanding of what the terms mean puts consumers on a better path to choosing a retirement option which suits them."


