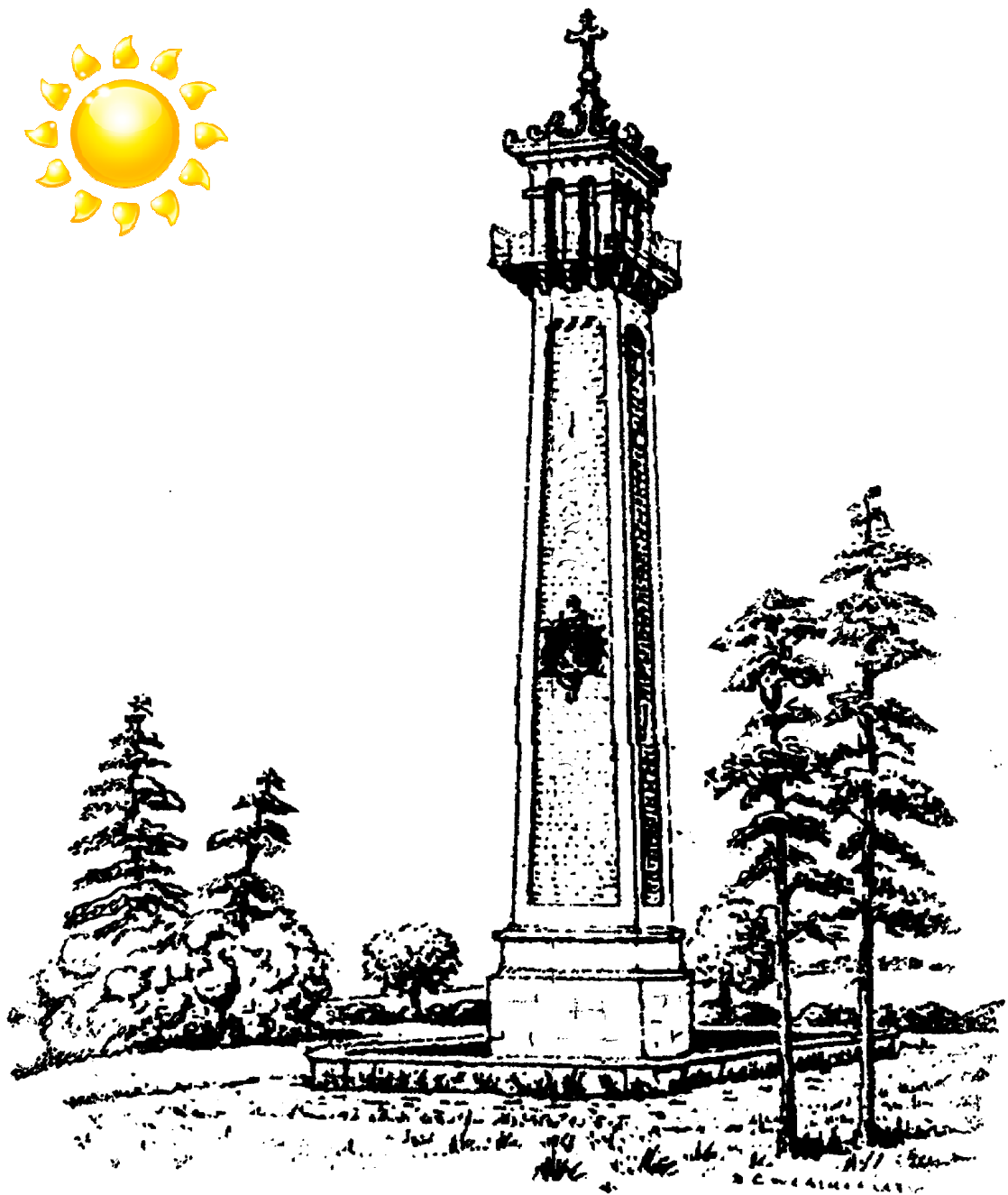
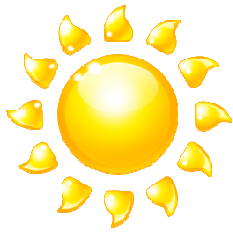

Fiona writes:

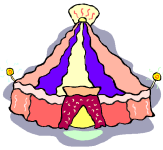
Welcome to the August issue of Hawkesbury Parish News!

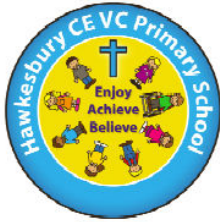

TROWEL & ERROR

Meetings are held at 8pm on the 4th Monday of the month in the Methodist Hall in Back Street.

Our speaker for June was **Mr. Perkins** who gave a talk on 'Towards Greener Gardening'.

Here are a few steps you can take to make your garden greener:-

Use pesticides and herbicides sparingly and only as a last resort. Hoe the weeds instead, but only on dry days because doing it on wet days is called transplanting.

Make a pond which will create a haven for frogs, toads, newts, dragonflies, blanket weed, herons, etc.

Get a rainwater butt and direct the downpipe into it because it works better that way. Also a lot of water goes straight down the plughole so use your bath water to water the plants by running the bath waste pipe to the above rainwater butt. Water spillage from bad connections will save you the trouble of filling a bucket to wash the floors of the house.

Start a compost heap and put your kitchen waste to good use.

Encourage animals and insects by creating a variety of places for them to live – like ponds and compost heaps.

Buy decking, planters and garden ornaments made out of reclaimed timber. Then after a very few years you can donate them to me for firewood. Thanks in anticipation.

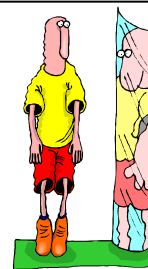

Skate Park Huge Hit with Villagers

A recent survey shows the skate park is a huge hit with parents and young people. We had a great response with 62 villagers responding to our survey (27 parents and 35 young people) and the results are overwhelmingly positive, highlighting what a fantastic resource this is for our village. A resounding 97% of villagers who completed the survey think the skate park is a good thing for children and young people in the village.

"A huge asset to the village"

"Good for villagers' morale to have achieved something so amazing in such a short space of time, makes kids proud of Hawkesbury"

Almost 80% of users who completed the survey live in Hawkesbury. The majority of children using the skate park are boys (73%) - come on girls get your skates on! It is being used very frequently with over half of the young people using it a few times a week or more and 36% visiting once a week or less.

We asked people what they thought was good about the skate park and received 60 positive responses. These are just a few of the many quotes from parents and reflect some of the main themes:

"Really fantastic facility, encourages activity, useful meeting place"

"Allows children, especially older ones, an area of their own in the community. It encourages them to be outdoors. It offers them the really important opportunity to explore their physical limits and take risks in a controlled environment."

"It seems to cater to all skills and ages. It gives the children of the village somewhere safe to go."

The children also had lots of great things to say about the skate park.

"People can go there instead of skating around sandpits lane where they could get hit by a car".

"Everybody can join in whatever experience"

"Good way to socialise"

"It is somewhere my Mum is happy for me to go with my friends."

We also asked parents and young people to let us know if there were things that could be improved. The main issues highlighted were:

- Need more seating for parents
- Children not always wearing helmets.
- Older children using bad language and throwing their weight around with the younger ones.
- It can get very busy.

Improvements suggested by children and parents included, making it bigger, one young skater wanted free sweets (!) others mentioned recycling bins, street art and an access path. Some parents suggested more adult supervision.

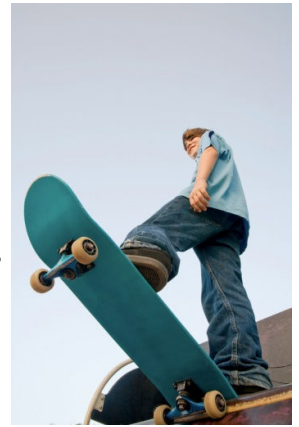
The play committee will look at all of these issues and consider ways to address them. In the meantime here are a few suggestions.

- Parents - if you have older children (11 and over) who regularly use the skate park, please can you ask them to consider the younger ones who also use it.
- Please encourage your children to wear their helmets at all times.
- Remember this is an unsupervised facility. Our survey showed that only 40% of parents of children aged 5-10 said they always supervised their children. If you have younger children who use the skate park please supervise them if you have concerns.

The children and young people obviously love the skate park and are really looking after it. They even have a yard broom next to the park which they regularly use to brush off any mud (which they also highlighted as an issue).

Thanks to everyone who gave us their views - we are delighted it is being so well used and is such a big hit. In the words of one youngster *"Yeahhhh man its sickkkk wooo"*. This is apparently good!

Hawkesbury Volunteer Transport Group



HVT is a community car scheme, which has been operating for the past 6 years by volunteers in the Hawkesbury community, taking passengers to any medical related appointment. HVT is supported by South Gloucestershire Council.

The scheme is available to all Hawkesbury Parish residents, regardless of age. You never know when you might need transport because of an injury, illness or treatment that is going to either stop you driving, or limit your ability to drive. Should that happen then HVT is available, and a booking can be made by contacting one of the Co-ordinators on **0797 206 5665**.

HVT is not a taxi service or an ambulance service, and therefore it is necessary to give as much notice as possible, at least 3 days, so that a driver can be found.

If you possess a Diamond Travel Card, get it registered with HVT. By doing so the first 25 miles of any trip, are covered by an SGC scheme. Additional mileage costs 40 pence per mile, and all parking charges are the passenger's responsibility.

This month, July, HVT had to, for the first time, tell a passenger that no driver was available, and that the passenger must make alternative arrangements.

The only way to ensure that HVT can continue with a high standard of service, is to have more drivers.

Perhaps you could consider giving a little of your time, for the benefit of the community and become a volunteer driver.

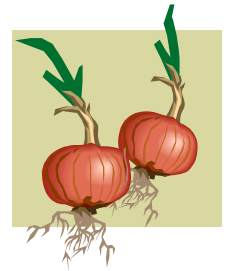

A rough time-table for the build-up to Hawkesbury Show

It is hoped that the following notes might be of some help to new exhibitors at the show.

Four weeks before show day

If onions are to be entered, select the best and, after lifting, pull off any loose skin and wipe down with a damp cloth. The onions (or shallots) need to be dried off and this can be helped by giving the bulbs a light dusting of talcum powder. Unless the judge is to be left with the consternation of a perfumed onion on Show day this needs to be wiped off prior to exhibiting. The onions need to be stored indoors for a couple of weeks. The tops should be left intact.



Three weeks before

If potatoes are to be shown, the potato haulms (the plant tops) should be cut off just above ground level and the potatoes left in the ground. This ensures that the tuber skins are able to set and not be damaged on lifting.

One week before

Potatoes can be lifted carefully, (better by hand), washed off, dried and wrapped in kitchen towel to be stored in the dark.

Show week

Cut off the tops of onions and shallots leaving enough length of top to fold over and tie up neatly with raffia or something similar. Ensure all pots and trays are clean and ready for use. Ensure that entry forms are filled in correctly and left at the shop or the post office with the correct fees and in good time.

The day before show

Most flowers can be cut and left up to their necks in water. Pot plants can be given a final soaking. During the afternoon, root vegetables can be lifted, washed and stored wrapped in a damp cloth. Most other vegetables can be treated in the same fashion but cut as late as possible. Tomatoes should be cut from the vine to leave the calyx intact (the star-shaped part which attaches the fruit to the plant). Collect entry tickets as directed in the show schedule.



The morning of show

Check that entry tickets match entries prior to departure. When transporting entries, take a spare of anything that might be damaged on the way and always take a spare tomato or two as they can split after picking. Leave plenty of time for setting up entries but if this is a first venture into showing, don't get to the tent too early. By arriving in the middle of the setting-up period it's possible to see how the "old hands" do it. Above all this should be a good experience so enjoy the day!!

Hawkesbury Show - Points a judge will consider.

Vegetables;

Condition:

The exhibit should be at its peak with excellent skin and be blemish-free. It should be within the size limits expected and if it's a vegetable with a skin bloom such as peas or tomatoes, the bloom if possible should be left undisturbed. The exhibit should naturally be spotless.

Similarity:

The components of an entry should be as near as possible identical in size, shape and colour, even if this means a slightly smaller set.

Size:

The size of an entry, where no maximum is listed, is normally no more important than any other consideration,

Presentation:

The schedule should be read and followed to the letter. Any trays or other containers should be spotless and in good order. For anyone who has shown before, it should be noticed, that there appears to be more requirement this year for items to be presented on white paper plates

Flowers

Pot plants:

The plants should be symmetrical, with clean, abundant foliage and if floriferous, the flowers should be well spread and in good condition. Plants should show some potential and have some buds as well as flowers and not be past their prime.



Long stemmed flowers:

These flowers, such as dahlias, asters, zinnias etc. should be blemish-free and have stem length in proportion to the flower heads. The flower should be about 80% mature and still have some potential.

General Points:

Ensure that all pots are clean and within the expected size limits. Ensure vases are clean and appropriate to the size of the blooms they are holding.

It is worth repeating, that the schedule should be read and followed to the letter.

Finally, if anyone isn't sure about anything to do with show, just ask one of the committee or one of the old hands. Enjoy!!

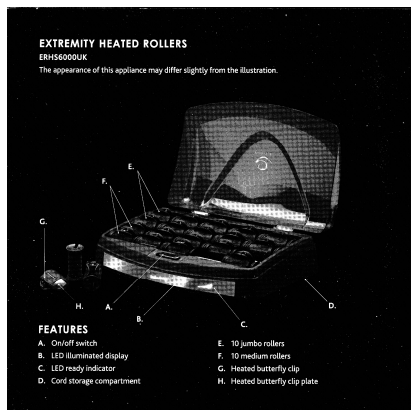

Hawkesbury CC Under 13's Win Stroud District Cup Final

The evening of 20th June was a notable one...the forecast of heavy showers was happily replaced by a mild and sunny evening...and Hawkesbury's Under 13 cricketers travelled to Minchinhampton to play the Stroud District Cup Final.

To reach this stage they had progressed past teams from Stone and Frampton in earlier rounds and were playing Chalford in the final. Neutral ground and umpires were the order of the day and Charlie Roberts was captain for Hawkesbury.

Hawkesbury lost the toss and were put in to bat, scoring 90 for 6 wickets in the allotted 20 overs against good bowling and excellent fielding from Charfield. The major contributions for Hawkesbury came from Jacob Nicholls (35 not out), Rory Farwell (14, until taken out by a fantastic diving catch at square leg) and George Smith (10). Smaller, but important scores were made by Robbie Foxwell, Charlie Roberts, Cameron Gilbey, Jonny Hayward and Tom Cranwell to get Hawkesbury up to 90. Oscar Woodrow was Chalford's most successful bowler with 2 wickets for 11 runs off his 4 overs.

It didn't seem enough runs when Chalford's young giant, Will Powell, smote the first two balls of Chalford's innings for a straight 4 and a 2, and then the opening pair reached 26 for 0 after 5 patient overs from Rory Farwell and Jacob Nicholls. But Charlie Roberts had it all under control and these same two bowlers then accounted for both openers to even things up.

Cameron Gilbey, bowling temptingly full and straight, took the next three wickets (for 7 runs) in tandem with spin from Robbie Foxwell, who helped out with the best catch of the day (a most athletic dive at mid off).

With half the side out for 40 from 11 overs, Chalford then struggled against very accurate and quick bowling from George Smith (2 wickets for 4 runs), Charlie Roberts (1 for 2) Tom Cranwell (0 for 0) and finally Adam Morgan (2 for 1). The last wicket fell to another astonishing leaping catch from Rory Farwell with the score on 52 after 17 overs.

It should be said that the Hawkesbury fielding was extremely sharp throughout, with both Ed Aris and Harry Green making several excellent stops. Charlie Roberts and Jacob Nicholls shared the wicket-keeping, allowing only 2 byes and everyone doing a fine job to keep the runs down.

The whole Hawkesbury team, coaches and cheering mums and dads were now in full voice as the medals were presented to both teams, who were congratulated by the organisers for playing the game in such a fine spirit.

Charlie Roberts proudly received the permanent trophy to commemorate the event...and the setting sun over Minchinhampton set off a memorable evening for us all.



UNDERDOG VETS BECOME GENT KILLERS AGAINST OLD SODBURY



The first evening match of the summer took place amidst sensational news from the grass courts of SW19. The big fish (and former Wimbledon champions) Rafa Nadal, Maria Sharapova and Roger Federer had all been outclassed by relative minnows. Could the unseeded, and unfancied Gents pull off an equally improbable act of giant-killing against the bookies' favourites, Old Sodbury? A glimpse at the recent head to head stats showed not a glimmer of hope for the home side, who had not beaten the Old Sods for a number of years.

A perfectly executed straight drive from David Peirce provided a significant and pivotal moment in this match. The Gents got off to a tremendous start, thanks to a 50 stand from Pete Roberts and Tim Chancellor. Swift cameos from Setterfield and Martyn Foster sped us towards our target. Keeping the scorebook up to date proved to be quite a challenge. This was less to do with the run rate, which - at 5 an over - was easy to record. It was more to do with the fact that Monty, the Setterfield family springer spaniel, had discovered a new canine extreme sport: scorebook surfing. With the sun now setting, the mellifluous pealing of the distant church bells at Horton sent a joyous Jubilate across the fields. Two more perfectly executed straight drives from Peirce resulted in additional rejoicing, this time from a group of stunned Gents, who had just recorded a fourth victory in five matches.

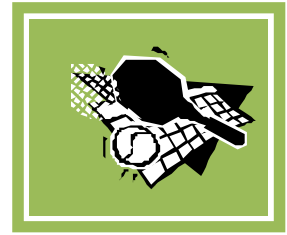

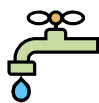

NEW COURSE DESIGNER FOR BADMINTON 2014

The Duke of Beaufort and Hugh Thomas, Director of the Mitsubishi Motors Badminton Horse Trials, have appointed a new Course Designer for the world famous Event. Giuseppe della Chiesa, Technical Delegate at the Event from 2008 to 2010 and assistant TD in 2011, has also been responsible for designing prestigious international courses, most well known being the Championship track at Pratoni, Italy where he was Show Director for the World Equestrian Games in 1998 and Course Designer for the European Championships in 2007.

Giuseppe was Technical Delegate for the Beijing Olympics 2008 and as a rider was Italian Champion in 1989 and Olympic reserve for Italy at the Barcelona Olympics 1992. He has designed both national and international courses in Italy and also at Windsor in Great Britain, Malmo in Sweden and in South Africa.

With a new Course Designer, Badminton 2014 will no doubt become a great topic both within the sport and to the spectating public.

On his appointment Giuseppe remarked: 'While I was surprised that Hugh was standing down as Course Designer, I am honoured to be asked to design at such a prestigious event, and looking forward to working with course builders the Willis Brothers and all the team at Badminton.'

The 2014 Event will return to the familiar Thursday to Sunday time frame culminating in the Jumping phase on Sunday 11th May.

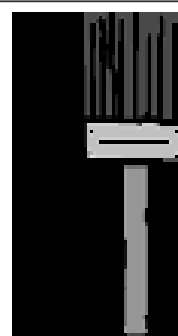

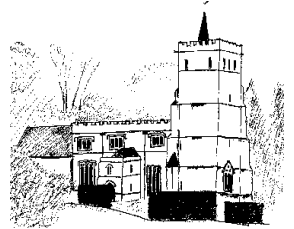

District Councillor's Report

Core Strategy & Planning

South Gloucestershire Council is one of the local authorities making good progress with its Core Strategy – Local Plan- which identifies areas for growth. These areas are focused around Patchway, Emerson's Green, Harry Stoke and Yate. As part of the plan the Council has written to parish councils about developing local planning policies, the Policies, Sites and Places Document, which will sit alongside the Core Strategy and will be used to determine future planning applications. This will concentrate on:

- Working with our local communities on a rural housing strategy, including a review of rural settlement boundaries, to enable small scale housing development to meet any locally identified needs;
- Defining town centre boundaries, allocating sites for new comparison (non-food) development and reviewing the list of primary and secondary shopping frontages;
- Reviewing and updating the detailed policies for managing new development, for example; conversion and self build, environmental protection, economic development, design and renewable energy;
- Identifying sites for particular types of development, including those coming forward from local communities.

It is anticipated that wide stakeholder and community input will be part of this work

New Homes Bonus Grants

One of the outcomes of housing growth is the New Homes Bonus monies. This is money released to local authorities when new houses are inhabited; it also covers empty homes which have come back into use. South Gloucestershire Council has agreed to top slice 30% of these monies and currently allocate it to the Area Forums. Local groups and parish councils are being encouraged to apply for this money. The projects must fall within Council policy, have local support, including from the parish council and not have any revenue implications, as well as, of course being in the community where the growth is.

At the moment over **£7000 is available for the Hawkesbury Parish. Please contact me should you require further information regarding making a bid. Bids for the next round to be in by 9th August.**

City Region Deal

This is an agreement between Government, the West of England (WofE) local authorities (which includes Bristol & South Gloucestershire) and the Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) giving them increased local financial flexibility in exchange for a focused programme of investment to enable the region to achieve its full economic growth potential.

There has been a change in the finance system, which allows local authorities to keep a proportion of the Business Rate growth. SGC had negotiated an exemption from the levy and reset assessments for the enterprise areas* which means more money will be available to be used for capital expenditure to develop business growth. This is separated into tiers for different levels of expenditure, (through the LEP) with a predicted £700m kept in the WofE, over the next 25 years and a good deal for South Gloucestershire.

* Enterprise Areas in South Gloucestershire: Filton, Emerson's Green, Severnside and Avonmouth.

Hawkesbury Cemetery

We are very fortunate in having a very beautiful and peaceful cemetery in a wonderful setting. The Parish Council is very grateful to all those people who help keep the ground looking so tidy and manage the graves. The Cemetery is owned and managed by the Parish Council and it pays for the general grass cutting.

As burial space is at a premium, the parish council agreed some years ago, that spaces would be restricted to those who live in the parish or with a very strong parish connection. Currently there is enough capacity, but this is always kept under review. The Parish Council recently reviewed the burial fees for the Cemetery and they are printed below.

St. Mary's Churchyard is a closed churchyard – no further burials can take place in this churchyard. The grass is cut by South Gloucestershire Council, and is covered by Special Expenses – a local tax which appears on the Council Tax bill. Again, we are all grateful to the volunteers who cut the yews, tender the paths, and keep the place looking very tidy.

Our Health Services - Consultation on Health & Social Care Provision at Frenchay

All hospital services including A&E are planned to move to the new Southmead Hospital in May 2014, leaving no health provision beds at Frenchay. During the summer the South Gloucestershire Clinical Commissioning Group (they buy the services we use), will be consulting on whether to include outpatient and diagnostic services as part of the provision on the Frenchay site they are planning. However we were promised 68 beds on the Frenchay site, so they are now consulting on where these beds should go in the meantime – called the 'interim provision'. It looks likely they will be on the Southmead site, leaving no hospital beds in South Gloucestershire.

To date details are sketchy – we only have a consultation timetable – which shows a report going to the Board at the end of August – so the consultation is short.

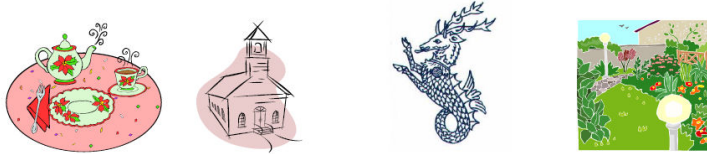

CROWDS TURN OUT FOR CINEMA CENTENARY

The sun shone on Wotton for a day celebrating the centenary of the town's cinema, the Electric Picture House. With the street closed to traffic, the way was clear for local people of all ages to enjoy a day of entertainment on Sunday 7 July.

Stalls lined the surrounding streets, offering refreshment, entertainment and the chance to support local charities. A traditional Punch and Judy show entertained the children and the Golden Stilwalkers towered over everyone, while there was music from the Goodnight Sweethearts, the Silver Band and the Wotton Community Choir – often, naturally, with a movie theme.

The Heritage Centre, currently hosting an exhibition on the Picture House's first hundred years, was bustling. The Arts Centre displayed photography for this year's calendar competition, along with entries for the centenary poetry competition.

And, of course, the cinema itself was open to the public. Some were regular visitors, some had never been before, and some had been... but not for a while. These included a gentleman who had worked as a projectionist at the cinema in the early 1950s. His arrival coincided with a blank screen, as the reel of trailers for upcoming releases was temporarily interrupted when the digital projector lamp breathed its last. Asked if this ever happened in the old days, he confirmed that actually it did!

Later, a new lamp safely installed, visitors were able to check on Andy Murray's progress as the early games of the Wimbledon Men's Final were projected on the cinema screen.

It is estimated that around 1,500 people visited over the six hours of the event.

Jeff Walshe, Chair of the Picture House Trust, said, "The day was designed to be a celebration of the town's local cinema for everyone to share. We're a part of the community, the cinema is staffed and run by local volunteers, so it was a way a way of sharing all the work we've done over the past few years to keep the cinema running. Many people from the community were incredibly helpful and supportive in organising the day, particularly Paula Underwood of Tenovus. We were delighted with the turn out, and with the enthusiasm and interest shown by our visitors. It was a great way to start our second hundred years!"

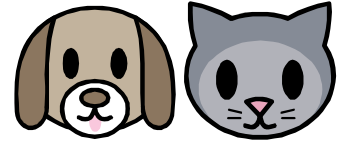
