Save Our Village Shop

As you may have read in the previous issue, the owner of the village shop has given notice that he wishes to sell the property. Due to our shop being registered as a Community Asset with South Gloucestershire Council, the sale of this property is "on-hold" for 6 months to give us, the community, a chance to develop a proposal to keep the shop open. Without further action any sale process can recommence at the end of June this year.

On Saturday 9th January over 150 people met in the Village Hall to find out what this means, what support there was for the village shop and to begin to understand what options the community has. There were then informative presentations on one possible approach; a Community Shop. The group heard about Community Shops in general from the West of England Rural Network, and specifically about Almondsbury Community Shop & Hillesley Community Pub (The Fleece).

At the meeting people registered their interest to form a Working Group, and those that could met on Wednesday 13th Jan. At that meeting it was decided that the Working Group's objective was to:

"Ensure, as far as practically possible, a healthy and sustainable retail shop within Hawkesbury Upton, alongside the other existing amenities"

Whilst the Community Shop approach was heavily discussed at the meeting on 9th Jan, all options and models are being considered.

The Working Group has split itself into a number of sub teams to spread the workload, with the initial focus being on:

- Understanding what different models of Community Shop exist
- 2. Investigating and evaluating other ownership and operating models
- Understand what goods & services the community want from the Village shop.

This information will be presented back to the parish at an open meeting at Hawkesbury Village Hall at 2pm on Saturday 20th February 2016

We are conscious that many people have views on the future of our shop and we'd certainly appreciate any thoughts, concerns and ideas, especially in advance of the meeting. You can send your ideas on email to <u>husosenquires@outlook.com</u> or drop them in the feedback box in the village shop.

Fiona Writes...


Welcome to the February issue of Hawkesbury Parish News.

A few jobs to keep the gardeners busy

Soil preparation

Areas to be planted should be raked over to a fine tilth and fed with 2 ounces per square yard of general fertilizer such as growmore or chicken manure pellets and this should be raked in and allowed to settle before seeds are planted.

Towards the end of the month the following seeds can be sown, remembering that seedlings which result may need to be protected from frost with a layer of fleece.; salad leaves, onions, broad beans, summer cabbage, early peas and radish. As a rule of thumb one layer of fleece will



protect down to 3 degrees of frost. Plant also soft fruit, bare root hedging, onion and shallot sets and garlic. It's a good idea to start onion and shallot sets in cell trays before planting out. Birds have a habit of tugging the sets out of the soil as they assume that the wispy tops of the sets resemble food. If the sets have been brought into growth, the birds aren't attracted to the green shoots on display, and will leave the sets alone. If garlic is to be planted the cloves are planted at least 3 cms. under the surface of the soil unlike the sets just mentioned, which are planted on the surface.

Empty greenhouses should be given a thorough clean and sprayed internally with Armillatox or Jeyes fluid which will disinfect the house and kill any bugs which have over-wintered therein. The outside should also be cleaned to ensure a maximum of light can penetrate when growing begins. If plants are still being grown in the greenhouse, it's a good idea to ventilate it on milder days. Pots and trays need to be washed out, and a useful method is to fill a wheelbarrow with a mild

solution of Jeyes or Armillatox swill out the trays and pots in the barrow and leave upturned to dry out.



(The pots that is, not the barrow)

As a final thought, don't be too hasty in visiting the garden centres to buy spring bedding plants even though they will have wondrous displays. Most will have a huge variety long before they can be planted out safely, which are doomed to failure if put in before the frosts are finished. It's worth a thought that they'd much rather sell you the plants twice if the first lot get frosted off. **Brian Noble**

I received a lot comment on my post last February about my dislike of sprouts. And, as sure as eggs is eggs, at Christmas dinner at my sister-in-laws an enormous bowl of those putrid little green balls of impending flatulence appeared on the table. And although other guests raved 'Ooh! Sprouts! I just love sprouts!' it gave me no satisfaction to see that no one actually ate very many. To test my mettle further my daughter-in-law gave me some chocolate sprouts as a Christmas present, which was a fun idea but, no, they didn't do the trick either.

However, a concerned friend (Gef), noting my aversion, sent me a recipe for 'Sprouts For People Who Don't Like Sprouts' that he was sure would be acceptable to me and here it is (the quantities are arbitrary) :-

Slice the sprouts into fairly thin pieces, chop a red chili, chop or press a couple of cloves of garlic, finely grate a thumbsize chunk of fresh root ginger.

Fry chilli, garlic and ginger in oil for a couple of minutes then add the sprouts.

Add 3 tablespoons of medium dry sherry and 3 tablespoons of soy or Teriyaki sauce. Stir-fry until the sprouts are just done.

Eh voila! Cooked like this sprouts are quite enjoyable, mainly because if, like my son, you are a bit heavy on the chili you can hardly taste the little blighters at all. An acceptable compromise I reckon.

At the first meeting of the New Year the President introduced

the new programme for 2016 and said it was great to welcome several new members too!

We were fortunate to have as our speaker, villager John Ruthven, filmmaker and producer of science and natural history documentaries. John chose as his topic filming with sharks. In 2013 he and a small team of divers and scientists set out on the boat the Golden Shadow to discover more about shark behaviour around coral reefs near Tahiti in French Polynesia in the Pacific. John said people are very interested in shark behaviour but not so interested in the state of coral reefs. And, if a link could be established between them it could help in their conservation, as destruction of reefs is now a major problem. With John and the crew's stunning underwater filming we experienced the excitement of

discovering the feeding behaviour of Great Reef Sharks.

John and other divers had witnessed the Great Reef Shark's behaviour during the daytime when they had chased fish unsuccessfully and knew that filming at night was the only option, though more dangerous. However the risk is limited by using all available research data and also local knowledge. In this case the tides had to be predicted to within minutes as there was always the danger of being swept out to sea, as the divers had to position themselves in the passage, where tides rush in to fill the lagoon in the centre of the reef.

It was the first time that Great Reef Sharks have been filmed feeding naturally as they swim along side their prey during night-time hours, and, with a flick of the head, devour unsuspecting fish!

Natural History filming at sea is a costly business and when filming Blue Planet for the BBC in 2000, John said the cost of a single programme could be as high as a million. Besides the BBC and other TV companies, Film Units are usually sponsored by big corporations and very wealthy individuals!

The vote of thanks was given by Ellen Callaghan for a brilliant evening. Brain Cooke was also thanked for aiding with the film projector.





Letter from the Vicar - February 2016

Dear Friends,

As promised, I would like to tell you about another of the lovely churches in our Benefice.

This month, I would like to tell you a bit about Great Badminton Church, which was built in 1785 to in the style of St Martin in the fields. It is not open every Sunday for services, but it is used about six times a year for services such as the Sunday of The Horse Trials weekend, Remembrance Sunday and so on. We usually also have a service in the summer at some time, when it is warm! We also have evening Prayer every Friday afternoon at 4.30pm (but check before coming). When you walk in, you are immediately struck by the high box pews, which does not suit modern ecclesiological tastes, where the focus is upon the gathered community, rather than individual families (in their own pew), making their private devotions. Having said which, if you have a screaming child, they are great, as no one knows where the noise is coming from!

The chandeliers, enormous ornate monuments, the dominating pulpit and the Duke of Beaufort's standard flying from the entrance to the chancel – is all very impressive. However, past all this, and beyond the very powerful organ, is the altar with angels flanking it. It is here that I wish to bring you, as this is where I encourage couples to sign their names in marriage registers and where the Sacrament of Holy communion is celebrated. This is the place where the community gathers to receive its Saviour in the bread and wine of the Eucharist. This is the Holy table, the Altar. This is the best part of the whole church, in my view, and it is the main focus of worship.

At the entrance, (I should have said earlier) is the Font, which we use quite regularly for local Christenings, when hundreds of Aunts, Uncles, cousins and friends gather to welcome a new child into the world and into the Church. This is nearly always a separate service as not only do we not have many Sunday services in Great Badminton, but it makes sense to fill the church with a family and their entourage (which can be quite a lot!) as a separate event.

It is an extraordinary Church, and well worth making the effort to coming to one of the services to see and hear it in action (the organ is fantastic!). Next month I will tell you about another of our churches.

South Gloucestershire Council's Report

PLANNING

A busy time in the Planning world. Many thanks to all those who managed to wade through and respond to the Policy Sites & Places Consultation on the methodology for delivering 1500 houses across the rural areas in the next 5 years. Alongside this, is the consultation on the Joint Spatial & Transport Plan for the West of England (South Gloucestershire/Bristol/Bath & North East Somerset/North Somerset), which closes on 29th January- all details available on www.southglos.gov.uk/ consultations

Both Consultations have asked for a Call for Sites – this is a call to landowners and others to put forward sites which they would be willing to have developed. This does not mean they will get planning permission. Currently in Hawkesbury Parish the following sites have been put forward: land alongside France Lane; land to the south of Park Street; land opposite The Pool,; land at St.John's Street; land at Warren Farm; land off Birgage Road and land at Dunkirk Barn.A46.

A further formal consultation will start in April, bringing together all the comments received.

Community Hubs/Libraries/ Public Lavatories

A consultation is due to start as part of the Council's Saving Programme – options are being put forward for the closure of Chipping Sodbury Library and ceasing of the Mobile Library Service. I am sure many people will want to comment and may have ideas on how improvements can be made. Please do make sure you respond to this consultation, and please get back to me with your views.

Picnic Site J18/M4/A46

The closure of this site by Highways England – who own the site- has led to increased dangerous parking on the surrounding roads. It has long been an aspiration to have a proper functioning Park & Share (or even Ride) site at this busy junction. A meeting is being planned with Highways England and other agencies to work to get the site opened up.

OUR LOCAL BUS SERVICES: 86 & 84

There are posters around advertising the consultation on changes to our local bus services. Comments are requested by the 11th February, and remember this also includes the bus service which is used by many school children. You may also want to comment that the

service be extended to the evenings to enable access to the new Cinema at Yate, which opens in March/April.

The Council wants to amend how these services operate, the proposal sees

The 84 operating a circular route in an anti-clockwise direction (Wotton under Edge – Charfield – Cromhall – Wickwar – Chipping Sodbury – Yate – Chipping Sodbury – Horton – Hawkesbury Upton – Hillesley – Alderley – Wotton under Edge)

A new 85 service operating a circular route as above but in a clockwise direction.

The 86 operating between Yate and Longwell Green on an improved timetable.

Please note the proposal does not result in any loss of service and should provide a more frequent service. School journeys will still be provided, although times may alter slightly. Those to the North of Yate wanting to travel to Emersons Green, Mangotsfield, Kingswood will need to change at Yate bus Station.

Hawkesbury and Inglestone Commons Officer

Scrub management on the commons has followed the recommendations of the scrub management plan commissioned from the Farm Wildlife Advisory Group in 2011. Scattered scrub, consisting largely of brambles and blackthorn is an important wildlife habitat in its own right, but left unchecked can develop into thickets and eventually woodland on what was once wildflower

grassland.

The plan aims to cut scrub back from areas of high value grassland to reverse this process and to prevent areas of grassland becoming isolated and difficult to reach by cattle and walkers.

Work is planned adjacent to the road at Inglestone Common to cut blackthorn back from the road creating better links across the common, improved visibility and an increase in grassland. The work should be completed by the end of February to ensure that if we are lucky enough to have an early spring, nesting birds will not be disturbed.

Cllr Higgs was invited to attend the Get Bristol Buzzing meeting at Baileys Court activity centre; Bradley Stoke. It was inspiring to meet such a warm and friendly group of people.

South Gloucestershire Council has now officially signed up to the strategy. It was suggested that our parish, group or you as an individual can do the same.

Which is better for pollinating insects the countryside, towns or native reserves?

Results after much work across 5 universities show that although they support different species, they are all equally as good.

Which urban areas are best for pollinating insects?

Parks and green open spaces were surprisingly poor unless they had specific long grass areas. The best sites by a long way were allotments.

What actions can we take to boost insect numbers?

Research is still ongoing. New meadows have been created, dandelions supported most insects, but no evidence yet as to whether summer food is the limiting resource, and whether flowers boost numbers or just draw insects in.

Recycling opportunity

Do you love to have a cup of frothy coffee or a smooth espresso, made freshly in your own home?

Do you hate the idea of sending more and more waste to landfill sites?

If your answer to both these questions is "YES", then please read on.....

We have recently purchased a coffee making machine which uses the little coffee and milk pods, and we enjoy the occasional cappuccino or latte. But afterwards, I had to throw away the used pods as they didn't seem to suit the criteria of any one of the recycling containers. I did some research and found that there is a national recycling programme for these pods:

Tassimo and pods foil packaging:

A company called 'TerraCycle' offers national programmes ("Brigades") to collect previously non-recyclable or hard to recycle waste (see their useful website they will even



collect cigarette butts, and recycle them into useful plastic items like pallets or compost!) Currently, all the programmes offer free postage as well as a donation for the waste that is collected. Currently, our nearest collection point is in Falfield, and I have been in contact with Karen, who organises the Tassimo recycling from her home. For every 20kg of Tassimo pods and foil packaging sent, one 'TerraCycle point' is earned, which can be redeemed for a monetary contribution to a charity. Karen nominated to collect for Myeloma UK, as a member of her family suffers with that condition.

Karen told me – "It is definitely a win-win situation..... so far I've raised about £150 (only been doing this a year and it was a bit slow to start off), and also prevented 9,800 pods and their packaging from going to landfill"

Nespresso pods:

Nespresso will recycle their pods (or capsules as they refer to them) but not any of the

packaging, and there is no money to be made (at present) from this programme. If you order your capsules online, there is a 'take away and recycle' facility which you can easily sign up to.




Alternatively, you can return your used capsules via a Nespresso Boutique or take them to collection points, which in this area can be found in Dursley, Thornbury, Nailsworth, Stroud and one at McColls, Broad Street, Chipping Sodbury.

I am offering my house as a collection point for both Nespresso capsules and Tassimo pods + foil packaging. If you have any such waste that you would like recycled, please put into a bag or a box, and when your container is full, drop off at 'Coombe View', High Street (next to the Parish Hall). Just leave in the front porch if I'm not in. PLEASE do not mix Tassimo and Nespresso waste. Karen was very happy for me to bring all our Tassimo waste to her so she can make more money for Myeloma UK. I will drop off the Nespresso capsules when I go to Chipping Sodbury.

Please feel free to collect and bring pods/capsules from your work or from friends and relatives outside the village. I'm happy to recycle as much of this previously un-recyclable waste as possible.


