"Wulfstan the Hawkesbury Hare" Unveiled

The exciting news has reached us that next month, Hawkesbury will be featuring in the *Cotswolds Hare Trail* 2017.

A total of eighty fibreglass "moon hares" will be positioned all over the Cotswolds, from Yate in the south to Chipping Camden in the north.

Mark and Fiona Steeds from The Beaufort Arms are sponsoring one of the hares, which has been decorated by Linda Jane Smith, who is a regular visitor to the village and whose art is displayed in the Beaufort restaurant.




"Wulfstan the Hawkesbury Hare" features episodes/iconography of Wulfstan's life (his mitre, crozier, Doomsday Book) and a Bayeux type border at the base of his cloak, with more episodes from his life (start in Hawkesbury church, miracles, church builder and getting the slave trade banned in Bristol).

On Thursday 19th of January, the feast of St Wulfstan (how very apt!), "Wulfstan the Hawkesbury Hare" was officially unveiled at Hawkesbury Primary School, by festival Director Florence Beetlestone.

Mark Steeds gave a talk to the school pupils on St Wulfstan and Rev. Richard Thomson carried out an official and lively blessing of the hare. "Wulfstan" will be positioned on the plinth in the Beaufort Garden once the trail gets underway next month.

The Cotswolds Hare Festival launches officially in March and runs from March 25th – September 10th 2017. The trail's aim is to promote life and tourism in Gloucestershire and the Cotswolds. When the trail comes to an end, the hares will be auctioned off to raise money for

drink-drive initiative and made 43 arrests across South Glos. But happily, not on our patch.

Telephone Preference Service scam.

Yet another scam call received recently in our NHW area. The recipient of the call was addressed by name, and had registered with the TPS some time ago to bar coldcall telephoning.

If you receive a call from someone claiming to be from the TPS or a similar sounding organisation, asking for personal information or charging you for this service, the advice is not to pay, or give them any personal details, it is most likely a scam.

We are aware of a number of organisations that call from overseas, possibly India claiming to be TPS or affiliated with TPS or BT. They ask for your credit card details to complete a registration to stop unwanted calls. They often claim that you previously gave your permission for this call. This is a scam. Never give out your credit card details over the phone.

Going into the new year it would be

good to have a few more 'NHW Contacts' to cover all areas of the village. We still have our stalwart team (thankyou for your continued support) but if you are interested in an active, but not arduous, involvement then please let me know.

Food for thought for the indoor season

Crop rotation

The purpose of crop rotation is, in the main, twofold

1 Pest and disease control. If the crops are grown in the same place every year, any pests or diseases alive in a crop will be just allowed to proliferate.

2 Intake of nutrients. Differing vegetable groups take a different group of nutrients and rotation allows us to replace what the previous crops have used up

Benefits of rotation

An improvement in soil fertility, because of the using up all the nutrients in certain parts of the plot.

Possible weed control due to some crops like squash potatoes or cabbages having large leaves or dense foliage which starves the weeds of light and feed and can well benefit the next crop because of less need to weed.

Crop Groups

Brassicas

Cabbage, cauliflower, kale, brussels sprouts, radish ,swede, turnip.

<u>Legumes</u>, Peas French , runner and broad beans. It is quite O.K to have a semi- permanent runner bean trench as they have few disease problems, as long as they are fed on a regular and kept moist. <u>Onions</u> Onions, garlic, shallots leeks <u>Potato family</u> potatoes, tomatoes, pepper and aubergine

<u>Root crops</u> Beetroot carrot, celeriac, celery, florence fennel, parsnip and all other root crops except swede, and turnip which are classified as brassicas.

Method of rotation

Divide the plot into three and begin the growth pattern with the vegetables fed with the feeds as indicated.

Year one

section one Potatoes Feedfertilizer section two Legumes, onions and roots Feed manure or compost section three Brassicas Feed fertilizer and lime Year two section one Legumes, onions and roots Feed manure or compost section two Feed fertilizer Brassicas and lime section three Potatoes Feed fertilizer Year Three section one Brassicas Feed fertilizer and lime section two potatoes Feed fertilizer

section three Legumes, onions and roots. Feed manure or compost

Points to be aware of

1 When using manure ,ensure it is wellrotted, or you'll end up with a plot of weeds

2 when planting after applying lime, try to hold back the planting for at least four weeks to allow the lime to be diluted, as it has a tendency to burn tender roots when fresh.

The above guide is only meant as a starting point and there will be changes as the gardener becomes more experienced

Dahlias

For those who may be interested in growing these magnificent flowers, I shall be offering a monthly guide from March to Show day. One thing to bear in mind is that these plants do not benefit from having the same tuber stuck back in the ground year after year, as the tuber gets bigger and the flower gets weaker.

If you're serious about growing the best ,then cuttings or plant sections need to be used and are available for many locations on line. Two of those which I have found to be of good standard are a Scottish company called Cruikshank and a Northumbrian firm called Halls of Heddon. **Brian Noble**

The Cotswolds Wardens have made approaches to the owners of Farm Pool, South Gloucestershire Council (it is registered Common Land) and the Parish Council to carry out some restoration work on The Pool. This will include trying to rid the Pool of the invasive bulrushes and restore

the water levels – however many will remember several efforts made in the past to try and restore the Pool. We are very grateful to the Cotswolds Wardens for their interest and enthusiasm and look forward to seeing their more detailed plans. 

South Gloucestershire Councillor's Report

The Next Planning Stage:

The new South Gloucestershire Local Plan (2018-2036) prospectus sets out the proposed scope, and programme for preparing the new Local Plan. We also want to share with you our strategic priorities for the area, and how the council will deliver new development in line with the vision and aspirations of our local communities and the needs of people who live, work and invest in South Gloucestershire. Consultation on the Local Plan prospectus runs from Thursday 12 January – Thursday 23 February 2017.

The Council is moving forward with a feasibility study for a new M4 link between J18 and the M32. Councillors and interested Town and Parish Councillors have been invited to a briefing on the 30th January. A review is being carried out by the Boundary Commission on the number of Councillors in South Gloucestershire as well as the areas which they cover – i.e. the wards. There is also to be a change from the current Committee Structure to the Cabinet/Executive style of local government where all decisions are made by very few councillors.

Hawkesbury and Inglestone Commons Officer

South Gloucestershire Council is responsible for managing many commons across the area and with some now on the urban fringe, infringements of the Byelaws has increased. SGC is in the process of recruiting an officer to deal with enforcement issues across all of the commons – including Hawkesbury and Inglestone Commons. I will post more details when I have them. We were pleased to host experts from The Freshwater Habitats Trust on a cold

and blustery January morning to search

for fairy shrimp. These delightful little creatures were found by Hazel Willmott in a temporary pond off New House Farm Lane in 2013 and experience from one of their UK strongholds in the New Forest suggests that they could be located in other temporary ponds and ruts across the commons. FWHT brought captive bred fairy shrimps for us to study and explained their lifecycle and ecological requirements. We then stared intently into the pond, the trick is to try and look below the surface, getting your

eye in on a passing mosquito larvae or water beetle... and hopefully catch site of a fairy sculling by on its back feeding as it goes. None of this was helped by rain bouncing off the pond and sadly, the fairies remained elusive. Despite this the training was well received and gave volunteers an idea of where and when to search. We hope to survey again in the autumn when conditions will be better.

All characters and incidents are entirely fictitious, not only because I don't want to be sued. It's also because events in Hawkesbury are often so funny/ bizarre/surprising that you couldn't make them up if you tried.

And that's another reason I'm glad to be living here. At this time of year especially, it may be cold, wet and grey, but life in Hawkesbury Upton is certainly never dull.





Hawkesbury notes (3)

Mrs Frances Johnson 1725 - 1812 "the oldest British resident in Calcutta"

In the grounds of St. John's Church in Calcutta (now Kolkata), there is a small mausoleum commemorating the life of Frances Johnson, née Crook, second daughter of Edward Crook, who had been governor of Fort St. David on the Coromandel coast of south-east India.

Frances Crook married firstly, in 1738, at the age of 13, the interestingly named Parry Purple Templer, nephew of the Governor of Calcutta, by whom she had two children, both dying in infancy. About five years after their marriage her husband died, leaving Frances a widow at 18 years old.

Frances married secondly James Altham, a civil servant of the Bengal establishment, but he sadly fell victim to small-pox, and died only twelve days after their marriage.

About two years later, in 1749, Frances took as her third husband William Watts, a senior member of the Supreme Council of Bengal. The couple were in Calcutta at the time of the Black Hole incident there in 1756, and William was subsequently held captive by the evil Nawab, Siraj-ud-Daula, who was defeated a year later by Robert Clive's forces at the battle of Plassey in 1757. William had been released by this time, and he and his wife returned to England in 1760.

William and Frances had four children: Amelia (born 1750), Edward (b. 1752), Sophia (b. 1753), and lastly William, who died in infancy.

At the age of 19, Amelia "a lady of great beauty and accomplishments", married the Right Honorable Charles Jenkinson (7th Baronet Hawkesbury, and later Earl of Liverpool), but on a journey to Hawkesbury for a change of air from London, after the birth of her first and only child Robert (the future Prime Minister), she died on July 12, 1770, and her body was brought to Hawkesbury manor house prior to its burial in the parish church on July 20, 1770. Amelia's husband Charles was also buried in the family vault beneath the chancel of St Mary's, Hawkesbury, as was her son Sir Robert Jenkinson (Prime Minister 1812 -1827).

Amelia's sister Sophia, incidentally, married George Poyntz Ricketts Esq., then Governor of Barbados, who descended from the Poyntz family of Alderley.

After the death of her husband William in 1764 Frances went back to India, and there married her fourth husband Rev. W. Johnson in 1774, but he returned to England and the marriage was annulled in 1787. Frances remained in India until her death in 1812, aged 87 (and "the oldest British resident in Calcutta") a few months before her grandson was appointed Prime Minister.

He took delivery of the goods, gave the driver a Christmas tip for his trouble and then phoned his wife on her mobile, who was busy shopping in Chipping Sodbury, to check what to do with the delivery. Sadly, that's when the problems began... He said, "My wife immediately told me she hadn't ordered anything from Iceland and didn't know anything about the delivery! I found an address on one bag and the postcode is only one letter out from us on Inglestone Common, but it's somewhere in Highfields".

The clock was ticking on the frozen delivery...

I took a look at the address and told him exactly where to go and, as he drove off, he said "I really should have worn my Santa hat!"

It just goes to show that, contrary to popular opinion that Father Christmas lives at the North Pole, it seems he lives on Inglestone Common...as he made sure someone got their delivery in time for Christmas. *Fiong Rowe*

Refurbishment of Mangotsfield and temporary closure of the Sort It Centre.


