Latest Scam — this time relating to BT

The latest scam to reach us is another phone scam, by persons claiming to be from BT, checking broadband speeds of customer in the area.

They claim to be able to see that your broadband speed is not what it should be and has been bad for some time. However, they now claim to be on the case and able to sort it and provide a refund because of the poor speeds for so long.

The amount specified to an attempted victim was £204.50 to be credited to their account, but they would need to do some remote tweaks to the PC to make it all work more efficiently. This is where the poor unsuspecting person gets caught as they are then asked to enter a few of the usual keystrokes that allow the scammer onto the PC.

In the meantime, they have asked for bank details to make the refund and the refund seems takes place but, hey ho, there is suddenly an issue that they have refunded too much, in the recent case it was something around £2204.50. The scammer then asked the customer to check their online back account and the

money appears to be in their account, with the 'BT' person also appeantly able to see the online account.

The next step was to then pay 'BT' back by some sort of transfer but only £900 then another £900, with a claim that it is something to do with paying 'Corporate Accounts'.

In this recent instance the person got suspicious and hung up and called Lloyds bank, they confirmed that they had spotted this fraudulent activity and there was in fact no £2204.50 in his account.

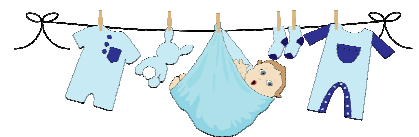
The victim could no longer logon to their PC, which needed to be cleaned up and is now OK, but it is not a pleasant experience and nearly 2 hours were spent on the phone!

Thanks to Angelo for details of the scam, which have been passed onto Neighbourhood Watch & local police.

If you are a BT customer and you receive a call you are unsure of, you will not need to do any of this, as they will already have all your account and payment details. Just hang up.

Christmas came early this year for HVT. After a bit of a wait, the new Comcar has arrived and today completed its first trip taking Brian Noble to the BRI, with “yours truly” driving. I apologise to all those who believed me when I said it was pink, actually it is white or it was when we collected it.

The new vehicle, another Citroen is larger, has more leg room for the rear passengers, it has soundproofing, so is a lot quieter, and the seats are of a much better quality, also it has the HVT logo on the rear.

For the drivers, the split rear doors have been replaced by a hatch so rear vision is improved, there are reversing indicators, and central locking, plus one or two other extras.

It is thanks to all of the volunteers, past and present, who, have contributed their time, and in many cases the use of their own car, for transporting members of the local community to and from medical appointments, that HVT is considered, by South Gloucestershire Council, worthy of support, without which we could not provide the standard of service that we now achieve.

Now we need some help. Our communications between Coordinator and the drivers and passengers is a vital

necessity. Recently the very poor mobile telephone signal has deteriorated to the extent that all of the Coordinators are struggling to get even a one bar signal. HVT uses a mobile phone, which has been changed 3 times this year using different signal suppliers all to no avail. So is there anyone who can advise me about any system that is available that improves the signal, or allows the use of a landline?

Meanwhile, would passengers please be

patient if you don't get a reply, and as a temporary measure contact me on my home phone, 01454238788 if you don't get a reply after 24 hours. Also remember the shorter the notice that you give, the less chance there is that a driver can be found.

Gardening thoughts for the New Year

While most planting and caring for seeds and growing is at a low ebb, maybe now is the time to thinking of putting a bit of effort into the great provider in the garden - the soil. Whilst most of garden maintenance is wrapped up by Autumn, a lot of good work can be done in terms of soil improvement at this time providing conditions are good and we aren't clomping about compacting wet soil. We should look at the 3 main types of garden soil we have (There are a huge variety)

1. Heavy soil which has a high clay content. This will normally have some water and nutrient content, but because of it's compact nature , it is high impenetrable to the tiny

roots of especially new plants in their search for sustenance.

2. Sandy soil which is, as stated, of a high sand content and does not hold water or nutrients well ,hence the plant roots can penetrate it easily but there's little sustenance when they do
3. Loam, which is a balanced soil and achieves the support for plants and the food and water which they need.

The addition of organic material when forked into the garden such as manure or compost, will always help to achieve a balance in the former two for plant success.

1. In heavy soils organic material will open up pathways in the clay for small roots to pass.

2. In sandy soils organic material will provide body and help to retain food and water.

We get some nutrition normally from compost or manure but in the cases I mention, the main purpose is to condition the soil. to allow it to do the job we expect of it. We can always feed the plants we grow with nutrients specific to their needs.

Because plants and soil are so complex, their needs are all different and plants take different things from the soil. For this reason, they aren't grown in the same place all of the time so the soil does not lose a particular element. This can be achieved by crop rotation which will be discussed in the February magazine.

Ebay

10 years ago (January 2007)

- On January 14th the Village Hall held a Sunday breakfast, and invited people to take a look at the new toilet cubicles, including the accessible toilet/shower room, that had just been fitted.
- Residents were invited to a drop-in meeting at the Village Hall, as a pre-launch for the Hawkesbury Vision Project. Data gathered from the previously distributed questionnaire would be displayed and members of the Steering Group would be available to answer any questions.
- The Friends of St Mary's held a 'Guess the number of logs on the back of Michael Cox's pick-up' as a fundraiser. £300 was raised towards the organ restoration fund. Mr Fred Horne, from Inglestone Common guessed the exact number of logs as 328, and won the load of logs as his prize.
- Moira Fozard wrote that the WI Christmas Party meeting had been a great success. There was mulled wine, mince pies and Christmas carols. The hall was dressed for Christmas and Gladys's tree arrangement was just beautiful. Mrs Bell gave a talk on Harrods in Edwardian times. Photographs were shown of the first 'moving staircase' which was built in the store in 1898.
- Hawkesbury Playgroup and Toddlers wished a Happy Birthday to the following children, who had birthdays in January – Rachel Jennings, 2 years old on the 3rd, Harriet Hicks, 1 year old on the 6th, Christopher Pidsley, 1 year old on the 11th, Tammy Newman, 3 years old on the 20th, and Adam Phillips, 4 years old on the 22nd.
- A Blue Peter 'Bring & Buy sale' was to be held in the School Hall, on the 16th. Organisers Angela Evers, Jeni Osborne, Gill Truebody and Christine Chancellor invited everyone to come to support this good cause
- The Wednesday Night Youth Club had arranged a skittles evening on January 17th at The Fox Inn. This was to raise some funds to take the youngsters for an evening out in town. Tickets were to be £1 each, to include a ploughman's supper. Organisers were Joan Yuill, Barry Philpott and Mark Weaver
- Sue Hope, as secretary of the Village Hall, thanked all those people and organisations that had given generously towards the Annual Christmas Whist Drive and Annual draw. The evening had made about £300 profit, which would go towards the building fund. The improvements and extensions to the existing hall were to be in three phases. Stage 1 – the creation of more bar space and storage, with a small dressing room for the stage; Stage 2 – an extension to the kitchen; Stage 3 – an extension to create a permanent stage and more storage. Sue reported that the acoustic ceiling had already been completed and this had not only aided the acoustics in the hall, but made the upstairs room much warmer in the winter months.

20 years ago (January 1997)

- Terry Truebody reported that 380 people had come to see the Hawkesbury Theatrical Group's Autumn production of 'The Pied Piper of Hawkesbury'. Profits from the show were donated to the Methodist Chapel in Back Street to help with their repair works.

30 years ago (January 1987)

- Hawkesbury Church choir had sung carols in Badminton House in December, by the invitation of the Duchess of Beaufort. A team of hand bell ringers from Bristol also played. Church people from Hawkesbury and Badminton came to join in and the Duchess had provided refreshments.

HELLO NEW YEAR By Alan C. Porter



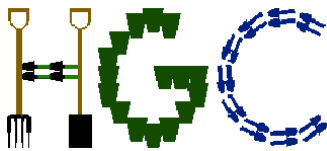

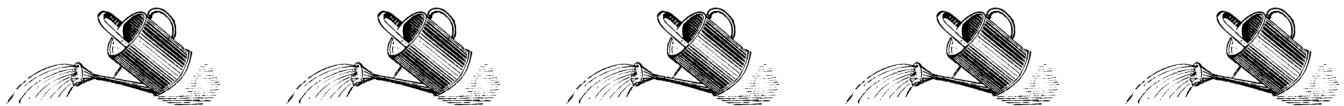
To get you prepared for the coming growing season *Marshfield Gardening Club* are holding their annual

Affordable/Social Housing in Hawkesbury Upton

I have been asked to provide some information regarding the bungalows in Hawkesbury Upton, the following is meant to be a helpful note, so I have included all the affordable/social housing in the parish. If it is confusing, or you need further help, please get in touch.

There are three housing associations with properties in Hawkesbury Upton – they are the landlords for all the social housing in the village.

Merlin Housing Association took over all the Council House stock in 2006. This includes some of the original housing stock built after WWII and in the 60s and 70s as well as the bungalows in Highfields. These houses are available for anyone with a local connection to South Gloucestershire as defined under the rehousing policy - they are not limited to those with a local connection to Hawkesbury Upton. The bungalows are available for those with disabilities or aged over 60.

The **English Rural Housing Association** manages the 10 houses built at the end of Birgage Road in 1996. This housing was developed on an Exception Site, (ie. land not normally considered for development) and conditioned by a legal restriction to those with a local connection to Hawkesbury Upton. There are 7 houses for rent and 3 houses for shared ownership, and the local connection restriction applies to across both these tenures. The site was developed after a housing survey was carried out by the parish council. It took some time to find the land and acquire the necessary planning permission. It has been more difficult to sell the shared ownership house in recent years, however the turnover in these properties is very low.

Knightstone Housing Association developed the Highfields site in 2003/4. This development was supported by a local housing needs survey and produced 9 homes (8 houses and 1 bungalow). These homes are all for rent and limited to those with a

local connection to Hawkesbury Upton. The land was owned by South Gloucestershire Council.

To be considered for any of the homes, people do need to have a live application on the Housing Register. Applicants are then assessed for their priority and placed in one of three bands –

Band A –for people who need to be rehoused urgently, for example, where there is a serious risk to their safety, health or wellbeing if they remain in their current home.

Band B – for people who have a housing need, such as overcrowding or who are sharing a kitchen or bathroom, but who are not at serious risk.

Registered Applicant – for everyone else who is looking for housing in South Gloucestershire although they are considered to be suitably housed. The Council operates a Choice Based Lettings system to advertise all available homes and applicants 'bid' for the property they are interested in. Adverts run every week. 'Bidding' means registering an interest- nothing to do with money. People are not able to bid for properties which are too big for them. It is the Housing Association who assesses the local connection to Hawkesbury Upton and makes the final decision on the tenancy using advertised criteria. If no-one with a local connection to the village is considered, the Housing Association can 'cascade' the property to other applicants rather than have the home remain vacant.

People must re-register their interest every year if they wish to stay on the Housing Register.

Local connection criteria

"Local Connection" shall mean a connection demonstrated by a person or member of their household who at the date of an Affordable Dwelling in the relevant Parish being advertised:

(i) has been resident within the Parish of Hawkesbury for a continuous period of three years within the preceding five years or six months in the preceding twelve months other than not of his own choice (not including serving with

regular armed forces of the Crown) or

(ii) is permanently employed within the Parish of Hawkesbury or is moving to the Parish to take up an offer of permanent employment or

(iii) has a close family member (e.g. parent or adult child or sibling) who is living and has lived in the Parish of Hawkesbury for a continuous period of five years immediately preceding the date of advertising the Affordable Dwelling

(iv) because of special circumstances.

It is the responsibility of the housing association landlord of the advertised property to assess the local connection of the applicant. This assessment may require the applicant to provide evidence such as listed below, although this is not exhaustive.

Residency – sufficient evidence to cover the relevant local connection period for prospective purchaser/tenant/close family member as appropriate

- Utility bills (water, gas, electricity, phone etc)
- Council tax bills
- Bank/Building Society account/ credit card statements
- State benefit books
- Receipts showing rent paid
- Payslips showing home address
- Written certification from either a Solicitor / Social Worker / Probation Officer / Inland Revenue Officer / Police Officer / Teacher or Doctor

Employment – sufficient evidence to cover the relevant local connection period

- Payslips showing employer's address
- Employer's letter confirming length and terms of employment (including hours worked if applicable)

Neighbourhood Watch

Reducing the opportunity for crime

A scam highlighted by the national fraud and cyber-crime reporting centre Action Fraud in May 2016 is affecting people in Hawkesbury Upton.

In November, police were made aware of a number of calls to residents of the village from people claiming to be from Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs (HMRC) in which householders were told they could go to prison if they did not immediately pay an outstanding tax debt.

Action Fraud issued a warning about the scam, in which people are sometimes told to pay their tax with iTunes vouchers, in May 2016.

Neighbourhood PC Daniel Jones said: *"HMRC will never ask for payment in vouchers. If you get this sort of unexpected call end it immediately. If you are concerned about your tax status, contact HMRC directly using details from <http://www.gov.uk>, the phone book, or HMRC correspondence you know to be genuine.*

"Never phone an unexpected caller back on the number displayed when they call, or any number they give you. Always check the correct number for the organisation they claim to be from through an accredited source like the phone book."

If you believe you have been contacted by a fraudster, report it and receive a police crime reference number by calling Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 or using their online fraud reporting tool.

Police are treating these incidents seriously and I am keeping in contact with PC Jones for any progress.

POLICE are appealing to the public to be vigilant and to look out for vulnerable neighbours, relatives and

friends after several incidents whereby elderly people have been conned. In North Somerset some people have been approached by a stranger who has then managed to con them out of cash. One victim was approached and a man claimed to be Swiss, asked for directions. He handed the victim several cheap watches in exchange for cash for petrol, stating he only had Euros. The victim handed over £50 before realising it was a con.

Similarly, a second happened when the victim was approached by a man claiming to be Italian and asking for directions. He tried unsuccessfully to sell the victim some watches, then asked for money. The victim offered to give him a small amount and went to the cash point to make a withdrawal, at which point the suspect leaned over him and withdrew £250 and then left. The Constabulary has launched a new community safety campaign:

"Everything starts with hello" aimed at helping to reduce isolation, vulnerability and crime. Half of people over 75 live alone, and isolation and loneliness can increase vulnerability to crime. Older people particularly can be vulnerable to cons, fraud, distraction burglary and online/telephone scams. However, everyone can make a difference by just saying hello and keeping an eye on people in their local community.

More locally, Burglaries

There has been a rise in burglaries through the South Gloucester area lately, and it is possible that the offenders have been gathering information on their targets. The Police want to ask residents to report any suspect vehicles they feel are paying attention to homes in their area, by calling 101.

We would also like residents to send in any leaflets they have received that advertise garden and home

maintenance repairs and services. These may be used by rogue traders, who often charge exorbitant rates for poor quality and often unnecessary work. If you are able to provide the date and time these were posted, any descriptions of people and their vehicles, including registration numbers, this would also be useful. Please send these to the Neighbourhood Watch Administrator at Concorde House.

Burglars love this time of year. It's their busiest period. They love to go on tour spotting premises they can visit and help the residents 'de-clutter'. How can they spot likely targets? Perhaps it's those half-drawn curtains, the dimly lit room(s) after dark or the totally unlit home of the more frugal? I think they have a sixth sense! Whatever it is do not make it easy for them. NEW YEARS EVE!, Deep joy. Any police on duty will be concentrating on Operation Topic, Drink/Drug Drivers, and lots of empty properties full of pressies. Second-hand they may well be, but it's all profit. They care nothing for the resulting trauma of the householder.

Leaving packaging from those special (expensive) presents out for collection is an open invitation. The kid's new bikes left 'for just a short while'.

This is where the 'Good Neighbour' practice really has effect. There's nothing wrong with the odd twitch of the curtain. If something doesn't look right it probably isn't. Do something, if only noting the description of a suspect, vehicle number, or making yourself noticed. Prevention is better than nothing.

We have a good community NHW scheme, and it works by looking out for each other!

Cllr Sue Hope – report from South Gloucestershire Council

More Governance changes next year.

I have previously reported on the Combined Mayoral Authority – devolution - as well as the changes to the Electoral Boundaries – the ones represented by our MPs.

A review is also to be carried out by the Boundary Commission on the number of South Gloucestershire Councillors as well as the areas which they cover – i.e. the wards. There is also to be a change from the current Committee Structure to the Cabinet/Executive style of local government where all decisions are made by very few councillors.

I have attended a meeting regarding the Access to Health Services for those living in rural areas. The consultants looking at this, have now agreed to look at the rural aspect, rather than urban isolation! They are interested in the voluntary car schemes which operate in Badminton and Acton Turville and Hawkesbury, as well as greater use of Community Transport. A report will be published in order to bid for monies for an approved schemes.

You may have also heard of the STPs –

Sustainable Transformation Plans for our Health Services.

The one for our area – which covers South Gloucestershire/Bristol and North Somerset – has been published and has the theme of Prevention, Early Intervention and Self Care, as well as indicating closer working Health and Social Services, however the plans have to show efficiency savings and to date it is not clear how this will happen.

People living in rural areas sometimes find it difficult to get the support from social care services and this together with working across boundaries (ie. Wiltshire/Gloucestershire/South Gloucestershire) can cause further problems, and is something I have raised during the earlier consultation period, however please do get in touch with me if you are having problems accessing health and social care.

Planning - Policies, Sites and Places DPD.

The Inspector has been appointed to examine this part of the Planning Policy Document. Full details can be found on

Locally those places covered by the Local Green Space designation are:

- The Somerset Trust Monument Area
- The Recreation Field
- The Hawkesbury Upton Cricket and Tennis Club
- The Pound
- The Drovers Pool

Those areas put forward by the Parish Council but not agreed for Local Green Space Designation because of objections raised were:

- The Commons – objection received – and the area is over the 19 hectares recommended
- The Plain – this appears to be registered Highways
- The Allotments – objection received
- The Area opposite the Monument -

Hawkesbury and Inglestone Commons Officer

Season's Greetings from a soggy Common.

The Fresh Water Habitats Trust are holding a 'fairy shrimp' survey morning on 9th January meeting at Lower Woods carpark 10 – 12.30. This fascinating little creature is a real rarity and a gem of the commons, the morning will be spent surveying ponds and finding out how and where to find it. Spaces are limited and booking is essential via PCase@freshwaterhabitats.org.uk 07703 808520 for more information.

Short wet days and paper work seem to go together, we have to complete but a fraction of the paperwork farmers cope with ... but there is still plenty. In the last month this included renewing our

Environment Agency Waste exemption licences for 'disposing of waste' which regulates bonfires, registering our Felling Licence exemption with the Forestry Commission, obtaining consent from Natural England for works on Inglestone Common as a Site of Special Scientific Interest and submitting claims to Natural England for grants. Of more interest has been research into timings to control the large tussock forming tufted-hair grass, a natural part of the commons. It is unpalatable to stock, outcompetes wildflowers and gives parts of the commons their distinctive rough grassland appearance. A search on Royal Botanic Garden, Kew's website gives ecological

information and says it was once used to roof one of the oldest thatched cottages in England. Reading on, the cottage is in Horton and dates back to 1460! It was saved from demolition in the 1960s by a member of Gloucestershire Council and it was during renovation that samples of the old thatch were sent to Kew for identification. The sample of grass is still stored at Kew in their Herbarium along with a cutting from a local paper showing a picture of the cottage being renovated. Tufted-hair grass seems to have been a very long term resident of the commons!

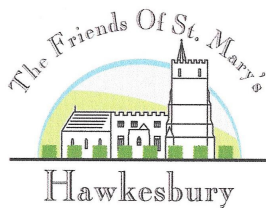

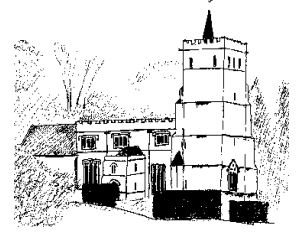

January 2017 Letter from the Vicar

Dear Friends,

May I begin by wishing you a very Happy Epiphany and New Year. January 6th is the day on which many churches in the East celebrate the birth of Christ, with presents and celebration. It is the Epiphany, the day when the arrival of the three wise men at the stable is celebrated.

In modern culture, we have a tendency to truncate the story of the birth of Christ and put the Annunciation, the story of the birth in the stable, the arrival of the wise men and the flight into Egypt all into one event. Not unlike our jam packing the meal and the presents into one day, unlike our European neighbours who open presents one day and eat the next!

The church has separated out these elements in its traditional form. March 25th is the Annunciation, 28th Dec the flight into Egypt, and Jan 6th (the Epiphany) the arrival of the wise men. And those who have used a Rosary traditionally might remember that meditation on the five joyful mysteries includes: The annunciation, the visit of the Virgin Mary to her cousin Elizabeth, the birth of Our Lord, the Presentation of the child in the temple and the child at the age of 12 in the Temple.

All these elements of the Nativity story are rich with spiritual insights, and worth thinking about and pondering on. I encourage you to drink deeply of the rich tradition we have inherited.
