At time of going to press, the *British Paralympic Association* announced the selection of the fourteen members of the British 7-a-side squad for Rio 2016.

We are delighted to reveal that Hawkesbury's very own James Blackwell was formally announced in the Team GB squad for the Rio 2016 Paralympic Games and will be representing Great Britain in September.

30-year-old James, who grew up in Hawkesbury Upton and has played for Gloucestershire County League side Kingswood, made his international debut for England against USA and helped them finish fifth at the CPISRA European Championships in Portugal. The Great Britain team secured qualification for Rio last year by finishing fifth at the 2015

James has been part of the 7-a-side England Cerebral Palsy football squad and has been focused on being selected for Rio 2016. Unfortunately, whilst playing football for Kingswood last August, James broke his neck and this suddenly seemed an impossibility.

Following months of support from his wife Holly and all the family, along with amazing backing from the England physio and medical team, James has worked his way back to fitness, always with the aim of being able to compete at the Rio 2016 Paralympics.

We wish James and the entire

squad good luck and we will be watching with interest! Look out for details of match dates nearer the time in September.

Our appeal for pledges reached just over £140,000 at the end of May. At the time of writing we have just over £161,000 in the bank from 275 shareholders, with around 20 pledges still to be realised.

So we say a happy farewell to the 'Save Our Shop' campaign and our attention turns to making Hawkesbury Stores a success. It won't be plain sailing, there is a lot of hard work to do and we really need your support and custom. However, we are grateful that Annie, Kath and Kate are helping us enormously to ensure the smoothest possible transition so hopefully we'll have hit the ground walking, at least, on our first day's trading! We would also like to thank Bob and Sheila Booth; former Hawkesbury residents and the property vendors. Bob and Sheila successfully ran the shop for many years, setting a benchmark for all those that have followed, and they have shown great willingness to work with us throughout this process, which has been much appreciated. One of the things that will set us apart from previous shops in the village, is that part of our success will rely on having a large, friendly and diverse team of volunteers to help run it (alongside Kath and Kate). Right now we don't have nearly enough people, so if you have a few hours to spare

each week or fortnight please do volunteer. It should be a fun and sociable experience for everyone, so pop in and put your name down if you'd like to help out. Finally, the official launch of Hawkesbury Stores is pencilled for the morning of Saturday 23 July. Look out for more details and please do come along to celebrate this exciting new village enterprise!




Fiona Writes...

Meetings are held at 8pm on the 4th Monday of the month in the Methodist Hall in Back Street.

We recently hosted **Michael Smith** who gave an entertaining talk about **'Caring for your houseplants'**. He reminded us that houseplants were originally wild-flowers and are well adapted to being treated rough. Indeed the most common cause of failure when keeping houseplants is over-watering because wild-flowers are used to taking in water only when it becomes available. So, keep 'em dry and treat 'em rough and then they will thrive and flower well.

A good reason to keep house plants is that the air in our homes is full of invisible, potentially harmful, particles that are left behind from fabric treatment, cleaning materials and many 21st century devices. House plants can remove these and replace them with oxygen. Michael provided a list of some of the best plants to keep for this purpose. These include English Ivy – Hedera helix, Peace Lily – Spathiphyllum species and Boston Fern – Nephrolepsis exalta 'Bostoniensis'. In May we had **Tim Hancock** from **Tortworth Plant Centre** over to tell us about **Herbaceous Perennials**. He brought along a lot of common, and unusual, plants to sell and was not disappointed by the response. He didn't take a lot of them home.

Instead of a meeting in June we went for an evening trip to Hook House Garden & Pottery near Tetbury.

On Sunday evening **24th July** we are going to **Dewstowe House** near Chepstow.

You do not need to be a gardener to attend our meetings and there are advantages to becoming a member, such as discounted seeds and coach trips. If you are not a member and would like to hear a speaker that takes your fancy then come along as a guest – entry £3.00.



Watering plants in the garden and greenhouse


Whilst the reasons, for watering are many and varied, it's worth bearing in mind a few rights and wrongs about how to do the job properly. Plants need water at their roots in the main and if one considers that it takes one inch of water to penetrate average soil to a depth of 9 inches care needs to be taken to achieve this. In most cases, established plants growing outside, have roots which will travel downwards and search out the water they need, without our help except in times of drought. If it is decided, that apart from watering in new plants, the garden needs a soaking, much more can be achieved if plants are given a good drench say once weekly than a cursory wetting with the hose-pipe on a regular basis. After using the hosepipe the garden can look fresh and healthy, but this can be totally superficial, and one usually has no idea how much water has gone into the soil. If this happens on a regular basis, the roots of plants can start to move towards the surface looking for water and can dry out, so that nothing is achieved. It's maybe a good idea to put the hose-pipe away and give plants a good soaking with the watering-can. As previously mentioned, in normal circumstances there should be little need to water established plants in the garden, but pots and containers are an entirely different matter.

Watering container plants

Container plants have the same needs as plants in the garden, but the only source of water they have in a dry spell, is that which the gardener supplies. The same principles apply in terms of water depth but often it is difficult to know just how far down in the compost the water has penetrated. If a pot is picked up, the weight is often enough to indicate whether water is required and if the hand is pushed as far down in the compost as possible, the feel of the compost will be a fair indicator of the plant's needs. It is also possible to buy a meter for a few pounds which will indicate perfectly whether water is needed or not.

Greenhouse watering

In the greenhouse, the gardener is the only supplier of water and good habits are essential. The same principles apply as for container gardening, but timing becomes a bit more important. Most plants do not enjoy having roots standing in water for too long, hence early morning becomes a good time for the job. This also will prevent potential damage to the plants from water being over-heated on leaves and stems from the sun which can cause scalding. Because of work commitments and other needs, this is not possible for everyone, so early evening, before dark, whilst plants are still active should suffice. Whenever the job is





and amounts of water can only be ascertained with outside conditions and heat in the greenhouse kept in mind. One problem which directly relates to watering irregularity, is blossom end rot on tomatoes. This shows as a brown "corky" deposit on the flower end of the fruits which makes them inedible and is in fact caused by a calcium deficit due to uneven watering. While the task can seem daunting for the newcomer, it is something which everyone can get used to eventually. A coat of white greenhouse protection painted on the roof of the greenhouse will prevent much of the scorching of the greenhouse plants during the hotter months and is a good investment. It is worth bearing in mind that every time a plant is watered, so much of the nutrients which the plants get from the compost, can be washed out of pots. These need to be replaced also with a general feed occasionally, in accordance with manufacturer's instructions. This fact needs to be born in mind after prolonged heavy rain on pots outside, when a light feed of general fertilizer such as Phostrogen will be beneficial. I trust the summer will be hot enough for the information to have some value.

Hundreds have gone though before so why does it pick me to set alarm bells ringing?



Hawkesbury and Inglestone Commons Officer

After years of decline, the last month has seen a turnaround in the fortunes of Inglestones rare adder's-tongue spearwort. Around 80 plants raised from Inglestone seed by Kew and grown on by Bristol Zoo Gardens, were planted out in late May. A further 2 plantings are planned in June to coincide with the plants coming into flower, the idea is to maximise seed set and drop on the common to provide the next generation of plants. The plants have been reintroduced into newly cleared areas adjacent to the Lower Woods drive and in Green Trench in conditions ranging from muddy to underwater. As water levels drop and mud dries out, seed should get trampled into the mud by mooching cattle. Monitoring will help

to determine what combination of planting time and muddiness is most successful. Time will tell! There is more information on the BBC news website – search 'buttercup'.

Please come and find out more information at a 'buttercup walk' on Tuesday 12th July 6.30 – 8.30 pm at Lower Woods car park. No need to book, but good boots essential!

Local volunteers have been checking the ponds on and adjacent to the commons for the presence of great crested newts which use ponds for breeding. We already know there is a resident population, but how have they been affected by the scrub clearance? I'm pleased to say they have been found in all of the ponds surveyed. Many thanks to the volunteers for this valuable information.

We hope to collect wildflower seed again, this year from Yarley Meadow SSSI adjacent to Inglestone Common to spread onto less flowery grassland. We anticipate there may be a surplus. If you would be interested in any seed for a wildflower patch in your garden then please do get in touch.

(Doctors, Surgery, Clinic, Hospital, Dentist, Hearing Centre, Opticians, Physio etc.)

Are you finding it difficult to get to your appointment on time due to transport problems?

If the answer is **YES**, **YES**, **YES**, Then maybe **HVT** can help.

To find out, contact

The Coordinator on 0797 206 5665

Leave a message on the answerphone

(the telephone is not switched on all of the time)

Leave your NAME and TELEPHONE NUMBER,

the DAY, the DATE and the TIME of your appointment, and

WHERE you wish to be taken.

The COORDINATOR will return your call as soon as possible, but this may be some hours later.

If you are new to the HVT service, the Coordinator will ask you if you have a **Diamond Card**, and if so, will require the information of the last **8 DIGITS** and **EXPIRY DATE** on the card.

A **Diamond Card** will enable you to travel the first 25 miles of any journey with **no charge**. Any mileage above 25 will need to be paid for at **40 pence per mile**, as well as any **parking fees**.

You do **NOT** need a Diamond Card to use the HVT Service, but you will be liable for the complete mileage of any journey at 40 pence per mile plus any parking charge.

You will also be asked whether or not you have a Blue Badge and whether you have difficulties getting in and out of a car. If you do and, depending on the circumstances, you may be asked to take a companion with you to help, as at many locations the **DRIVER** cannot leave the vehicle. The **DRIVER** is **NOT** trained or insured to do any form of lifting. Take your Blue Badge with you whenever you travel.

HVT will always endeavour to provide transport, but it cannot be guaranteed. Please give as much notice as possible, and preferably not less than 3 days.

When you receive a new or replacement Diamond Card, please give the information of the **last 8 digits** and the **expiry date** to the Coordinator. If your diamond card is out of date you are liable for the full cost of any journey.

Finally, HVT is NOT a taxi service, it is a Social Car Scheme operated by volunteers. Please treat the volunteers with respect

LETTER FROM BOB KAVANAGH

who recently contacted the Hawkesbury Writers to arrange to collect copies of all the Monument books.

Thank you ever so much for getting the books together and ready for me to collect on Tuesday, it was very kind of you. I've skimmed through them and look forward to reading them thoroughly, as soon as possible.

It's a great idea to have an historic record of everyday folk and the things that made their lives tick, especially when you are familiar with the names, faces and events, So a big thanks to you and your fellow writers.

I was born in "The Big House" in the 50's and then lived next door to the Underwood family at Petty France (now the Bodkin House Hotel).

Although we moved away from the area when I was still young, we spent every summer holiday in the village, the Black and White coach would drop us off at Dunkirk where we would get collected by Sonny Coombes.

Days were mostly "playing down the coombes" which always included making bows and arrows, walking miles and drinking from springs. There were also hours spent loitering on the plain, waiting for the first sight of the fair arriving ready for Hawkesbury Show. We had an extended Christmas holiday in 1963 when the snow came in a big way, and although photo's and film footage always highlights the roads being cleared, my memory recalls the men folk all working together to gain access to the rather basic toilet at the bottom of the garden.

Fond memories include climbing the monument at every opportunity, making scarecrows for the show, listening to Ernie Paynes singing in The Fox and lugging endless buckets of water from the stand tap on the plain.

Life in the village at that time seemed pretty basic, running water was a luxury!, but it seemed odd to me that we were sometimes accused of being a bit posh by some of the local kids, We actually lived on a council estate in the midlands with lino on the floor and no car, yet when you looked at the clothes we wore there was a subtle difference and the village did look very tired in those days, unlike todays estate agents dream.

Thanks again for helping with the books, I'm sure I will look at them often.

South Gloucestershire Councillor's Report

Devolution

By the time the magazine is published the Council will have voted, most likely, to go forward with the Devolution Deal with the Government. Even at this late stage many of the details are still to be finalised. The government is promising £900m over 30 years between the three authorities (Bristol/BaNES/SGC). North Somerset has pulled out.

A newly elected metro-mayor is part of the deal -this deal gives the Mayor a great deal of power over planning, transportation, highways and housing; they will work - cabinet style - with the leaders of the three councils. The Mayor will have the power to raise money on the business rate as well as through the Council Tax. The money will be for infrastructure, mainly transportation; Adult higher education has already been devolved. On briefings received so far, it would appear the rural areas will be getting a rough deal, having to compete with the urban and growth areas for any funding.

PLANNING

The Council meeting on the 29th June will also have discussed the Local Plan. This includes adopting many planning polices already in place. Most contentious is the Local Green Spaces, many Council owned pieces of land have not been included in this designation, including The Plain, The Pound and the allotments, nor does it include the Commons; objections have been received to including them as Green Space. Check out the papers on www.southglos.gov.uk

Included in the published papers is the Full Call for Sites list – there are seven sites around Hawkesbury Upton which have been identified.

Further consultation will take place in September on Housing sites as part of the Joint Strategic Plan

The Total Transport Fund – which is funding a project to find the gaps in access to health services – the interim report is now available, sad to see rural volunteer car schemes only included latterly.

SGC has received £15,000 to promote cycling, **Bikeability Recycled**, training in South Gloucestershire,(pleased to say Hawkesbury School is involved). will now include:

- Learn to ride basic cycling skills and road safety
- Balance cycle training for reception class pupils
- Ride community rides to local facilities such as libraries etc
- Transition accompanied rides from

primary school to pupils' new secondary schools

Fix – basic maintenance such as

puncture repairs etc taught by mechanics

 Promotion – opportunity to try training outside of the Bikeability structure, such as at parents' evenings where parents can ask trainers any questions directly.

Health – the Scrutiny Committee at its last meeting looked at the performance of all the local health trusts, and how they deal with complaints, which is not very effective. The Ambulance Trust response times for South

Gloucestershire are very poor and under target. The Health Scrutiny Committee is also looking at End of Life Care. If anyone would like to get in touch with me regarding this matter, please do so.

There is currently wider consultation on support for dementia sufferers and their corers.

Good to see Network Rail holding a further drop in (this one at Old Sodbury) regarding the electrification of the line. This gave neighbors the opportunity to raise matters of concern with their officers. The impact of the gantries has been raised in the Chilterns and North Sussex Downs AONBS and a panel has been set up to look at the design of the gantries used in the AONBs.



Letter from the Vicar - July 2016

Dear Friends,

This month I would like to continue on my round of telling you about our churches, and it is time to tell you of a very precious jewel of a church in our Benefice St. Mary's, Boxwell.

This is a 13th century parish church, with a 14th century north aisle. This extra aisle in which the organ (and only heater) is situated, gives the little church a feeling of spaciousness.

The Royal arms painted over the chancel arch are very splendid and well worth seeing. They are the arms of William III after the death of Mary, but the initials and date have been overpainted to read 'A.R. 1702'. I am not quite sure why these arms are here, but I am sure a member of the Huntley family could tell us.

The chancel, which was rebuilt in the 20th century, has a timber panelled ceiling, but the chancel rail is much older, early 17th century.

The font has a fabulous pedigree and in the west end of the nave is a marble memorial to Rev. RICHARD HUNTLEY, MA, died 1831, by Cook of Gloucester. It has an obelisk ground and shrouded urn. There are many other memorials to enjoy and wonder over. The church stands in a very secluded position adjacent to Boxwell Court. These are private grounds, so best to either come to a service to see the church or to ring the Huntley family.

It is a lovely little church and we hold services there on the 5th Sundays of the month in decent weather (next one on July 31st at 9.30 BCP HC). Evening prayer is said there on most Tuesdays at 4.30pm. Best to check first.

Latest Phishing Scam

A new phishing campaign which has hit students of UK universities claims that the student has been awarded an educational grant by the Department for Education. The email purports to have come from the finance department of the student's university and tricks the recipient into clicking on a link contained in the message to provide personal and banking details.

One victim reported that after submitting their sensitive information (including name, address, date of birth, contact details, telephone provider, bank account details, student ID, National Insurance Number, driving licence number and mother's maiden name), they were taken to a spoofed website which appeared like a genuine website of their bank, where they were asked to type in their online banking login credentials.

Protect Yourself:

- Do not click on any links or open attachments contained within unsolicited emails.
- Do not reply to scam emails or contact the senders in any way.
- If an email appears to have come from a person or organisation you know of but the message is unexpected or unusual, contact them directly via another method to confirm that they sent you the email.
- If you receive an email which asks you to login to an online account via a link provided in the email, instead of clicking on the link, open your browser and go directly to the company's website yourself.
- If you have clicked on a link in the email, do not supply any information on the website that may open.

If you think you may have compromised the safety of your bank details and/or have lost money due to fraudulent misuse of your cards, you should immediately contact your bank, and report it to Action Fraud by calling 0300 123 2040, or visiting www.actionfraud.police.uk.


