#### France Lane's Big Lunch

The Big Lunch was started in 2009 by the Eden Project. The aim is to get neighbours together for lunch on the first Sunday of June in a simple act of community, friendship and fun. They say that 3.65 million people took part in 2013. This year around 50 'France Laners' joined their numbers.

The idea was conceived by Joan Yuill - any excuse for a party! The troops were mobilised to get France Lane's layby converted into the perfect (?!) picnic spot, with bunting, banners and balloons. All afternoon neighbours

from 19 households ate, drank, chatted and laughed in the glorious - and rather unexpected - sunshine. Several passing drivers even joined in the fun with a sociable toot.

A map of the UK did the rounds so we could discover where our neighbours hailed from. A good proportion are locally born and bred, but of those from afar, our most easterly resident (from Sidcup) lives with our most northerly (from Bannockburn). Our most westerly residents are also from Scotland





Crime Reduction Advice:-

- Park vehicles in such a manner to make "cats" as inaccessible as possible.
- Consider signage to emphasise preventative measures have been taken.
- Etching and "Cat"clamps are available, visit www.securedbydesign.com for further information.
- If observing suspicious vehicles particularly during the night within villages, please call the Police on the 101 number.

#### Key messages regarding fraud:-

- Make your passwords stronger use numbers, symbols, upper and lower case letters.
- Never give out any personal information unless you are certain you can trust the person contacting you.
- If an offer seems too good to be true, it probably is.
- Banks and financial institutions will not send you an email asking you to click on a link and confirm your bank details.
- Your bank would never contact you to ask you for your PIN, password or other security information in full. Similarly, they would never send a so-called 'courier' to collect bank cards or money
- Anti-virus protects your computer make sure it's upto-date.
- Make sure your computer has a firewall installed.
- Software updates keep your computer safe install them as soon as you get a reminder.
- Emails can contain viruses only open them if you know who they're from.
- Computer firms do not make unsolicited phone calls to help you fix your computer.
- Shred receipts with your card details on and correspondence with your name and address on.

In fact, why live here at all, in a beautiful area, with an amazing community and great facilities? You might as well live in an anonymous flat, in a grey town, where you never meet your neighbours. Get out and about in the village and you meet people generations backgrounds. You find out what is going on in the place where you live and you haven't had to battle your way around Yate, or sit wondering how slow the broadband speed is today. On a short walk, you can pick up a newspaper (or copy of the Parish News!) and some groceries & local produce, withdraw cash, buy a gift and send off your parcels, pick up the Sunday roast and meat for the barbecue and get your hair cut!

How many of you have met lifelong friends in either pub over the years, whilst chatting at the bar? And think, how many of you have arrived home after a long journey, tired & hungry and been able to pick up a take-away from either pub?

Take all of that away and we're just another cluster of houses on a hilltop.

Not only that, the moment a village loses its amenities, its properties start to lose their value as it's a less appealing place to live.

So appreciate what we have in this village and even though you may not be able to get everything here, at least take the time to use the amenities we have at least once a week.

So use what we have on our doorstep — you'll miss them when they're gone.



Hawkesbury Local History Society – Snippets from the Archives



## What's in a name??? Part 1

Browsing through more than 100 wills written by Hawkesbury folk from c.1544-1600 it was a surprise, and a delightful insight, to come across several instances of named cattle bequeathed to family members.

William Styffe had two daughters, Johanne (Joan) and Annes (Annys was quite a popular girls' name). In October 1544 he gave Johanne "ii kyne, one called misse, the other called youthe", whereas Annes was to have two red-coloured cows "one called fylpale & the other called pet".

Even an oxe was named in Joan Holborowe's will of May 1571: her son Christopher

was bequeathed "one oxe called whytthorne" and her son Henry was given "a cowe called gentle". Towards the end of the century, in April 1596, John White wished his son Edward to have what we assume was a pale-brownish coloured animal "my fallowe cowe called cheerie" and his daughter Margaret "three kine that is to say by name, Burnett, Starlet & Nutte". He failed to name his "blacke heifer of two yeres olde" or his "baye mare" - both bequeathed to Edward. [NB not only was spelling irregular, but also the use of capital letters. It all adds to the charm of reading these old documents!]

#### The Leslie Wicks Memorial Cup – for Best Begonia in Show (Class 326)

In the Show schedule this year, the Trophy Profile gives a brief background to the Leslie Wicks Memorial Cup. Due to space restrictions in the schedule, only a short summary could be included, but this is the full account as provided by his wife, Blanche, giving a bit more detail about Leslie Wicks and his dedication to growing begonias.

Leslie Harry Wicks was born in Old Sodbury on 14<sup>th</sup> November 1923. Aged 19, he was called into the Army (3<sup>rd</sup> Carabiniers) and when demobbed in 1947, returned to Old Sodbury.

Leslie married on 18<sup>th</sup> September 1950 and moved to the end cottage at Petty France and so started his love of vegetables and begonias. The previous tenants of the cottage were both in their 80s and so there was plenty to do to get his hand in. He purchased a greenhouse and two dozen begonia corms – his hobby. He was so pleased with the first entry at Hawkesbury Show, he continued until 1993, when through illness, he was unable to carry on.

He died on 2<sup>nd</sup> April 1994, and left four greenhouses and over 100 begonias in bloom.

#### **District Councillor's Report**

## Superfast Broadband – or lack of it!

As reported last month – it appears that the Parish of Hawkesbury will not be included in the upgrade to superfast broadband.

There are three exchanges which serve the parish, Wickwar, Sodbury and Didmarton and none will provide the superfast broadband to the parish., However Wickwar village is on the list to receive the upgrade. I have had a meeting with our local MP and council officers as well as local business people to investigate ways forward.

The 90% target for roll out in our area, which was agreed with the Council has been met by BT. This is very frustrating for many of us who have been lobbying for improved IT services in rural areas for many years. South Gloucestershire Council put £2m into the pot, which was supposed to be matched £ for £ by the Government – they have only put in £700,000.

There is a second round of government funding coming up, and we will be lobbying hard for our area to be included. I have been working with Steve Webb MP, to investigate other avenues of accessing Superfast Broadband; one of these is through the IT upgrade which local

schools are about to get. I also understand a local company has lots of innovative ways to improve IT services.

#### **Road Closure Chase Lane**

Important repair works to Chase Lane will be taking place in the summer. The road will be closed for at least two weeks form the 18<sup>th</sup> August. Detour signs will be in place.

The Defibrillator casing will be fitted shortly on the Village Hall. Thanks to generous grants and fund raising over £600 has been raised. The parish council have agreed to cover the balance of these costs. It is hoped further training and information sessions will be held.

Since the waste bin charge has been introduced, there has been an increased use of the Hawkesbury Upton Green Composting Site. A meeting with Hawkesbury Upton Recycling Group (HURG), who manage the site, and Council officers has been held to discuss the future of community composting sites, the Council explained that budget savings of £2.7 million have to be made. A cheaper option is being investigated, and a consultation will shortly be published on the future of the sites, otherwise

the well used site will close in 2015. An Open Meeting is being planned to discuss the way forward.


