As this magazine drops through letterboxes around the parish, we'll be just a few weeks away from the closure of Hawkesbury Shop as we know it. Annie and her team have worked incredibly hard to serve the parish for many years, and we thank them for their sterling efforts and for providing the friendly service we've all come to expect. Last month in the parish news we reported the results of the parish survey and launched an urgent appeal for more pledges to save our shop and secure a vital asset and community focal point in Hawkesbury.

The response from the parish was immediate and significant, and about £40,000 worth of new pledges and uplifts arrived in just 10 days!

Due to this level of response - and having sought agreement at a meeting of the Working Group - on 5 May we made an offer on the shop property, which was accepted! This was a significant milestone in the project, so huge thanks to everyone that has pledged their support to make it possible.

Turning pledges into pounds

At the time of writing we've reached

around £140,000 in pledges and our next task is to convert these into finance. By the time you read this all pledgers will have received a pack of information and a request to make your contribution. There are a number of pledges that, for one reason or another, we don't have contact details for. Reaching our target

We have calculated that the minimum finance we need to open Hawkesbury Community Shop is £160,000, so our appeal for new and increased pledges continues. If you need more information about our plans in order to make a pledge, please pop into the shop where you'll find a summary of our approach and aims for the business, as well as the 30% tax relief we believe investors will be eligible for (dependent on your personal tax status).

Practical plans

In parallel to raising funds, we are of course also working hard on the practical plans for stocking, presenting and staffing Hawkesbury Community

Shop. We intend to run the shop with a mix of paid and volunteer staff. More than 70 wonderful survey respondents offered their time to volunteer in the shop, and we will also need people with a diverse range of skills to help in other roles, such as volunteer coordination and book-keeping.

Budget and time constraints mean we cannot immediately make all the changes to the look and layout of the shop that we'd like. However we intend to start day one with modest improvements to the exterior and interior, full shelves and an extended range of stock. We plan to sustain the additional services that the shop currently offers (prescription collection and dry-cleaning) and gradually add other useful services such as parcel collection. In the medium- to long-term we hope to introduce a tea room, if it's feasible within the space.

Our vision

Our vision for Hawkesbury Community Shop is that it will be a friendly focal point for the parish, and a store that villagers love to use. It will stock everyday essentials alongside high-quality, local and fresh produce, and offer additional services that local people want. Finally, look out for plans for the launch of your community shop!

Those things in the garden sent to wreck our plans

Now that the growing season is in full swing, it is perhaps time to look at some of the pests and diseases which are determined to spoil the party and what we may do about them. Whilst this is in no way a complete list, the pests and diseases which follow will always abound in the local area.

Carrot fly.

A bit of a mis-nomer as this insect can only hop. It lays its eggs on the surface near a carrot row and as they hatch, the resulting grubs tunnel down and into the carrot crop. They are not of olympic standard however and can only manage a height of about 45 cms. So, if a screen of this height can be placed around the row this should be enough to stop them. If a spray can be made from mash-ed up garlic this will also act as a deterrent if used every couple of weeks and if the crop can be grown in a trough or pots higher than 45 cms. The problem should not arise.

Cabbage white butterfly.



Whilst they look very pretty dancing around the crops on a summers day, the caterpillars of these butterflies can easily wreck a crop in very quick time if left untended. The only way to stop these insects either for standard or organic gardeners alike, is to stop them getting at the crop. Ordinary garden netting will not provide a barrier for brassica crops so the correct butterfly netting must be sought out. It is available on line in the size required and is reasonably priced. If you are to use this product ensure the netting is well pegged down at the bottom and clear of the plants at the top or the butterflies will lay their eggs through the net. It must be emphasised that cabbage whites are

very determined and will find a gap if there is one. Cabbage root fly is also a problem for brassicas but can be kept at bay by placing collars around the stem of the new plants. This stops the grubs of the fly getting at the plants.

Greenhouse white fly.

Whitefly are easy to spot and can wreak havoc in a greenhouse. They excrete a sticky substance called honeydew which causes mould to form on many of the plants growing inside and can be tackled in a variety of ways. The method many people use is to place those sticky yellow strips at various spots in the greenhouse which are effective but due to the reproductive rate of the fly only partially so. If the greenhouse is large and the problem bad a parasitic wasp can be bought which will clear the problem These are called encarsia and are used frequently in commercial situations. I may have been fortunate but I was told many years ago that a couple of pots of marigolds placed in the greenhouse near the doors would exude enough odour to keep them out and so it has proved.

Potato blight

Whilst it does not appear every year, once blight strikes you have little time to save a crop. The difficulty with blight is that once it takes hold there is little time to do anything about it and the infection will work through a crop in only 2 or 3 days. Symptoms are brown freckles on the potato foliage or brown patches with a yellowish border spreading from the patch. The stems go soft and will collapse, and the blight will go into the soil and infect the tuber. Whilst I am aware of the reluctance of some growers to spray, the best advice is to anticipate the problem and spray the crop from mid-June about 4 or 5 times every 10 days or so with a fungicide such as Dithane 945, which is now available again on line. I am informed that the organic alternative is Copper sulphate, but would give no guarantee as to it's effectiveness. One way to avoid the problem altogether is to use potato varieties which are a bit more slugresistant, and the "Sarpo" range are supposed to fit the bill.

Keel slugs (Small black slugs which attack potatoes.)

We are all aware of the damage which snails and slugs can do and we all have our own ways of dealing with them, but with keel slugs the problem is somewhat different as they live underground and are hard to get at. I have heard that they are likely to surface in warm moist conditions and a few slug pellets scattered between potato rows can be effective and can stop the attack on the crop. The best advice , however, is to lift potatoes as soon as they are ready and not leave them in the ground to be eaten by slugs.

General spraying



I am aware that different views on the use of insecticides are held but if you do use them, do it without harming other living things, as those chemicals are non-selective in their effect. When spraying do it either as late or as early as you can to avoid spraying bees doing their pollinating. To make the spraying more effective and therefore not having to be done more than necessary add one teaspoon per litre of washing-up liquid to the spray mix which prevents the spray being washed off by any subsequent rain. **Brian Noble**

Hawkesbury and Inglestone **Commons Officer**

The last month has seen the seasons flying forward and by the time you are reading this we are expecting cattle to be out on the commons enjoying the spring grass.

Paperwork has included submitting a plan to the animal health office showing how bovine TB risks are managed. This is both through the good management of the graziers and by upgrading water troughs - if you ever wondered why the new troughs are so tall, it's to help reduce the chance of badgers drinking from them. As a result, graziers are exempt from testing cattle on the common with all the practical difficulties that would involve.

I've been submitting our annual claim to Natural England for their grant, demonstrating we continue to have management control of the commons. This has involved meetings in the last month with NE, the owners – Badminton Estate and Stroud District Council. I have also met residents and am grateful for them raising issues, including a wind damaged willow on Inglestone Common. This has been assessed by our tree officer, it will be coppiced and allowed to regrow.

We are currently planning for the planting out of Inglestone's rare buttercup raised from seed by Kew. This will happen late May / early June depending on conditions. Kew suffers the same difficulties as other gardeners, they report a rodent has been in munching on a few flower heads! We hope to be able to invite you on a walk to look at the project later in the summer.

South Gloucestershire Councillor's Report

CONSULTATION ON COMMUNITY GRANTS

The Area Forum which has been responsible for allocating Community Grants and Hones Bonus Grants has been abandoned. In the past many village organisations have been successful in attracting funding, including Hawkesbury Stallions, Drama Group, Youth Club, HU5K and the Village Hall. A consultation document is currently out suggesting that each ward councillor have £3500 for allocating to groups registered with SGC. If you would like to comment on this document -please do so www.southglos.gov.uk/consultations you have until July 15th.

PROGRESS WITH PLANNING

Planning Policy Development – Local Green Space- Many people responded to the Call for Sites and the Policy Sites and Places document. It is understood the main part of the Local Plan is to go to committee at the end of June, however the housing allocation under the PSP will be out for consultation with the Joint Strategic Plan in autumn,

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Buses – there has been consultation on the local Bus Service, but to date no news on any changes.

It was disappointing to learn that there had been no consultation with local providers (eg Hawkesbury Volunteer Transport) regarding a Government funded investigation into rural health transport needs. Thankfully this has now been done and mid-term report is expected soon.

20mph SPEED LIMIT

There was extensive consultation on then 20mph around the school, which included most roads in the village. The final results are expected shortly, and is currently being progressed with the Legal Department at SGC.

Devolution and a Metro Mayor for the West of England

A deal has been negotiated with the Government for greater devolution for the wider West of England area. As yet the councillors from the four local authorities (South Gloucestershire/ Bristol/Bath &NE Somerset/North Somerset) have to agree. The deal, worth about £900m over 30 years, negotiated with Government would devolve agreed funding and additional powers to the region, including decisions about transport, investment, funding, skills training, business support, housing and strategic planning. The Government's deal is conditional on the election of a West of England Mayor. Sadly Councillors will be making the decision at the end of June before the public are asked their views during July and August.

The NT welcomed over 100 local residents to an open evening in April to share their plans for the property. Having secured just over £2m of funding the plan is to repair and refurbish the house - it will need complete re-servicing, new kitchens and bathrooms. Everything will be designed to ensure we don't lose Horton's unique spirit of place but that we also make sure that it is fit for modern living as we plan to re-let the house as soon as the work is complete - which we hope will be early in 2018.

Horton Court - National Trust

Alongside this we will be re-opening the Norman Hall, Loggia and the gardens to visitors in 2018. Access will be on a couple of afternoons a week as before in the spring and summer.

During the project there will be some open days and events (yet to be confirmed) for specialist groups and other interested parties and we will keep you informed as these are put in the diary.

Richard Evans the Head Ranger will be co-ordinating a garden day during the

early summer with those of you who have offered to lend a hand getting the garden into shape. If you are interested in this more details will follow shortly.

Recently there were 6 requests for transport on one particular day.





Barbecue Marinades

As the barbecue season is in progress, here are a few simple marinades. Forget the shop-bought varieties with their endless additives and flavourings.

You should be able to knock these up from simple store cupboard and fridge ingredients. I'm sure we all have a part jar of marmalade at the back of the cupboard, along with a few spices and a lemon in the fridge.

Sweet Mustard Marinade

Makes enough to coat 750g (1¹/₂lb) Ingredients:

60g (2oz) marmalade 1 tblsp Dijon mustard

- 30g (1oz) honey
- 1 tblsp brown sugar
- 1 tblsp cider vinegar
- 1 tblsp rape seed/sunflower oil

Combine the ingredients in a bowl. Put the chicken, prawns or lamb chops, etc. into a freezer bag, pour in the marinade and coat well. Chill in the fridge until ready to cook.

Basic Wine Marinade

Makes enough for 1kg (2lb) meat, poultry or fish **Ingredients**:

- 4 tblsp olive oil
- 4tblsp red or white wine
- 2 shallots (or 1 small onion) finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, finely chopped (optional)
- 1 tblsp chopped fresh herbs
- salt & black pepper

Combine the ingredients in a bowl. Put the meat fish of choice in a freezer bag and pour in the marinade. Coat & leave to marinate in the fridge.

Piquant Spanish-style Marinade

Makes enough for 1kg (2lb) meat, poultry <u>Ingredients:</u>

- 5 tblsp chopped fresh parsley
- 4 tblsp olive oil
- 2tblsp finely chopped red onion
- 1 tblsp cider vinegar
- 1 tblsp smoked paprika
- 2 tsp ground cumin
- 1 finely chopped garlic clove
- 1/4 tsp ground cayenne pepper pinch of salt

Combine the ingredients in a bowl. Put the meat into a freezer bag, pour in the marinade and coat well. Chill until ready to cook.

Barbecue Marinade

Makes enough for about 12 chicken joints

- 2 tblsp clear honey 3cm/1¼in piece of fresh ginger, peeled and grated
- 1 garlic clove, crushed
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ tsp Chinese five spice
- 2 tsp soy sauce
- 3 tblsp orange marmalade
- ¹/₂ tsp grated orange zest (optional)
- 1 tblsp sunflower/rapeseed oil

Combine the ingredients in a bowl. Put the meat into a freezer bag, pour in the marinade and coat well. Chill until ready to


from time to time I wish Eric all success.

Reading also becomes a problem as does driving and even recognising people's faces. The condition is quite common with 10% of the population over 65 believed to have it to varying degrees. It is thought to be the commonest cause of vision loss in the UK.

The Support Group will give people the opportunity to share experiences and to pass on hints and tips. Meetings will sometimes feature guest speakers talking on a variety of subjects concerned with Macular Conditions and its impact on our daily lives.

Rotarian and retired GP Doctor Tony Sarafian commented, "the nearest support group is either in Bristol or Bath which prohibits many local people from attending meetings and we felt that there is a real need for something more local."

The support group will meet on the third Monday of every month between 1.30 and 3.30 pm and meetings are open to anyone affected by central vision loss including carers.




