



The Night Shelter is open five nights every week throughout the year. On most nights it is used by between 80 to 100 guests.

Emmaus Communities enable people to move on from homelessness, providing work and a home in a supportive, family environment. Companions, as residents are known, work full time collecting and reselling donated furniture to the whole community. This work supports the Community financially and enables residents to develop skills, rebuild their self-respect and help others in greater need. The nearest Emmaus charity shop is in Nailsworth.

TROWEL & ERROR

Meetings are held at 8pm on the 4th Monday of the month in the Methodist Hall in Back Street.

Our speaker **Brian Noble** gave a talk on **Raised Bed & Container Gardening**. Brian told us about the advantages off raised beds - where to put them, how to build them, useful equipment for the beds including a combined pH meter/moisture and light meter, soil structure, preparation of the beds, plant spacing, cultivation, watering, feeding and the necessity of keeping a garden diary. A raised bed system, which removes the need to walk on the soil, reduces the spread of soil borne diseases which are often carried by foot which is as good as any reason to use them. Fortunately Brian came armed with detailed print-outs so we didn't have to take any notes.

Brian especially noted that a raised bed should be no more than of 4' (1200mm) across because it makes it easy to reach into the middle to weed the bed. Carol misheard this nugget of information and thought he was alluding to people who wee'd the bed. Who am I to question what goes on in her head? Live and let live I say.

Brian, who is a regular speaker at our meetings, pulled in the biggest audience we have had in a while and has gone away to think about what he will teach us next year.

Our next meeting is on Monday 26th March 2012 when **Alan Phipps** will talk about **Smoke, Scenery, Spines & Flowers**.

HAWKESBURY

.... At last we come down a lane to Saxon England and find the church, enshrining ten centuries of piety and craftsmanship.

The stately tower and the lovely porch, the churchyard filled with hoary altar tombs, the fine topiary hedge of clipped yews which encompassed them on three sides and is shaped into 34 arches, the old vicarage with its many gables, and the farm buildings about it, make a memorable group.

The tower has stood 600 years. It is built in six stages, with tiny windows, a turret, and grotesques looking down. In it is a room with a fireplace and chimney and it has an excellent 14th century west doorway. It is the north porch which takes us farthest back in history, for the bases of the shafts of the inner doorway are Saxon and were probably laid by monks in the 10th century. Upon these foundations the Norman masons built this double-shafted doorway. But it is the beautiful 15th century stone pulpit which is the pride of the church, its long panels adorned with heads and its cornice with the Tudor rose. It is one of the small group of about 60 stone medieval pulpits now left in England. The font is Jacobean and near it is the bowl of a Norman font, rescued from a village garden.

In the chancel lie members of the Jenkinson family, long distinguished for their service to the State, and descended from that Anthony Jenkinson who sailed with Sebastian Cabot. Sir Charles Jenkinson, Lord of the Admiralty, first Earl of Liverpool, is remembered in a tablet by Westmacott, with a sculptured coronet. *To be continued*.

BADMINTON

It is famous for having given its name to a hunt and a game brought from India, and famous for its beauty. We come to it by the road from Tetbury to Bath, one of the most glorious runs this part of Gloucestershire can give us. A great avenue of beeches shelters this side of the Duke of Beaufort's noble house. Nearly five miles long, the avenue has thousands of trees, lengthened and strengthened by generations of Beauforts; it is an impressive sight with the lofty dome of Worcester Lodge among the trees and the park stretching beyond, the home of herds of red and fallow deer.

The estate covers 15,000 acres, and is nearly ten miles round. The village with its trim cottages of stone, the church and Badminton House are at the heart of it. The house, with its turrets and cupolas, is surrounded by gardens, and has in its dining room elaborate woodcarving by Grinling Gibbons.

The eighteenth century church is in the gardens, under the shade of great beeches. A rose arbour leads us to the porch by a wall of ancient sculptured tombstones. Close by is a wonderful chestnut tree, propped up in its declining days, and in the porch is a brass with the names of eighteen men of Badminton who left all this beauty and peace to die in the Great War. In rich tablets of white marble are remembered the sixth duke and his wife Charlotte, with their 13 children, and the first duchess who founded the village school and the almshouses. A tablet with arms and crossed flags and sword is to Lord Raglan who is buried here. He lost an arm at Waterloo while standing with Wellington and was Commander-in-Chief in the Crimea.

The neighbouring village of Little Badminton is quiet and charming. Its tiny church has stood in a field for 700 years and has a fine old roof of Cotswold tiles. There is a great grotesque in the west wall. Close by is an ancient pigeon house, with a turret and as many nesting holes (we are told) as there are days in the year.





HVT is a community car scheme, supported by South Gloucestershire Council, but run and operated by a team of volunteers.

The scheme is available for all Hawkesbury Parish residents, regardless of age. You never know when you might need transport because an injury, illness or treatment is going to either stop you driving, or limit your ability to travel. If that should happen, HVT is available and can be contacted on **0797 206 5665**. If a minimum of 3 days notice, is given HVT can usually help provided a volunteer driver.

HVT is well into its latest year of operating, the fifth anniversary will be on the 1st of August 2012, and during this period our team of volunteers have continually given their time and in a lot of cases, the use of their own vehicle, to take residents of Hawkesbury Parish with transport difficulties, to medical related appointments within a 60 mile radius.

Of the present team of 21 personnel consisting of 17 drivers, 3 Co-ordinators a Treasurer and, Jon who keeps the Community Vehicle clean, 13 of the volunteers have been donating their services since the beginning of HVT

Last year, 2011, the team carried out 1122 trips covering a distance of 7844 miles, a significant increase of 1800 miles over 2010. In this period the least number of trips a driver made was 3, and the most was 48.

August 1st 2007 was HVT's first journey, and since then the team have taken a total of 100 different passengers to their appointments. Between them, these passengers have made 1122 trips covering 27474 miles.

Most of our current drivers have been giving their valuable time since HVT started in 2007, some, I know, wish to do a little less driving, and therefore, for HVT to continue with the current standard of service, we need to find additional people to volunteer their time. We would welcome new residents or those who have retired in the last five years or so who are looking to do something a bit different, meet new people, or maybe, just to put something back into the Community.

Are you willing to give a little of your time? Perhaps you could consider becoming a volunteer driver, or an urgently needed additional Co-ordinator. The Co-ordinator ensures answer phone messages are responded to, providing the vital link between passenger and driver.

Currently we have three volunteer Co-ordinators, Sandra, Vicki and Carol, two of whom are in part time employment. The ladies share the task between them, one week on and two weeks off. It would greatly improve the situation for them, if we had an additional helper.

The date for this years Annual General Meeting has provisionally been set to take place on 13th June, further details will be announced nearer the time.

DIAMOND TRAVEL CARD INFORMATION

South Gloucestershire Council have a very good website that answers all questions relating to Diamond Travel Card eligibility, renewal, lost item replacement, benefits and limits of use.

Frequently I have been asked the following questions:-

Q1 Am I entitled to a diamond card?

If you were born:-

- before the 5 April 1950, you will become eligible on your sixtieth birthday.
- between 6 April 1950 and 5 April 1955 you will become eligible on a date shown in a table available from South Gloucestershire Council Offices, Drop-in Centres or the website <u>www.southglos.gov.uk</u>. I have a printed copy available if you require,
- on or after 6 April 1955, you will become eligible on your sixty-fifth birthday.

There are also a series of special circumstances that entitle a person to receive a travel card before these dates. Details of these are also available from the South Gloucestershire Offices, Drop-In Centres or website.

Q2 How long is my card valid for?

It varies between three and five years depending on date of issue. <u>Renewal date is printed on the front</u> of the card.

Q3 How and when do I renew my card?

First check the renewal date. There are then two main options.

- a.) Contact me on 01454 238 788 a month before your card runs out, and I will book a time to visit you, take your photograph and complete the form with you.
- b.) Use any of the South Gloucestershire Council options as listed previously.

REMEMBER, if your card is out of date you are not entitled to concessionary travel on public transport, and you are not entitled to the 25 miles concession when using HVT.



Over Our Heads

Negotiating my way slo---wly between the electricity company's vans in Back Lane, watching its workmen make a tarmac patchwork of the pavement, I realise I've never noticed just how many telegraph poles we have in our village.

For 21 years I've lived with electricity cables crossing my garden's airspace, yet the only notice I've taken has been to avoid siting my washing line beneath them. (There's nothing a perching bird likes better for target practice than a drying line of clean washing.)

Opening my bedroom shutters each morning, I never see the telegraph pole that bisects the view.

When I was given a Victorian photo of my house last year, it was days before I could put my finger on why it looked so odd: there wasn't a telegraph pole in sight.

When telegraph poles first came to the village, they must have caused a great deal of excitement, whether relaying telephone messages or hitching us up to the National Grid.

And they still do. What I like best about them is the way we use these poles to spread word of imminent village events. On their familiar brown trunks, over the years, we've pinned up posters for everything from jumble sales to judo, from youth club to yoga, confident that they'd effectively spread the word. Little wonder that lately some of them have become more tin tack than tree. ---

So let's hope that after the cables have gone underground, the electricity company leaves us a few trusty telegraph poles for Hawkesbury's special messaging service - even if they don't have any cables to support.



First, we owe a tremendous vote of thanks to our friends at the Methodist Church for their kind hospitality on two occasions recently. 




Seasonal Recipes

Sausage and greens

Serves 4

Ingredients:

250g/9oz curly kale 250g/9oz cooking chorizo 50g/2oz skinned whole almonds a little groundnut or sunflower oil a clove of garlic, peeled and crushed sea salt flakes



Method:

- 1. Wash the kale thoroughly the leaves can hold grit in their curls. Put several of the leaves on top of one another and shred them coarsely, discarding the really thick ends of the stalks as you go. Repeat this until all of the kale leaves are shredded. Set aside.
- 2. Cut the chorizo into thick slices. Warm a non-stick frying pan over a moderate heat, add the slices of chorizo and fry until the pieces are golden. Lift them out with a draining spoon onto a dish lined with kitchen paper. Discard the oil that has come out of the chorizo and wipe the pan clean.
- 3. Add the almonds to the same pan and cook for 2-3 minutes, or until pale golden, then lift out and set aside with the chorizo.
- 4. Warm the oil in the same pan, add the crushed garlic and shredded kale and cook for a couple of minutes, turning the kale over as it cooks, until glossy and starting to darken in colour.
- 5. Return the chorizo and almonds to the pan, add a little salt and continue cooking until all is sizzling. To serve, tip onto hot plates.

Scrap Metal Theft

ATM PIN Number Reversal hoax email!!

We have been alerted to a **hoax email** that has been circulating purporting to originate from Crimestoppers. It claims that if you enter your pin number in reverse into a cash point the police will be sent to your location. This information is not true. This email did <u>not</u> originate with Crimestoppers. Its content is **false.** The email states:

PIN advice - good information

ATM PIN Number Reversal - Good to Know!!

If you should ever be forced by a robber to withdraw money from an ATM machine, you can notify the police by entering your PIN # in reverse.

For example, if your pin number is 1234, then you would put in 4321. The ATM system recognizes that your PIN number is backwards from the ATM card you placed in the machine. The machine will still give you the money you requested, but unknown to the robber, the police will be immediately dispatched to the location. All ATM's carry this emergency sequencer by law.

This information was recently broadcast on by Crime Stoppers however it is seldom used because people just don't know about it.

If you receive this email or one similar to it please ignore it. The advice contained in it is false as <u>no UK banks</u> are using this type of technology.

District Councillor Report

Council Tax

The Council will probably agree a zero increase in the council tax on the 22nd February. Assurances have been made that front-line services will not be cut. Service reviews are being carried out to help reduce costs.

Broadband

The Cabinet did agree to £2.2m support for the roll out of high speed broadband across rural areas. This matches the £700,000 from the government to bring 2Mb to everyone, and high speed to 90% of the South Gloucestershire area. Thank you to all those people who have responded to the Broadband Survey. Unfortunately it will be some time before this all becomes a reality.

E-Books from the Library

A pilot scheme has been launched for library users to borrow electronic books. Anyone with a laptop or compatible portable device can choose from the 700 titles available for free for 21 days. They can be downloaded round the clock and loans expire automatically. Because of publication rights the service is not available through Kindle.
