Since the last issue the various streams of the working group have been researching:

Various options for running a shop of some kind in the Parish

How best to find out what people want from a shop

The different legal entities that could be formed to own and run a shop.

The findings were presented back to an open meeting at the Village Hall on Saturday 20th February, which was attended by about 70 people. A proposal was made as to how to proceed, which was broadly endorsed by those present and useful feedback was gained. A summary of the proposal is below.

- We set up a legal entity using a tried and tested route – The Community Benefit Society
- A share pledge letter should be issued to the community to

"Ensure, as far as practically possible, a healthy and sustainable retail shop within Hawkesbury Upton, alongside the other existing amenities"

- ensure adequate funds are available.
- To continue discussions with the owner with a view to purchasing the property at a fair market price and continuing the operation of the shop in its current location.
- Distribute, collect and analyse a retail survey issued throughout the Parish.

The CBS (Community Benefit Society) is recommended as:

This is the way that most community shops operate under. This is a tried and tested model and is easier to set up. It's a proven solution. With CBS the assets can go back to the community in the event of dissolution and it is easier to withdraw shares. The CBS would be used for any of the options where a legal entity is required, not just the purchase of the existing shop (which is the proposed solution).

Funding should be via Community Shares or grants, not debt. There needs to be wide community involvement so a share price of £50 is recommended. The democratic approach would be by one shareholder one vote, thereby avoiding controlling interest issues.

A refund of shares would only be at the discretion of the society and share buyback would be through the company. Shares will potentially offer a modest interest payment once the shop has surplus profit. There is likely to be a tax benefit for investors of £500 plus.





A few gardening thoughts for March

Flower Garden

One of the main things to bear in mind with planting this month, is that as soon as plants resulting from your seeds are mature enough, they will need a home in the garden. If they are at all tender, they may be prone to frost attack if planted too early, so the best time for general seed planting indoors is probably the end of March and early April so that spring bedding is planted out after hardening off at the end of May when frosts have hopefully passed Some corms such as begonias and gloxinias will benefit from planting in small pots this month before being planted out into final pots. and dahlia tubers can be brought out into the light in a greenhouse and planted up to the base of the neck in fresh compost in a tray or a pot. They should be watered and this should be enough until they sprout. The main


thing to bear in mind with March planting, is that although the seed packets will most often say plant in March, they all work on the basis of ideal conditions, so it's not a bad idea to be patient and hang on a bit!

Vegetable garden

This is a great time to weed the plot and get rid particularly of those big old perennials which will make work a lot easier later in the year. If the soil is cleaned up and fed with a general fertilizer such as growmore or fish, blood and bone at about a handful per square yard which is raked in, .some crops can be planted now. Spinach, swiss chard, and broad beans can be planted directly into the soil and it's worth trying a few early peas carrots and radishes. The key here is not to plant too many then if they fail little is lost. It's not a bad plan to let the soil warm a bit and wait for a decent forecast before starting. Now is the ideal time to start off greenhouse items such as tomatoes, peppers chillies and aubergines as most need a fairly long growing time. Look for those varieties which claim to be early, otherwise you'll end up with nothing until September and then have more than you can use. Do be careful, however, about planting cucumbers, as they are very sensitive to cold, and should probably be left until late April or early May.

Potatoes

It's not a bad idea to plant a few early potatoes this month, to give an early crop but in case of frosts don't overdo it, leaving



Stan and Tony also appeared at our Wulfstan feast which featured Steve Hammond's picture/music compilation of the famous Wulfstan Windows.


Many thanks to all who attended and contributed to the two events, on the latter we had a terrific

At our February meeting Jinx Newley gave a fascinating

illustrated talk on the History and Archaeology of Bread telling the story of bread-making from the New Stone Age (Neolithic), when farming began, to the 19th century. Spelt, a type of early wheat was used as long as 5500 years ago and wild yeast apparently has been used through out history. Early Man was very inventive too in finding ways to store the grain he grew, excavating huge holes in the ground; any grain which germinated produced a gas which acted as a preservative for the rest. Much, much later huge mediaeval manorial barns were built to store grain, many hundreds of feet long. Locally, the one at Winterbourne was built in 1342. Jinx provided us too with lots of examples of different types of mill,

many showing how important the use of water has been with Tidal mills filling mill ponds. Apparently horizontal water mills have been used widely up until the Second World War. Jinx's enthusiasm for her subject was infectious and no doubt gave us lots of food for thought!



Latest Scams—Beware!

0809 Area Code:

We actually received a call last week from the 0809 area code. The woman said 'Hey, this is Karen. Sorry I missed you - get back to us quickly. I have something important to tell you.' Then she repeated a phone number beginning with 0809. We did not respond, and this week, we received the following e-mail: Do Not Dial AREA CODE 0809, 0284, and 0876 from the UK ...

This scam is being distributed all over the UK This is pretty scary, especially given the way they try to get you to call. Be sure you read this and pass it on. They get you to call by telling you that it is information about a family member who has been ill or to tell you someone has been arrested, died, or to let you know you have won a wonderful prize, etc..

In each case, you are told to call the 0809 number right away. Since there are so

many new area codes these days, people unknowingly return these calls.

If you call from the UK you will apparently be charged a minimum of £1500 per-minute, and you'll also get a long recorded message. The point is, they will try to keep you on the phone as long as possible to increase the charges.

WHY IT WORKS:

The 0809 area code is located in the Dominican Republic

The charges afterwards can become a real nightmare. That's because you actually DID make the call. If you complain, both your local phone company and your long distance carrier will not want to get involved and will most likely tell you that they are simply providing the billing for the foreign company. You'll end up dealing with a foreign company that argues they have done nothing wrong.

Please forward this entire message to your friends, family and colleagues to help them become aware of this scam.

Is this the latest scam???

This morning I received a telephone call from a very foreign gentleman informing me that the maintenance contract on my washing machine had expired and he could offer me a new one for a few pounds a month.

I politely told him that I had no such contract, never had and didn't want one. At that point he got quite agitated and tried to persuade me. I emphatically told him again that I wasn't interested and not to call again.

Is this the latest way of trying to get our banking details?

Hawkesbury Upton Hospital Hall - Chairman's Year End Report - February 2016

As I come to the end of my first year as Chairman of the Hall's Management Committee I am now in a better position to realise the effort that has been required by past Chairmen and the support needed to keep the Hall fully operational. So my first comment is a huge thank you to all the current Management Committee without whose help this building and the recreation field would not be readily available for daily use. We should also not forget the Parish Council members who also contribute in various ways to the operation of the Hall and there have been a number of volunteers, particularly on the maintenance working parties, who have given up their time to ensure the Hall is fit for purpose.

It is now 65 years since the Trust Deed was signed putting Trustees in charge of the then former hospital and land surrounding it. Those Trustees, known today as the Management Committee, were required to be made up of specified organisations in the village who would promote physical and mental training together with recreational, social, moral and intellectual development. I think if anyone looks at the range of organisations using the Hall now then those who originally granted that Deed would be well satisfied that those objectives are being achieved. Whether its badminton, karate, history, drama, pre-school education or just a good dance then the Hall has this and lots more opportunity. We hope to market this even better in the coming year with regular features in the Parish Magazine.

However, I suspect that the when the original grant was made those making it and taking it up never anticipated the increasing levels of administration in connection with legislation, health and safety and insurances that would be required in the 21st century. So this is an area where we have been reviewing what is required in order we can determine how best to tackle it without the detriment to the use of the Hall. Ideally we would hope that Hawkesbury common sense can prevail

in such matters. One area that has become particularly important is the need for another Licensee for the Bar, Angelo has done this for a long time and needs some help. We are working on it but volunteers shouldn't be afraid of coming forward.

The Hall is dependent up on regular use by the community and many years ago it was agreed that the users should pay a reasonable proportion of the running costs. This works reasonably well and last year we had a surplus of funds amounting to nearly £1500 and on top of that there were sufficient funds to repay some of the organisations a share of the bar funds amounting to just over £1000. As Dickens' Mr Micawber would have said – "result happiness". Thank you to Bill Cullen for his work on maintaining the accounts and managing all the funds.

However, the surplus funds raised from the users are insufficient to carry out some essential maintenance or development work and this has to come from other sources. We were particularly fortunate that David Anderson and Jim O'Brien made a tremendous effort in running the length of the Cotswold Way in 24 hours raising funds for the Hall. Numerous associated organisations also contributed to this fund raising.

The Drama group continue to make a tremendous contribution to the community and a grant was received from South Gloucestershire to help provide the new speaker system in the Hall.

Jane Stanbridge and Kate Bashford have both had great success in raising funds particularly in respect of the proposed refurbishment of the kitchen, which was finally made possible with a tranche of money coming from the Big Lottery Fund and the work will be completed over the Easter period. An extra big thanks to Kate also for getting everything together in connection with the kitchen design and fitting out. Our Hall Breakfast on the 24th April will be an opportunity to test run the new kitchen.

We are also in the process of having a make-over of the upstairs committee room spearheaded by the Youth Club, which will make it a more sociable and comfortable environment for all the users. This again has been supported by Grant funding. Probably the biggest project proposed, which is right at the start of the planning process, is an extension to the Hall for the use of Toddlers and Pre-school. The hope is that this will make an area that is lighter, with better views over the recreation field and customised for the needs of young children. There should also be a ground floor meeting room and it frees up the Hall for other users. There will be more on this in the Parish Magazine.

However, we must not forget that the Hall needs regular maintenance, whether this is cleaning on a daily basis or the replacement of light bulbs, sealing worn floors, recovering shed roofs, painting the oil tank, replacing worn play equipment and the list is endless. We had the front wall repaired and the trees lopped as a Health and Safety precaution, all this done with grant funding. A big thank you to all who help in this area particularly Angelo Sauro and Neil Fozard, both of whom are regularly on site doing some job or other. We should also say a big thank you to our Secretary, Fiona Steeds, who ensures that all our actions are recorded and keeps everyone advised of what has gone on. Also our Booking Secretary, Lorraine Rutter, who has the thankless job of vetting all the potential users and making sure they sign all the forms and know where to pay their money.

So into the New Year with lots of activity especially some events where funds raised will be shared with Charities and the Hall, so everyone benefits. That is the spirit that I think encapsulates the community of Hawkesbury Upton and fulfils the purpose of the Hall.



Hawkesbury and Inglestone Commons Officer

Survey work in 2013 by Hazel Willmot, helped to identify the importance of the commons for great crested newts. This highly protected species spends much of its time on land, returning to ponds to breed. They can travel 500 m from a breeding pond, favouring rough tussocky grassland which provides good cover from predators and plenty of invertebrates for them to feed on. Nationally, numbers have declined dramatically particularly linked to agricultural intensification and whilst still widespread, low numbers make them vulnerable to habitat loss. In 2014 Avon Wildlife Trust was commissioned to survey 6

ponds on the common for great crested newts to determine their population size which was found to be 'medium'. The survey was repeated in 2015 with the help of volunteers including parish residents working alongside licensed ecologists. It is hoped to survey again later in 2016. Of course the newts don't know where the boundary of the common is and are likely to use adjacent ponds too. Surveying these ponds will help to give a more accurate picture. If you have a pond near to the common and are interested in finding out if it is being used by great crested newts please do get in touch.

South Gloucestershire Council is responsible for a number of commons

in addition to Hawkesbury, Inglestone, Hareley and Assley. Each has its own management requirements and Byelaws but only ours includes a SSSI and an HLS agreement. Each designation brings additional requirements and residents adjacent to the commons have been sent a copy of the relevant Byelaws, Scheme of Management and SSSI / HLS information for ease of reference. These can also be found on the Hawkesbury Common website (http://www.hawkesburycommon.co.uk/) or please contact me direct for a copy.

Letter from the Vicar - March 2016

Dear Friends,

I am going to break my tour of the churches this month, to tell you about an event that is taking place.

Sometimes the old things are the best. This is true of furniture, paintings, music - and I believe religion. The language of the prayer book may to some be unfathomable and strange, but to others it speaks of a God of awe and wonder in a language which mirrors God's grandeur, wisdom and glory: 'Oh lord our heavenly Father, Almighty and everlasting God, who hast safely brought us to the beginning of this day.....'



Parish Precept – 2016/17

Each year the Parish Council has a duty to review and adjust the parish precept.

This is a tax charged on each property in the parish to fund all the activities that the parish council undertakes for the benefit of our community.

Parish precepts are included separately on council tax bills and are collected by South Gloucestershire Council on behalf of the parish.

Following careful deliberation the Parish Council has approved an increase of 11.6% for the 2016/17 precept as compared to the previous financial period.

Due in part to the governments emphasis on "localism" our parish council is involved in many more policy consultations and meetings with the district council and other organisations. This has had a significant impact upon the duties of our Parish Clerk and we have recognised the need to increase the number of hours our Clerk has and will continue to work.

In addition to the increase in the day to day running costs of the council we are currently engaged in many new initiatives. For example we are working closely with SGC to prepare an 'Affordable Housing Needs Survey' and the report will be published later this year.

We are also developing a parish council website. This is a statutory requirement welcomed by the PC and we hope will raise public awareness of the council's activities and allow public access more easily to agenda, minutes and forthcoming events etc – more details to follow soon.

These are typical of some of the additional costs we are bearing but we hope you will agree provide added benefit to the community.

Litter

Over recent months there has been an increase in litter being dropped not only on the High Street but throughout our village, this is without any thoughts for the local residents. Please can we ask that everyone use the litter bins provided or take their rubbish home with them.
