Thank you so much to the households that returned our survey, and to all those that have pledged financial and other support for a community shop in Hawkesbury.

At the initial deadline of Sunday 10 April we had received pledges totalling around £80,000.

But we urgently need to raise at least an additional £100,000.

We're asking households that haven't yet pledged to please consider doing so.

If you have already made a pledge we're asking you to consider if you can afford to pledge any more.

If we cannot raise the shortfall, Hawkesbury Shop will close in a matter of weeks.

Q. How much money do we need to raise?

A. Following extensive research and costplanning, we have been able reduce the target. We need in the region of £180,000-£210,000 to buy the property and get a well-stocked and refurbished

community shop up and running.

Q. How much has been pledged so far?

A. Pledges returned by Sunday 10 April ranged from £50 to £10,000, and the total was almost £80,000. This leaves us with a shortfall of pledges of around £100,000.

Q. Why is it important to pledge?

A. To date, we have no mystery benefactor contributing a huge proportion of the costs. Creating a community shop in Hawkesbury will require a large number of households to come together and invest any amount they can afford, from £50 upwards.

Q. How can I make or increase a pledge?

A. To make a pledge, increase the amount you pledged in the survey, or to ask any questions to help inform your decision, please contact the Chair of the Working Group Alan Hemingway on 01454 238 271 or husosenguiries@outlook.com

Q. What about moving to the village hall site?

A. Some people are keen for the site of the shop to move to the village hall,

But planning and construction of such a site could take a year, during which either a) with no grocery store in the village our customer base diminishes as people get used to leaving the village for supplies or b) we use up our reserves (your pledges) on temporary premises.

Our assessment has concluded that the best option in the immediate term is to buy and set up a community shop in the current shop property.

Q. What did the survey tell us?

A. The surveys were overwhelmingly positive about having a community shop in the village. Please take a look at the insert in this issue, with the headline results. Your responses gave us lots of great information about what products and services a shop would need to provide for you. We believe we can create a superb focal point for the village in the current location, but we urgently need to raise the money to do so.

Please invest in the future of Hawkesbury, and make a pledge today to Save Our Shop.


It's lovely to see the allotments buzzing with activity once again, with several new faces taking over plots for the first

Wiltshire Police have seen an increase Charfield, in the number of potential iewellery GL12 8TA

scams reported over the last few weeks to our control room. Reports tend to suggest that a car is normally parked on a slip road to a major road such as the M4 or A303. The occupants are usually well dressed males in suits, shirt and ties. They will attempt to flag down passing motorists, putting themselves at risk by jumping into the road in attempts to stop passing vehicles. When stopping a vehicle one of the males will climb into the passenger's seat of the car and ask the motorist for money for fuel, they will offer an exchange which will be a worthless piece of jewellery. Normally they tell the motorist that it is of great value and a fair exchange. The suspects have even been willing to be taken to a nearby cash point for an exchange to take place.

Sliproad Scam

PC Carl Jones said: "When joining a motorway, even on a slip road, it is an offence to stop unless it is an emergency; people risk putting their lives in danger if they chose to do so. "Wiltshire Police would like to warn all motorists of this type of incident; if you do stop to help, do not hand over any cash & do not accept any kind of jewellery or any exchange for cash. Do not take them anywhere, instead call 999 and ask for the police to assist in their emergency.

"We believe that these individuals are operating all over the south of the country & it is not specific to Wiltshire. "We would like to put a stop to these types of scams & protect people from being ripped off. Any information, that may help police to identify these males, can be logged via 101 or Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111."

He noted that natives prefer to be called Scillonians not Scilly islanders. I wonder why.


Our next meeting will be on Monday 23rd May when Tortworth Plant Centre will give a talk on 'Herbaceous Borders'.


WHAT DO SPIDERS EAT DURING THE WINTER? By Alan C. Porter

Calling all homebrewers.....

Following last year's successful introduction of the Home Brewed Beer Class in the Summer Show, we have slightly changed the rules to encourage even more entries.

This year, responding to the concerns of several would-be exhibitors in the village, home brewed beer in 500ml clear plastic pressure bottles will also be allowed.

The basic rules remain the same:-

- There will be 4 sub-classes, based on colour:-
 - Lager / Blonde Ale (straw coloured)
 - Pale Ale / Golden (pale to dark gold)
 - Bitter (dark gold to chestnut)
 - Porter/ Stout /Mild (dark red to black)
- Beers must be home-brewed, (kit, partial or full mash) and presented in 500ml clear glass bottles, or clear plastic pressure bottles, (crown-capped, springcapped or screw-capped), and labelled with a tied-on label around the neck indicating the

sub-class.

- Judging will be by our National Prize-winning local experts Mark Frankcom of Cotswold Spring Brewery and Steve McDonald of Severn Vale Brewery, who together form the Combined Brewers.
- The judges will take into consideration the following key aspects of a good ale:
 - appearance in bottle
 - pour and condition (i.e. gas),
 - o smell,
 - taste, &
 - o finish.

If you are going to use plastic pressure bottles, you can recycle suitable fizzy drinks bottles like Coke, or buy clear PET bottles from one of the many online home-brew shops. You will need to ensure that primary fermentation has finished before bottling, and be very careful with the amount of priming sugar for the secondary fermentation, or the plastic bottle will distort, or, (worse) burst! Don't use plastic squash or water bottles as they simply won't withstand the secondary fermentation pressure that builds up in the bottle.

With all beers in clear bottles it is advisable to store them in the dark during maturation as light will cause the beer colour to deteriorate.

However you brew or bottle, home brewed beer is reputedly at its best after 3 or 4 months of maturation,

....which means you should be brewing your exhibition ales <u>this</u> month or next (May or early June)

if you haven't already done so.

Let's have the tables groaning with the weight of our wonderful Lagers, Ales, Bitters, Milds, Porters and Stouts!

Beware the Ide(a)s of March !! (apologies to the great Bard !)

BT – an explanation and an exploration

of corporate incompetence.

On March 9th, BT Residential were supposed to replace the existing residential line at the Post Office with a new number. By mistake, they cut off the Business Line and installed a residential line on it. This disabled the Post Office computers immediately. I informed BT of their calamitous mistake on March 10th. After 12 days (yes, 12 !!!) they finally corrected their mistake, re-installed 01454 238341 on its designated Business ISDN line and installed the residential line on its proper socket. Still nothing would work, to the consternation of everyone involved, except BT who continued to deny responsibility, as they have done since day one !! Another full 10 days later, March 31st, BT admitted that whilst they had re-installed the

Business line on 21st March, they had forgotten to actually switch it on and activate it !!

So 3 weeks and 2 days after disabling my Post Office through their own error and incompetence, they finally put it right. I suffered 3 weeks and 2 days of being ignored, lied to, hung up on and fobbed off with promises which (surprise, surprise) never actually materialised. BT have offered no refund on either line and have invoiced for the full amount payable for both lines during this time. BT have NOT offered any compensation to me for the loss of business or for the inconvenience and worry and stress they caused, never mind the inconvenience to the village and those who rely on the Post Office.


The incompetence within BT is not restricted to one department nor one

specific level of management. It covers every single department and goes right up to director and board level in every single department. They even lied to the office of our MP Luke Hall who tried to intervene on my behalf. They are allowed to get away with this. They answer to no-one.

Village Walk – Saturday 30th July 2016 Wonderful summer sunshine just calls for a walk in our beautiful parish. We're walking on Saturday 30th



There has been little further news on the budget announcement that there would be greater devolution for the West of England (South Gloucestershire, Bristol City, North Somerset and Bath & North East Somerset) on the condition of the election of a metro mayor. There appears to be little appetite for a new Mayor, with enhanced powers over the area. Council leaders have written to the minister asking for a local referendum on this subject. A reply is awaited. The £30m promised for growth each year for 30 years, doesn't cover the savings which individual councils are having to make to local services.

Hawkesbury and Inglestone Commons Officer

April has been living up to its 'sunshine and showers' billing. I have been investigating a suitable location for an additional water trough at Hareley Common with the Hareley Commons committee. A new trough will mean that cattle can graze for longer at Hareley and Assley, without making the trek back to the Inglestone trough for water.

Our visit coincided with heavy rain and a right soaking. Fortuitously as it turned out, clearly showing which areas of the common are wet and 'splashy' and which stay drier. Possible locations need to avoid sensitive areas (wet, wildflowers, archaeology, near houses, roads or footpaths) as well as being within striking distance of the mains. The next step is to meet with Bristol Water for connection quotes

and advice.

A day of sunshine followed the rain with bright yellow Brimstone butterflies bobbing along the sheltered scrub edge - one of our earliest butterflies, the caterpillars feed only on buckthorn which is found on the common. I was looking at bluebells, not our native bluebell which carpets the woods in a real highlight of spring, but Spanish bluebells forming a clump on the woodland edge. Disappointingly, garden waste still turns up on the commons and is a likely method of spread for non-native plants. Spanish bluebells are more vigorous than our native bluebell with broader strappy leaves, more open flowers and little scent. Left unchecked they spread, outcompeting and hybridising with our native

bluebell and shifting the balance of our ancient woodlands.

As Inglestone Common is a designated site of special scientific interest (SSSI), consent for removal of any plant needs to be sought from Natural England with detailed paperwork explaining what, when, how and where it will be done. Paperwork now completed and armed with written consent, our thanks to Neil Lodge the Lower Woods reserve warden for Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust, who has kindly volunteered to dig up and remove the Spanish invaders.



Hawkesbury & Horton WI



At our April meeting held in Horton Hall, speaker Steve Mould told us all about the

work of the Great Western Air Ambulance Charity. The service covers 6 counties: Gloucestershire, South Gloucestershire, Bristol, North Somerset, Bath and N.E. Somerset and Wiltshire and is essentially a flying accident and emergency department which on average deals with about 4 accidents a day.

At present they have one helicopter but shortly will have two. They also have 4 ambulances. A helicopter costs about £2.3 million per year to run and all the money is raised from donations. Accidents are assessed on their need and can be in isolated places hard to reach quickly in any other way. They deal with a range of accidents: some on farms, sporting injuries, motor accidents and serious falls. Their aim is to reach the accident scene within 20mins, and, with a critical care doctor on board can perform procedures only possible otherwise in a hospital, therefore saving the lives of approximately 350 people a year. Patients can also be fast-tracked when they reach the appropriate hospital as they have been assessed and primary care already administered. Afterwards WI members were able to contribute to this very worthwhile charity with a bucket collection. Horton member, Lyn Edwards, gave a vote of thanks.

During the evening Ann Greenhalgh from the Cromhall based charity CLink brought along a king-sized patchwork quilt she had made for a Grand Quilt Draw to support the work with two community schools in townships around Lusaka, Gambia. This draw will take place in May.

Several members attended the Spring Meeting at Chipping Sodbury Town Hall and the speaker from Westonbirt Arboretum gave an informative illustrated talk about the work done there and it was lovely to know that by the time you read this the 300 meter Boardwalk with tree-top views will be open.

Flower of the Month competition was won by Judy Chancellor with a doubleheaded daffodil

Hawkesbury Horticultural Show Schedule 2016

This year's Show Schedule is currently being updated and revised. Each year, the horticultural, domestic and children's classes are reviewed. The number of entries for each class is recorded each year and occasionally, it is felt that a class could be removed and a new class added. Any changes to classes are on the advice of experts in that field, and are always made to encourage more people to feel like they could 'have a go!' The wording of the class descriptions is also carefully considered to try to make it unambiguous and easily to understand, with a few guidelines included as well. So if your favourite class has been changed, or removed – do look out for the new classes that have been added in this year to make the display in the marquee on showday even more of a spectacle.

In the Show Schedule, which should be available to buy in June, all classes that have been altered in some way, or are new classes, are marked with a * The alterations are listed below, to advise those of you who start thinking about entries early, to be aware of the changes...

<u>SECTION 1</u> VEGETABLES (Cottagers and Open)

Class Description

- 113 Pickling shallots, to pass through 30mm ring
- 114 Culinary shallots

The vegetable classes shown above will now be required to provide $\underline{\mathbf{8}}$ specimens, rather than 10 as in previous years

<u>SECTION 2</u> FRUIT (Cottagers and Open)

Class Description

- 201 Cooking apples
- 202 Dessert apples
- 203 Plums, not greengages
- 204 Dessert pears
- 206 Any other fruit, of <u>one</u> variety

The fruit classes shown above will now be required to provide <u>5</u> *specimens, rather than 6 as in previous years*

<u>SECTION 3</u> FLOWERS (Cottagers and Open)

Class Description

325 Sweet peas, 1 or more varieties The flower class shown above will now be required to provide <u>6 stems</u>, rather than 9 as in previous years

<u>SECTION 4</u> DOMESTIC (Open)

FOLIAGE & FLOWERS

Class Description

401 Miniature exhibit entitled **"Red, White and Blue"** *maximum 10cm in any direction*

This class is renamed every year, and this year the colour theme is a reflection of Her Majesty's 90th birthday

408 Cactus or cacti, in flower, all growing, pot up to 25cm This replaces a previous ambiguous description and any type or size or number of flowering cacti can be presented in the one pot

FOOD

Class Description

419 Decorated cake, theme: **'Sport'** (only decorations *judged*)

This class is renamed every year, and this year the theme is a celebration of the Olympic Games in Rio. The sport does not have to be one featuring in the Olympics, any sport or sports, flat or 3D decoration

425 Open fruit flan, short crust pastry bottom, any fruit, Please note that this class replaces the previous 'Fruit tart, short crust pastry top and bottom, cooked on a plate'

New adult classes this year – there are a number of new classes introduced this year, in a variety of sections, which may be just what you have been waiting for....

New class Description

- 331 Dahlia collection 3 vases, each containing
 3 stems of dahlias as described in classes
 305 (decorative), 306 (cactus or semi-cactus) and

- 400 Orchids, in flower
- 423 Lemon curd, in a clear jar
- 447 Model sculpted or created from vegetables and/or fruit
- 448 **Oddest shaped fruit or vegetable**






SAME DIRECTION, VERY DIFFERENT COURSE

In his third year as course designer at the Mitsubishi Motors Badminton Horse Trials, Giuseppe Della Chiesa route involves a birch drop into the has bucked tradition and sends riders water, a spread in the pond and out the same way out of the Main Arena as last year. First over the ASX Starter then left to the angled hedges may be familiar, but the HorseQuest Quarry now has a completely new look. Entering the pit down a grassy slope the first obstacle is Mike Weaver's Hay Cart, seen in many locations in the Park. It is then a left loop out of the dip and back in over an uncompromising dry stone wall, up a steep slope and another wall. This certainly has the feeling of Ouarries of old.

To break a very long gallop, riders have to steer off the straight and jump an inviting parallel before the serious question of subtly altered distances at the brush corners in the Irish Horse Gateway Huntsmans Close.

Then it is the first fence where horses get their feet wet, a big log on the course this year, which changes the flat at the lower end of the Lake, which jumped very well on its introduction in 2015. Giuseppe then reroutes from last year, going to the white spreads at the Jack Wills Garden, his only decorative concession to long distance show jumping.

Past the front of the House it is a right turn to a revamped Swindon Designer Outlet Mound, a gnarled log on the flat, followed by another in the dip, up a steep slope to an airy suspended log and down to a very narrow log on a left handed turn. There is then a let up spread before a Last year Savills Escalator proved new look Mirage Pond. The first element is a narrow kennel with an immediate drop into the pond. There are two choices of kennel exit, with little to choose, but it is the gap between which will keep the horses guessing which one their pilot will opt for.

In keeping with letting the horses have a bit of a mental break after a serious question, the next is another let up, the PHEV Oxer alongside the Vicarage Ditch then up one of the few inclines in Badminton Park to Giuseppe's 'discovered' location,

the Gatehouse New Pond. Again very different to last time, the direct on a sweeping left curve to a very open birch corner.

A portable 'chase fence comes before the classic KBIS Vicarage Vee. The difference this time is that though the obstacle has to be jumped going left, the course track hangs right thereafter, doubling back to the rebuilt Outlander Bank, an upright frontage with a bounce to a narrow roll top feeder.

Then it is a right turn to re-enter the Deer Park over the Shogun Hollow. an angled double of hedges, with a dip between them. Another long gallop ensues before a return to the World Horse Welfare Garden, where riders will need to really steady up before a double of upright white gates.

Down to the crowd favourite, the Lake complex. It is much later on in its significance. The first element, which miraculously finds itself as fence 25, celebrates the silver anniversary of Mitsubishi Motors sponsorship, with the back to back silver L200 Pick Ups. It is then a left loop to a quite inviting brush into the Lake, followed by a choice of exit over another brush followed by brush cubes.

There are now only two rather than three birch fences at the Alexanders Silver Birch, then the same large tree trunk, looking down the Avenue towards Worcester Lodge. perhaps on the kind side, so more of a slalom effect is required this time. The Devoucoux Keepers Brush is the same as ever, but there's always the penultimate question at the Rolex Crossing. Different logs, different distance this time, then finally back into the arena over the Mitsubishi Finale.

33 fences with 45 jumping efforts over a distance of about 6,500 metres (just over 4 miles), which will give an optimum time to be achieved to avoid time penalties of around 11 minutes 30 seconds

VERY STRONG BADMINTON INTERNATIONAL ENTRIES

The Badminton Horse Trials 2016 is marked by one of the strongest ever fields of competitors.

The highlight is undoubtedly the return to top flight competition after serious injury last autumn of both William Fox-Pitt (Parklane Hawk) and Andrew Nicholson (Nereo and multiple Burghley winner Avebury); the German presence is headed by Olympic Champion Michael Jung with La *Biosthetique Sam*, accompanied by Ingrid Klimke, twice 2nd at Badminton, Andreas Dibowski, Bettina Hoy and Andreas Ostholt. Michael Jung also plans to take one horse to Rolex Kentucky, which after his Burghley win in 2015 gives him a shot at the Rolex Grand Slam of Eventing, should he win in Kentucky.

Competition for the 4 places in the New Zealand Olympic team looks to be especially hot; Mark Todd has two rides, Blyth Tait returns after a 13 year absence, previous winner Jonathan Paget brings Clifton Promise and Clifton Lush, while husband and wife Tim and Jonelle Price will challenge these and Andrew Nicholson for places in Rio.

Notable British entries include former world champion Zara Tindall with her London Olympic and World Equestrian Games ride High Kingdom; previous winners Pippa Funnell and Oliver Townend; regular team members Tina Cook and Nicola Wilson; and several riders with a real chance of earning a ticket to the Games such as Gemma Tattersall, Izzy Taylor and Laura Collett.

2016 also sees a strong American contingent headed by multiple medallist Phillip Dutton, Boyd Martin with a choice of 4 rides, Buck Davidson and Lynn Symansky. As always, the Irish will be out in force, with another husband and wife combination in Michael and Patricia Ryan, Aoife Clark, Joe Murphy and Camilla Spiers. The Australians have always rated Badminton highly as a prelude to Olympic Games – they have two previous Mitsubishi Motors Trophy winners in Paul Tapner and Sam Griffiths, together with Christopher Burton and Bill Levett.

25 years after her mother Mary won the first Mitsubishi Motors Trophy, Emily King hopes to make her debut at Badminton with Brookleigh.

Letter from the Vicar - May 2016

Dear Friends,

Over the last two weeks I have had the privilege of being called to say prayers with the dying. Whenever I am asked to the bedside of a dying person, I am always left with the conviction that it has been hugely significant, both for the person who is dying as well as for the family.

Using oil (which has been blessed by the Bishop) to anoint the sick and the dying is very much part of our tradition. St Paul encourages it and Our Lord himself was anointed by Mary with expensive ointment, in preparation for his death.

It is actually the oil of healing, not dying. So that even if the healing does not occur in this world it is part of our healing for the next. Having said which, I have anointed people who revive and live many years after!! One of them sits in my pews every week.

What happens is that there is a short confession, a statement of faith and a few prayers. It is all very simple, nothing complicated and usually a great comfort to the family. And I should add, that if the call comes in the middle of a party, then a car is sometimes needed to collect the Priest! But I will come, even if it is my Day off, or I am in the middle of having a dressing down by my wife (which sometimes happens to us husbands!) It is what I am here for - and it is no bother!

Finally I hope you may be able to come to the Horse trials service at 10 o'clock on 8th May in Badminton church. Best to park in the village and walk up.

God's Sustaining Grace

To be an Olympic athlete you need three things going for you. You need: speed, skill and most important of all, you have to have endurance. If you don't make it to the end of the race, you're not going to win a medal!

The Bible tells us that God always finishes what He starts. In the book of Philippians it says – "I am sure of this, that He who started a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus" Philippians 1:6

Go ahead and circle the word 'will'. This verse doesn't say, God 'might' finish it, it doesn't say God 'hopes' to finish it. This verse says God 'will' finish it! What does that mean? It means that if you have really given your life to Jesus Christ – if you've opened yourself up to God and said "Christ, be number one in my life – be Lord of my life" – you are going to make it all the way to heaven. Because the race does not depend on your performance, it depends on God's Sustaining Grace.

In 1992, following five operations, British runner Derek Redman was hoping to win gold at the Barcelona Olympics. Everything seemed to be going well for the 400m race. He had recorded the fastest time in the quarter-final heat. He was pumped up – ready to go! As the gun sounded, he got off to a clean start. But at 150m – his right hamstring muscle tore and he fell to the ground. When he saw the stretcher-bearers rushing towards him he got up and began hobbling towards the finish line. Despite his pain he continued to move forward. Soon another person joined him on the track. It was his father. Arm in arm – hand in hand – they moved towards the finish line together. Just before the finish line, Derek's dad let go of his son, so that Derek could finish the race on his own. The crowd of 65,000 stood to their feet cheering and clapping as Derek finished the race. Heart-breaking? – yes! Encouraging? – yes! Emotional? – yes!

God does not leave you to run the race alone but He gives you His Sustaining Grace. What is God's Sustaining Grace? It is the power to keep you going even when you felt like giving up. Do you ever feel like throwing in the towel? Do you feel like quitting? Do you ever say, "I've had enough!" God's Sustaining Grace is the power that helps you to endure even when you don't think you can.

(This is subject to her obtaining a grant to travel here from Australia - we're waiting to hear with fingers crossed!)
