

HVT NEEDS YOU

For the past 6 years HVT has managed to meet the demand of the Hawkesbury Parish community's requests for transport to medical related appointments. Only once have we failed to find a driver for a passenger journey.

That is now about to change.

Recently a number of drivers, all of whom have been involved since the start up, have, for different reasons, requested that they be removed from the Drivers Roster, which has left HVT with a genuine shortage of available driver volunteers.

In September we ended up with just 6 drivers available.

Today is the 9th of October, and in the 9 days since the start of the month, Vicky, who has been running the diary, has had 18 requests for transport.

So, unless HVT gets a new influx of volunteers, the service will deteriorate, people will be let down, and I have no doubt, the service will eventually cease.

This is a community service, for the community, by the community, and will only continue if the community continues to support it.



Meetings are held at 8pm on the 4th Monday of the month in the Methodist Hall in Back Street.

Our September meeting was cancelled as a show of respect for the family and friends of Peter Barnett, one of our founding members, who died recently after a long illness.

Well, yes, this summer was much better than that which we endured in 2012 but it didn't come bearing gifts and bounty for all did it. We usually suffer some problems with butterfly damage to our cabbages so this year I built a proper cage around the brassica patch complete with a sturdy 11mm mesh net pinned to the ground with bricks. Let's see you get through that! we said. Now tell me - was it just us? Were we the only ones plagued by cabbage white butterflies? We hardly saw any other species. Cabbage whites descended on our new 'impenetrable' cage in numbers like those flights of monarch butterfly you see on TV. And that lovely close mesh that was surely far too small for a butterfly with 30mm wings to get through? It might as well have not been there at all. I never actually saw one detach its wings, crawl through and re-attach them once inside but before my very eyes one moment they were fluttering about outside the net and then they were inside thumbing their noses. We gave up, went on holiday and left them to it. That was another mistake. When we came back the caterpillars has reduced everything in the cage to cabbage skeletons. So we took off the net in the hope that the birds would come in and have a feast but they didn't seem interested either. Next year we're going to double over the net but if that doesn't work then out will come the insecticide.

Our next meeting is on **Monday 25th November 2013** when **Newent Plant Centre** will give a talk about **Heuchera**.

Hawkesbury Upton Neighbourhood Watch Reducing the opportunity for crime



South Gloucestershire Council Trading Standards would like to remind residents to be vigilant after seeing a recent increase in rogue trading complaints.

Officers have also been dealing with a number of complaints where residents have agreed for work to be carried out involving cleaning and/or sealing of driveways and roofing tiles. Some cases have involved 'aggressive commercial practices' carried out by the trader. These are actions by the trader that coerce, harass or intimidate a consumer into making a decision to purchase goods or services. In one case the resident was asked to keep the price she was paying a secret - this may be an example of a trader charging extortionate amounts for the work being done and by convincing the resident not to tell anyone, it is unlikely their tactics would come to light.

In another case, a vulnerable resident was driven to the bank by the trader in order to withdraw thousands of pounds for unnecessary work. The bank became suspicious and called the police.

Traders have also failed to give residents written notice of their cancellation rights. In one case the resident was asked to tick to say she had seen them, but was not given a copy as required by law.

If a resident enters into an agreement with a trader in their home, they are legally entitled to receive written notice of their cancellation rights. If a trader fails to provide this notice, they may be committing a criminal offence. The contract is also unenforceable against the consumer, meaning the trader could not sue them for any outstanding monies.

In another case the resident was given her cancellation rights notice, but work started immediately. Where a resident agrees to work starting before the seven day cooling off period expires, the resident must sign to show they agree to this. This did not happen in this instance, which could again constitute an offence of an aggressive commercial practice.

Due to the nature of these complaints and the potential for aggressive business practices, Trading Standards officers would like to hear from anyone who thinks they may have received such a visit, or knows of friends or family who have. Match Report for The Gentlemen of Hawkesbury Vs North Nibley GENTS STUFFED TWICE IN ONE AFTERNOON

"This must be one of the most beautiful views in Gloucestershire," sighed an elderly spectator, sitting on one of the benches that line the boundary at North Nibley's ground. It is hard to imagine a more picturesque sporting venue. William Tyndale's monument stands proudly at the top of Nibley Knoll to the east. The impressive Nibley House provides plenty of Georgian grandeur from the pavilion end, whilst the Vale of Berkeley adds a dramatic backdrop at the other.

Arriving at 2pm, the Gents had little time to appreciate the view before they were given two grim reminders of the challenge ahead. Firstly, a newspaper clipping inside the pavilion retold the story of a double hundred scored by a red-headed youngster in a friendly. The same youngster was in his whites and warming up in the outfield. The second alarming notice was pinned to the changing room door. It read: "In case of serious injury, our grid reference is..."



Dear Parishioners,

A huge thank you to those of you who gave so much to make the Harvest Festivals a success this year. We raised money right across the Benefice both for the church and for charities. Hundreds of people came and joined 'the song of harvest home'. Next year, I am hoping we can bring organisations together so that in the larger villages, we have one Harvest weekend in each village, when a community joins to celebrate the Harvest, including the school, pub and village societies and churches. It seems wrong that it is all split up. Last Sunday I went down to Tetbury on Sunday morning, to see hoards of youngsters running around with a ball, rather than sitting in church like their forebears would have done. 

South Gloucestershire District Councillor Report

Grants were awarded to Hawkesbury After School Club for equipment (£1899) and to Hawkesbury Village Hall (£5760) towards a new boiler at the September meeting of the Frome Vale Area Forum. These were capital grants with an extra grant from the New Homes Bonus monies being granted to the Village Hall.

Applications for revenue grants open on the 14th October, closing on the 18th November - full details can be found on the website. Everyone is welcome to come along to the Frome Vale Area Forum, where grants are awarded, and traffic management scheme priorities are decided. The public are welcome to address councillors during the public forum. The next meeting is on the 28th November at Chipping Sodbury Town Hall. If you need further information about grants or the meetings, please don't hesitate to get in touch with me.

BROADBAND UK

Although Tormarton was mentioned as one of the villages to benefit from the latest rollout of superfast Broadband, this is the only village in the ward, with no mention of Acton Turville nor Badminton, which are served by the same exchange! Hawkesbury Upton doesn't appear to be on the horizon, although I am being assured we will have the cabinet connection by 2015 – the final date. I am also aware of poor current Broadband connections in the village, and will be using this as evidence for the connections to be made sooner rather than later. There appears to be a great deal of secrecy around the whole project.

HEALTH & HOSPITALS

The Health Scrutiny Committee referred the decision by the Clinical Commissioning Board to have 68 'interim' beds at Southmead Hospital, rather than Frenchay to the Secretary of State. We also asked for further information on the development of the Health & Social Care centre at Frenchay. Concerns have been raised about the low use of Yate Minor Injuries Unit by outpatients, which should there be no outpatients or diagnostic facilities at Frenchay would need to be advertised, and used by local people.

The changes being made are to develop a model of care to keep people out of hospital, and to try and make their stay there as short as possible.

After lobbying it is hoped that South Gloucestershire Council is to support a bus service from Yate to Southmead Hospital for visitors as from April 2014.

There appears to be doubt over the future of Severn Pathology, the recently created body to oversee pathology and histopathology for the Bristol area. UBHT (the Bristol Royal Infirmary Trust) have decided not to pursue the partnership working which had recently been agreed after an inquiry into failures at the Trust. The Joint Health Scrutiny Committee (Bristol & SGC) was rather stunned to hear about this decision and have asked for further information.

HOME ENERGY IMPROVEMENTS

Funding worth £70,000 is available to South Gloucestershire residents for a range of home improvement projects including installing solar panels, biomass boilers or upgrading their existing heating. Loans of between £1,000 and £15,000 can be taken out and repaid over a six month to 15 year period at a four per cent interest rate.

The loan is with South Gloucestershire Council and the scheme is administered by the Wessex Reinvestment Trust. Residents interested in applying for a loan will be given a home energy assessment to see which home improvement solution would work best for them.

For further details on the home energy loan scheme call the energy advice line for free on 0800 500 3076.

CHANGES TO BIN COLLECTIONS

Changes and Charges for Green Bins will not start until April 2014 and SITA will be producing information nearer the time.

A charge of £36 for kerbside collection of green bins, and for those who only need occasional collection there are 'pay as you go' bags, priced at £2 each. Home composting is to be further encouraged, with encouraging Compost Champions!

The review of compost sites like ours, will take place after the introduction of the charging in April – no doubt on how to deal with the increased waste.

There will also be increased recycling of mixed plastics and drinks cartons – but I have been told, further information for all residents is on its way.
