Hawkesbury Volunteer Transport Group - Latest News

As some of our passengers are well aware, over the past few months, HVT has been experiencing a real problem with the lack of a usable telephone signal.

This has resulted in some messages being left on the voice mail, but, due to the lack of a signal, the message is getting "stuck in the ether" somewhere, and not going to the telephone, hence the Co-ordinator has not received the request.

Vicki has been busy trying to solve the problem, by contacting the provider for advice and she has also purchased a new telephone. Unfortunately this does not seem to have resolved the problem. Due to this ongoing problem, and until it is resolved, if you have left a message on the HVT answer phone, and have not received a return call within 24 hours, please contact me, Alan, on 01454 238788 and I will pass on your request to the appropriate Co-ordinator. If anyone does have a mobile that works throughout the village, would they be so kind as to let me have the details.

Please remember HVT has a zero tolerance for rudeness directed at any member of HVT be they Co-ordinator or Driver. HVT is not a taxi or private hire company, it is a volunteer group of people who willingly support HVT by allocating their time for the benefit of the community.

When requesting transport please be sure to tell the Co-ordinator, your name, which hospital or clinic you wish to go to, what date you wish to travel, the time of your appointment, as well as a rough idea of the appointment duration, and also any special requirements. Long appointments may require two journey's with different Drivers.

HVT will always try its hardest to meet every request for transport to a medical related appointment as it has done for the past seven years, but it cannot guarantee that a Driver will always be available.

In the period of operating to the end of September, HVT had driven 44560 miles and completed 1794 journeys.



TROWEL & ERROR

Meetings are held at 8pm on the 4th Monday of the month in the Methodist Hall in Back Street.

Our speaker for September was Mr. A.J. Pedrick from Evesham who talked about wall shrubs and climbers. He explained some simple yet oft ignored facts and tips about climbers:-

- 1. Use vine eyes to keep climbers away from walls.
- 2. If you are wondering why the clematis that you planted in 1945 seems a little worse for wear it might be that it needs a bit of feeding right now.
- Use slow release feed blocks when planting in pots. If you buy a potted climber from a nursery and the compost has a block of little yellow balls do not complain to the seller - they are not slug eggs. Slug eggs are white.
- There are 5 steps to pruning secateurs, lopper, hand saw, chain saw and JCB. It's your choice.
- 5. To check if a pot plant needs watering stick your thumb in the compost. If your thumb stays dirty after you've wiped it on your clothes then the compost is wet enough. This is called a 'Rule of Thumb'. This is probably an illegal piece of

- advice since thumbs have not been authorised by the EU for this use see item 6.
- 6. If your thumb comes out clean then the compost is very dry. Put a few drops of washing-up liquid in the water. This will help the compost to absorb the water. Please note that this advice is actually discouraged by the EU because it is not the primary use of washing-up liquid which makes it illegal to disseminate which makes it necessary for all of us to tell as many people as possible.

A talk to warm the cockles



"Some like it hot!"

Lisa White will give a light-hearted investigation of heating (or lack of it) in old houses, with a special emphasis on the beauty and expense of chimneypieces. How many historic houses do we visit to admire paintings, plasterwork, tapestries, furniture, silver and porcelain, but forget to look at the fireplace? In 1756 the architect Isaac Ware wrote: "No article in a well-finished room is so essential. The eye is immediately cast upon it upon entering, and the place of sitting down is naturally near it. By this means, it becomes the most eminent thing in the finishing of an apartment." Even when central heating made open fires in the home a thing of the past, many of us still yearn for the cheerful sight of brightly-burning logs in the hearth as the dark, chill evenings descend on us. In

1906 Baillie Scott said the open fire "is practically a substitute for the sun... to live in a scientifically adjusted temperature with the fire relegated to the basement, is to live in a grey and cheerless world". So come and cheer up, warm up and enjoy the crackle!



Great Nut Hunt -

Help us find out about dormice this autumn at our Lower Woods nature reserve, near Hawkesbury where we'll be running a Great Nut Hunt to scour the woodland floor for gnawed hazel nuts left by dormice.


Lower Woods is one of the largest ancient woodlands in the southwest of England. An incredible place for wildlife with lots of places for dormice to hide. Because of it's sheer size, the only way we can get a handle on the distribution of dormice within Lower Woods is to enlist the help of the public to find the characteristically gnawed hazel nuts that dormice drop in the autumn.

Previous surveys have only been able to cover a fraction of the woods and we have a very incomplete picture of how important Lower Woods may be for this endangered species.

On Saturday 1st and Sunday 2nd there will be two sessions each day that start at 11am and 2pm.

To help us plan how many parts of the wood we can sample, it would be wonderful if you could let us know if you'd like to attend. Please call Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust on 01452 383333 to book your place. Some last minute drop-ins on the day can be accommodated, although we cannot guarantee which walks will be available as we'll match up a group with a "nutter" an expert who will lead the hunt!

By the end of the event we hope to have a much more complete idea of the distribution and population of dormice in the woods. Participants need to be up for scrambling through the woods in autumn



District Councillor's Report

As reported in the last Parish Magazine, things are moving forward with Super fast Broadband, however parts of the parish still fall outside the upgrade. We have managed to get agreement on a mixed contract for the next phase of the super fast roll out. We also got agreement that officers work with BT on improving the take-up through improved communications and appropriate use of mapping; investigate what level of national support is available to provide expertise to residents on alternative technologies and to explore the possibility for DIY/community broadband schemes, with use of grants/vouchers, to act as a conduit for expert advice. As elements of the take-up are deemed commercially sensitive under the terms of the national contract, the Council will lobby government to ensure that future contracts are more transparent.

Grants

What a busy village - several village organisations were successful in the last round of Area Forum Grants: Cricket

Club, Village Hall, Drama Group and Pre-School - all received funding. Well done to them all. In view of the great demand for funds, the parish council may want to consider raising the level of support it gives to local voluntary groups. The Grant process is changing - I wish I could say it would be more simple - and going on-line. A briefing note has been produced, but all the details have not yet been agreed. I will circulate to village groups once this is finalised, however, to not hesitate to contact me should you require further information. The next round of grants opened on the 20th October and closes on the 17th November. Grant decisions are to be made at the Area Forum and it is hoped to make this more user friendly! The Parish Council has to respond to comments on the Draft Policy Sites and Places document by early November. This includes comments regarding extra housing and green space. Comments received during the consultation will shortly be on the website.. The Council acting as the Commons Registration Authority has agreed to introduce a fee for changes to the Commons Register – this will be introduced when the new registration comes

into force and be reviewed after 12 months.

September and October saw many consultations on the future of Council services in view of shrinking budgets. People were asked to prioritise the services on offer; this includes support to Police Community Support Officers, support for domestic violence victims and the ASBO team. Further consultations on Council savings will become available on the Council website.

HOSPITAL - BUS SERVICES

Press reports are reflecting poor performance figures at the new Southmead Hospital. Although improvements are being made to access to the Hospital, including an hourly bus service from Wotton under Edge (via Charfield/ Wickwar/Yate) being introduced early in November, the performance figures remain poor. Southmead Hosptial is the major trauma hospital for our region.

THE LITTLE FREE LIBRARY MOVEMENT REACHES HAWKESBURY UPTON

Our village is very well served for books. We have fortnightly visits from the mobile library, staffed by lovely people who are always so helpful and friendly. (use it or lose it, folks!) and both the Village Shop and Head Start Studio kindly stock second-hand books for sale at just £1 each, in aid of Hawkesbury Primary School PTA. Every time you buy a book, you also help support the Village Shop, they receive 50p for every book sold. Children at Hawkesbury Primary School also benefit from lovely infant and junior libraries, both beautifully



decorated and well stocked, thanks to the PTA.

But I couldn't resist adding to the mix by installing a Little Free Library on my front garden wall last month. You may have spotted the little wooden hutch which appeared outside Post Cottage, France Lane, during the Scarecrow Trail, alongside my bluestockinged scarecrow Virginia, with her "Books Are My Bag" bag at the ready.

What is a Little Free Library? Well, exactly what it sounds - it's a collection of books that you are free to take away whenever you like. The Little Free Library is open 24/7, 365 days a year. If you'd like to treat it as a book swap and put one back every time you take a new one, that's fine – but if you don't have a suitable one to leave, just take a new one anyway. You can either bring it back when you're done, keep it, or pass it on to a friend – it's entirely up to you. The stock for the library comes from donations, so if you'd like to leave a book without taking one, that's fine

The Little Free Library movement was founded in 2009 in the USA by Todd Bol in memory of his late mother, a former schoolteacher and avid reader. Originally he just made his own library, but it soon captured the imagination of friends and neighbours, and before long he was being asked to make more for friends, and the interest kept growing and spreading. There are

now an estimated 15,000 Little Free Libraries in the USA, and the movement is spreading around the world.

It's a great way to make books accessible around the clock to anyone in search of a book, including those who don't have a public library within reach or who can't afford books. It's also great for anyone who simply can't resist the opportunity to try new books!

So please feel free to help yourself to my Little Free Library whenever you're passing. I've started it off with a mix of fiction, non-fiction and something for young readers, but the stock will be constantly changing, so you'll have to take pot-luck! Our involvement with the scheme has already attracted attention from around the world – it's been featured on the Little Free Library's Facebook page, as well as in my blog (visit www.authordebbieyoung.com and put "Little Free Library" in the search box).


