The executive summary

WE DID IT!


Just after 5pm on Sunday September 27th, 29 hours after starting in Chipping Campden, we completed the 102 miles of the Cotswold Way.

The support we had on the route was amazing; the reception we got in Hawkesbury itself was a truly humbling experience and will forever live in our memory.

Thank you so much to everyone who cheered us on during the event and during the training. Thanks to your kind donations almost £2000 has been raised for the Village Hall, which will be put towards a refit of the kitchen. The slightly longer version

Well we couldn't have asked for better weather conditions for the weekend. The start at midday meant it was warm, but not too hot. As you can see from the medal, this is no flat race, so it was pleasing to see most of the 90 competitors doing what we were doing and walking the up the first hill. Notice how the medal says racing, rather than running. Running the whole thing would be suicidal, especially when you're built like a prop rather than a scrum half.

We had a time plan and were tracking it well as we went through the lovely early miles round Broadway, Stanway and Winchcombe. Up to the long barrow at Bela's Knap and then down to the foot of Cleeve Hill. Then as we climb (take it as read that we were

either going up or down all of the time) to Cleeve, our first roving support group come into sight, a welcome boost at the 20 mile mark.

Then the first "On a Yard" poster was spotted – high up in a tree, how could it possibly have got there? Another mental boost, the chest puffs out a bit, the arms pump a little faster.

Then onwards to the first cut off point at Agg's Hill; we were 27 miles in at 6pm, an hour ahead of cut off. Here we could feast on marmite sandwiches and malt loaf that we'd packed in a "drop bag." A change of top and then we head off. We witnessed here the sobering sight of 2 people drop out, one with heat stroke / dehydration. The sun sets over the Welsh hills, the

head torches are switched on, 30 miles

down, many tough ones ahead. Our bodies were still functioning pretty well as we made it to the Birdlip checkpoint for a morale boosting cup of soup and even better news that England are leading at half time.

Just as we approached Cooper's Hill, the 1 in 2 scarp of cheese rolling fame, we got the confirmation that Wales have won the rugby – not a huge morale boost! We zig zagged up the side, our calf muscles burning. Soon enough, the lights of Painswick rugby club approached and then we got a cheer as more roving support wished us well; they'd spent 30 minutes standing in a cold field close to midnight for a snippet of second rate conversation from us – it didn't seem right, but it was all we could spare.

Once inside the rugby club there was time for clothes changes, more sandwiches and some bean chilli. After 25 minutes we were back out into the cold night; we encountered rolling wooded hills before the big drop down to the Stroud canal and then the climb up Frocester Hill to Coaley Peak. By this point both of us were feeling nauseous; the body focuses all its effort on moving the legs — to save on having to digest, it brings on nausea to prevent us eating. We knew that we had to fight back against our own bodies.

3:30am and "Gentlemen of Hawkesbury" reverberated around the base of Cam Long Down as more friends came out to support us; more brief chat, post match analysis and again we left supporters who had waited a long time. Then into Dursley and at 4:15am the best tasting sausage buttie and cup of tea we have ever tasted, courtesy of another roving supporter. That put a spring in our step.

Up round and down Stinchcombe golf course, coffee and encouragement in North Nibley and then the climb up to the Tyndale monument as the faintest light is visible to the East. There was a welcome checkpoint at Wotton; rice pudding for brekkie? Yes please! We steeled ourselves for the worst climb of the whole route as we left Wotton, Blackquarries Hill. This was at mile 71; we fought it, we cursed it, we turned east as we reached the peak; a glorious morning was dawning all around. As is tradition when we greet the dawn on a run, the Radio 4 theme tune is played – we ran along to its patriotic strains as tears welled in the eyes. The physical challenge was expected, but we now felt as if we were being emotionally peeled back to the core too.

As we climbed up from Kilcott, the first outriders appeared. "There's one or two people to see you at Farm Pool" we were told. As we turned down from the Monument, what a sight greeted us. "Game faces on" said Jim, "I don't think I have a game face" said Dave as tears flowed again.

The most amazing sight greeted us; Hawkesbury in stunning Sunday sunshine, a 50+ crowd, banners, flags, bacon butties, cheers, good wishes, huge pieces of cake, coffee, cuddles, kisses, quiet words, shouts of support, cleaning of teeth (God that felt good), smiles and applause. Hawkesbury you truly were and always will be magnificent. We cannot thank you enough – the next few miles were the easiest on the route as we felt like we were running on clouds of air.

Now we could start to think about the distance left to go rather than the miles covered. It is 9am and there were still 25 miles to go, with 9 hours left. A brief pause at Horton school where the runners who came before us had regaled the marshalls with tales of amazing support in a small village just up the road. Nice work Hawkesbury! Running became less frequent and shorter, walking took over, Jim striding out. More roving support appeared - 5 different people over 5 miles. There is one thread to their support and our thoughts "Just get it done".

We had more bacon at Tormarton as we left the final "cut off point" with time in hand – there were now 15 miles to go in 6 hours. Down we dropped to the back of Dyrham and then climbed up to Cold Ashton. 5 miles in 95 minutes; as fatigue took its toll, we couldn't believe how long that had taken us.

Down and up Hanging Hill to Lansdowne. It was as hot as an oven now; Dave was drinking like a fish, blisters were agony as every step on the stony descents sent shards of pain up through the legs. Our bodies were now running on empty, it felt as if we were moving by memory alone. Whilst physically we were broken, mentally we felt strong. That was important; as the old adage goes – "90% of trail running is mental, the other 10%'s in the head."

Down we dropped to Weston, the final checkpoint at 4:10 pm, just 2.5 miles now. More support was so welcome at the CP, and then on up the final sting in the tail that is Sion Hill. Finally the Royal Crescent came into view, Sunday strollers all around us as we walked down into Bath. As we made the final turn to the Abbey, with the last running our legs had to offer we

finished with cheers from our supporters echoing around the walls.

A handshake, a hug, and the final realisation – we were Centurions – we had managed 102 miles and 12,000 feet of climbing (that's the Three Peaks, and then Snowdon again). Oh, and 275 gates and 42 stiles, 15 churches or abbeys and 10 sports venues, 3 burial mounds and 5 hill forts; counting had given our minds something to do along the way.

Post run, walking from the car to the front door was challenging. Then food and sleep, not necessarily in that order! On Monday it was quite a surprise to find the legs were still attached and willing to function, at least well enough to stagger to the pub for two main courses and a pudding (each).

We'd like to thank everyone who supported us, both on the day and in the months leading up to it. Every time the phone vibrated we knew it was more. To all those who saw us at Farm Pool, thank you for cheering us and all the other runners, it meant a lot to be met with so many people, it was a most humbling experience. And to our roving support crew, thank you so much; what time you spend waiting for us to cheer us on our way. There were hard times, and knowing that we had such tremendous support really kept us going. Mentally, we knew that we could not let you down, we owed you all such a debt. We're delighted that we brought it home for you, and that, thanks to your generosity, we have raised such funds for the wonderful Village Hall.

Our final thanks have to go to our families, who have supported us unconditionally and put up with all the hours of training, the endless talk and planning. As well as our love we can offer you one other thing, the promise never to run that far again!

TROWEL & ERROR

It appears that Gardeners Delight tomatoes have mutated and now grow to a much larger size. Unfortunately the taste has deteriorated also. Some members have experienced this for themselves. The cause is being investigated.

Our speaker for September was John Mason from Highfield Garden World who gave a very entertaining talk and demonstration on Winter Container Plants. John started out as a nurseryman and worked his way up to become a departmental manager in the familyrun business. He gave a very amusing explanation as to why garden centres today are as much about providing a shopping experience as they are about plants and garden-related stuff.

John brought along a large range of plants and plant pots and showed us the proper way to choose, pot and display potted plants. He has two main messages:-

First make sure that the pot is big enough for the plant to grow and that the shape will allow you to remove the plant when it is ready for re-potting and secondly, do not buy cheap potting compost because it is cheap for a reason. Usually that reason is that cheap composts do not contain peat and if it does not contain peat then it is not a lot of good. Wise words!

At our October meeting delegate Gill Truebody gave

a full report of Avon Federation's AGM held at Thornbury. Gill said Federation Chairman, Donna Butcher, had highlighted some of the many events which had taken place in celebration of a hundred years of the WI. During the day there had also been a presentation by the charity Great Western Air Ambulance, with a moving tribute by an accident survivor.

In support of the charity Avon Federation have made a collection of Bras. These will be sold on by the charity to raise funds for their life saving work. The helicopter used is fully equipped as a mini hospital and can reach difficult locations quicker than any other form of transport. They are now raising funds for another.

There were congratulations to our quiz team Jenny Harris, Barbara Harvey, Pat Seabrook and Sue Hope, on winning the Federation Quiz. They have been awarded the Avon Federation Challenge Shield. Speaker for the evening, Mary

Hinton, hedgehog warden for Tetbury, said she became involved in hedgehog rescue about eight years ago, when travelling at night, she saw a hedgehog at the side of the road looking very poorly. Having taken it home she contacted The Help A Hedgehog Hospital which had been started the year before by Annie Parfitt. Annie took it in but suggested Mary went on a day course to find out more about their care. Mary did, and was hooked! Her converted garage is now a hedgehog hospital named Hogwarts, also there are three more. To everyone's delight Mary brought along a young hoglet in her care. She said any hedgehog under 600 grms in weight now is unlikely to survive the winter, so those brought in are cared for until release in Spring. Last year 120 were released to safe sites.

Mary said there has been a serious decline in numbers, from an estimated 54 million in the 1950's to under a million now. Reasons given are increased urbanization and

 increased use of pesticides. Many also fall victim to strimmers and mowers and she asked us to check areas to be cut first. And with the 5th November approaching she said she wishes people would check round the edges of fires before lighting, and also try to build them near the time of burning as hedgehogs use them to hibernate. At the end of her talk we were able to purchase lots of items connected to hedgehog rescue; all raising money for the good work. The vote of thanks was given by Pat Sherry.



In December 2014, 207 senior citizens received £10. This included residents of Beaufort House. (The monies were used to give all residents a Christmas treat.)


The fund is still reasonably healthy, but each year we will continue to need fundraising events and donations to enable us to continue with this great tradition of the community that is Hawkesbury Upton.



Hawkesbury Local History Society

A thousand years ago, in addition to toiling on the land for his lord, the Hawkesbury peasant would have had his own strip of soil to cultivate in the extensive Open Fields of what was then a very large manor. Times have changed,



populations have fluctuated, and now the Hawkesbury resident probably has a garden to tend and possibly an allotment as well. The allotment system we know today, providing land for the 'labouring poor' on which to grow food crops, evolved during the 19th century and was consolidated by the Small Holdings and Allotments Act of 1908 by which a local authority is still obliged to provide allotments if there is demand from more than six people. Enthusiasm for allotment gardening raged during the two World Wars, suffered a decline in the years after both but, due to a certain television programme in the 1970s (and who can forget Tom and Barbara's attempts at self-sufficiency in 'The Good Life'?) and the cascade of information and inspiration in the 21st century, there has been a resurgence of interest; once again allotment plots are like 'gold dust'. Whether you merely dabble in your garden or are serious

competitors at the annual Hawkesbury Horticultural Show, buy all your fruit and veg from Tesco's or have a freezer full of 'home grown', and whether or not you rent an allotment, you'll find much to enjoy in **FIONA WARIN's** entertaining romp through 'A HISTORY OF ALLOTMENT GARDENING'.

Wanted - School Appeal Panel Members

Do you have excellent listening skills?

Do you have the ability to put people at ease and make balanced decisions?

Would you like to become involved in an important, impartial service provided to parents and schools?

We are looking for new volunteers to become members of the South Gloucestershire Independent Appeals Panel. Panel members must be able to put nervous parents at ease and make balanced decisions to ensure that parents and schools receive a fair appeal hearing.

What do panels do?

If a parent is refused a place at their preferred school for their child or if their child has been permanently excluded from school they can appeal to an independent panel. The Panel will consider the special circumstances of the parent's case, the reasons why the admission authority refused their child a place or excluded their child from school and makes a decision on the issue.

Who is on the Panel?

We have a pool of members and use three members to sit on our panels. There are two types of member – those with experience of education (i.e. a parent of a child at a school or somebody with experience in education) and "lay" members

(i.e. those without any experience in education).

Each school appeal panel must include a lay member. We, therefore, welcome applications from people without personal experience in the management or provision of education in any school, other than as a governor or in any other voluntary capacity.

We are also seeking applications from people who are school governors, headteachers or former headteachers, teachers or former teachers and parents with children at school. No special qualifications are required.

Appeal hearings are held during the day. Service on the Panel is voluntary, but members are entitled to some expenses (such as travel) and refreshments are provided for panel members throughout the day. All new panel members will receive training before taking part in an appeal and training will take place at Kingswood Civic Centre on Tuesday 24th November 2015, commencing at 10.00am. Refresher training is provided every year.

Letter from the Vicar - November 2015

Dear Friends,

We must all be exercised by the images on our television screens of Refugees and economic migrants holed up at Calais or on the borders of East European countries. As the weather turns to winter and the ferocious cold that can be experienced in much of Europe, our compassion and concern increases.

Obviously there are some who merit more concern than others. Economic migrants are trying to better their lives, but they are not forced from their homes in the same way that refugees are. Refugees fleeing war zones and living with the peril of being killed or watching their children starve to death, is a completely different matter from those simply trying to earn more money.

The other complication is that as the Prime Minister has indicated with his funding, it is better to help people on the borders of their country, than to encourage a mass exodus to Europe. No one wants to see a trail of millions of homeless refugees coming across Europe. Most countries simply can not cope with that sort of population surge. Schools, hospitals, services and other infrastructure are not built for that sort of influx of people.

However, we see the television pictures and our Christian compassion is stirred. The Good Samaritan could have simply turned round to the man robbed and beaten up on the road to Jericho and said: 'You should have known better than to travel on this road at this time of day, unarmed and on your own!' And if he had, then the story would not be the great Christian parable about who is our neighbour that Jesus calls us to love.

So, the refugee is our neighbour. And we can not just walk on by as if we do not care what happens to him/her. But neither must we assume that our charity is necessarily the only answer. There are political issues, military issues, issues of an economic and practical nature.

And within all that is the Christian commandment to love our neighbour. My prayer is that between the generosity and hospitality of the everyday Christian, the astuteness of the politician, and the courage of the armed forces, peace can soon be resumed in Syria and people return to their homes.





What a song! This song comforted children in a Japanese Weihsien concentration camp. In his book "A Boy's War", David Mitchell tells of a lad in a boarding school in Chefoo, China when they were taken to this camp by the Japanese military. His name was Brian Thompson. One evening, 12 months before war ended, Brian was restless waiting for roll call. Some boys were jumping up and touching a wire hanging from a searchlight tower, so he joined in. Brian, being taller, brought the wire down but as his bare feet touched the damp soil, electricity went through his body like a lightning bolt! Someone found an old wooden stool to pull the wire from his body but...it was too late! David Mitchell recorded in his book how the next day, the Principal of the school led a solemn but triumphant funeral service. The shortness of life and the reality of eternity were brought home to those who were there that day. Brian missed roll call in camp but had answered one in heaven! How important to sing and know – "When the roll is called up yonder, I'LL BE THERE!"

Hawkesbury and Inglestone Commons Officer

I have now been in post for a little over a month as South Gloucestershire Councils Hawkesbury and Inglestone Commons Officer. I normally work on a Monday and Tuesday with my main role being the delivery of the Higher Level Stewardship Scheme (HLS). As a former adviser for Natural England providing advice and guidance on HLS I am finding it really interesting to be at the sharp end of getting things done rather than just talking about it! A fascinating project to 'bring back the buttercup' to Inglestone Common instigated by my predecessor Ellie Phillips, is now underway. This little plant, the adder's tongue spearwort is one of a number of plants which once thrived in cattle poached pond edges

and muddy drove roads and its decline tells a story of changing land use over time. The fact that it is holding on at Inglestone says much about this ancient landscape. The project aims to improve the habitat and bulk up and plant out new adder's tongue spearwort from locally sourced seed. It is a huge advantage to still have cattle grazing on the commons and a string of wet pools and muddy depressions where it once grew. Many of these pools have disappeared in recent years under a fringe of scrub pushing out of Spoil Coppice and parts of Green Trench had become impassable due to scrub and fallen trees. This has now been carefully cut back and roots removed opening up the area and creating the bare ground we are after.

Work had to proceed with caution to minimise potential disturbance to great crested newts and dormice and be completed before they started to hibernate. It is hoped that longer term cattle will mooch through the area helping to keep it open. Reports from Kew confirm that the initial germination of seed held at the Millennium Seed Bank has been successful with a batch being grown on to maturity producing plenty of new seed for the second phase of the project.



New opening times at the Sort It centres

From 1 October 2015

ALL of the Sort It Centres will open Monday to Sunday 08:30am to 4:30pm all year round*

Little Stoke Sort It centre - re-open on Wednesdays

*except Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day when they will be closed

Residents using large vans to deposit household waste can continue to use the sites

Monday to Friday – 10am to 2pm Saturday – 8:30am to 12pm Sunday – no access

The height and trailer restrictions at Little Stoke Sort It centre still apply.

Trade and commercial waste cannot be accepted at any of the Sort It centres.

Facilities for commercial waste are available at the transfer stations next to the Sort It centres at Mangotsfield and Yate.

The Sort It centres are for the sole use of South Gloucestershire residents and you may be asked for proof of residency and identification when visiting the site.

Why are the opening times changing?

Changing opening times at the Sort It centres is the first step to making improvements to them and reducing the number of non residents and traders using the sites. These have been agreed by the Communities Committee following a public consultation that took place November 2014 to February 2015.

We have reviewed the number of people visiting the Sort It centres and found that they are not used very much during the longer opening hours in the summer. The new opening times have been based on the times when the sites are used the most.

Making opening times shorter during the summer also means that we can now reopen the Little Stoke Sort It Centre on Wednesdays.

What else is changing?

In 2016 the following changes will be introduced:

- residents vehicle registration scheme to make sure that only South Gloucestershire residents can use the sites
- electronic permits for all vans, replacing the current van access policy to reduce commercial use of the sites. Vans will be restricted to 12 visits a year
