



New Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator appointed

My announcement in the Parish Magazine has worked and we now have a new Co-ordinator for the Neighbourhood Watch, who is Graham Chamberlain from Inglestone Common where he has lived for the last 16 years. He has been supported by the other Contact people and will take over this role with immediate effect.

Graham is a retired Police Officer so an ideal candidate for this role – his email address is <u>inglestone1@gmail.com</u> and telephone number 01454 294520.

However, the NHW co-ordinator is not the Police so if you see something suspicious then contact the Police direct on the numbers below or if in an emergency then ring 999.

The role of NHW co-ordinator is to give advice and co-ordinate any helpers known as Contact people. They will disseminate useful information that

comes directly from the Police and are there to help give advice if you don't know what action to take. Working together we are the eyes and ears of the community, so if you see a car filled with suspicious looking characters parked near some property and are unsure of what to do then ring either Graham or your nearest Contact person. I have to say in the 16 years I have been doing the role it has only happened on a rare occasion. However, we did one year spot a van that had a wanted registration number and the culprit was subsequently arrested!

I wish Graham the very best for his future role.

Horton Court Project Update

Good news that we have appointed a main contractor for the refurbishment project. Corbel Conservation will be starting on site week commencing 31 October for a year-long programme of works.

Due to bats in the roof the demolition of the inner courtyard bathrooms will take place in April/ May next year but there is plenty to be getting on with in the meantime. The old defunct swimming pool has been infilled already with soil - we carefully removed 10 palmate newts and some dragon fly larvae before we started.

We'll be leaving the paving slabs around the edge in situ so that in future we will be able to know where the pool once was.

Hawkesbury and Inglestone Commons Officer

Warm dry weather in the first half of October saw flocks of finches feeding on seed heads on the commons, a red kite overhead and provided ideal conditions for pond works. The temporary ponds had all but dried out and the work to cut scrub back from around the edges to let light in went ahead without creating mud or soil compaction. It is the seasonal nature of the ponds that makes them so special for rare plants and animals which complete their lifecycles before the

ponds dry out, so care was taken not to dig out or deepen them. The wildflower seeding on Hawkesbury Common has been completed with seed harvested this summer from Yarley meadow mixed with seed harvested last year from Hawkesbury meadow. Spare seed has been sown at Avon Valley Woodland local nature reserve near Hanham, it will be interesting to compare progress of their 'Hawkesbury meadow' with the commons. Assley common has seen an increase in rush in recent years, this spikey plant is common in damp meadows, its stiff stems are avoided by cattle but can provide cover for ground nesting birds. It has been topped in late summer / autumn to avoid birds and when the ground is at its driest, this should check its progress and favour more palatable grasses and wildflowers. **Ann Harris**



Local Night-time and Anti-poaching Operations

Wiltshire Police have stopped and checked more than fifty vehicles in a joint operation with Avon and Somerset Police colleagues to tackle rural crime.

Since 31 August 2016 they have stopped and checked more these vehicles in two overnight operations which have also led to one person being issued with a cannabis warning, two uninsured vehicles being taken off the road and high-powered lamps suspected of being used in poaching being seized, while two men are currently on police bail following their arrest on suspicion of poaching. Officers from Wiltshire's Rural Crime Team and Malmesbury and Chippenham rural Neighbourhood Policing Teams helped in the operations.

PC Dan Jones said: "We are running these operations as a result of information from the community about rural crime, especially poaching. We've had really good feedback from local people. I hope they feel reassured by the action we've been taking and that criminals will think twice about offending in the area. "We know these criminals don't worry about causing damage to crops and property when they trespass for game. They're not above theft of other property while they're there either. It's important for people to keep passing on information about criminal activity in their neighbourhood so that we can continue to carry out these targeted operations.

"Poaching and other rural crimes have a significant impact on communities, as

well as causing unnecessary suffering to animals. Poaching is not nowadays about an individual taking one or two animals for the pot – it's organised groups taking game and livestock to sell into the food chain. It's all about the money, with no regard for the welfare of the animals or the unsuspecting end customer.

"Any business supplying food, whether for profit or not, has a legal obligation to ensure it is fit to eat. A number of potential health risks are associated with the consumption of illegally-caught wild game, not least faecal and environmental contamination from

these criminals' unhygienic processing techniques."

The operation involved joint patrols of an area on the Wiltshire-Gloucestershire border between Chipping Sodbury and Hullavington.

Hawkesbury notes (2) -

Rev. William Boothby and Cropredy House

In 1849, Rev. William Henry Boothby was appointed vicar of the parish of Hawkesbury, succeeding Henry Jones Randolph, who retired in that year. William Boothby was a direct descendant (g.g.g.g. grandson) of Sir Henry Boothby, who was created Baronet in 1644, initially of Clate-Clote, Oxfordshire (later known as Clattercote), and subsequently (1660) of Broadlow Ash, Derbyshire.

Rev. W. H. Boothby was the nephew of Sir William Boothby (1782-1846), whose first wife was Fanny Jenkinson, sister of both Sir Charles Jenkinson*, 10th Baronet Hawkesbury, and Rev. John Bankes Jenkinson who had been vicar at Hawkesbury (1805-1813) before being appointed bishop of St. David's. This was the first link by marriage between the Boothby and Jenkinson families; a second occurred in the following generation when Rev John Bankes Jenkinson's daughter Frances Sarah married W H Boothby's cousin Henry Brooke Boothby.

* Sir Charles Jenkinson, as lord of

the manor of Hawkesbury, held the advowson of the parish (the right to present a candidate as vicar), and it appears that he nominated his new son-in-law's cousin, Rev. W. H. Boothby, when the living became available.

At some time during his incumbency at Hawkesbury, Rev. W. H. Boothby acquired what is now The Old Vicarage, opposite the Beaufort Arms in Hawkesbury Upton, which was occupied for a while by his curate, William Fossett, and later by other members of Hawkesbury's clergy.

The Old Vicarage was previously known as Cropredy House, since its purchase, possibly in the 1860s, by Rev. W. H. Boothby, whose ancestor lived at Clattercote, formerly a Gilbertine priory; Clattercote was originally in the parish of nearby Cropredy (nowadays known for its annual folk and rock music festival). This would explain Rev. Boothby's original naming of Cropredy House.

Tyndale Monument 150th Anniversary Celebrations By Peter Salenieks

On a clear day, you can see the Tyndale Monument from the fields around Hawkesbury Upton. It is dedicated to William Tyndale, who first translated the New Testament and much of the Old Testament of the Bible into English so that lay people could read it in their own tongue.

The monument was opened on 1st October 1866, and last month saw a weekend of celebrations to mark the 150th anniversary. These began with a marathon 24-hour biblothon, in which volunteers at North Nibley Chapel read aloud from the entire Tyndale Bible.

A modest crowd gathered around the monument on Saturday afternoon, greeted by music from Wotton-under-Edge Silver Band. Heavy showers blew in from the west as the band played on, accompanied by rumbles of thunder. An evocative brass fanfare from atop the monument served as a prelude for the welcome by Dr Christopher Burns-Cox, Chairman of the Trustees of the Tyndale Monument, who set the scene for a series of speeches, hymns and prayer.

As the foundation stone was laid by the Hon. Colonel Berkeley, it was fitting that one of his descendants should address the gathering, before North Nibley Community Choir sang hymns, with accompaniment by the silver band. The Rev. Lesley Hewish recounted the story of William Tyndale, with the closing prayer lead by Rev. Peter Marsh.

Tea, a warm welcome and "a mountain of cake" awaited us at the chapel, where an exhibition told us more about the story of man and monument, supported by paintings of the monument by pupils from North Nibley Church of England Primary School and images of the monument by local photographers. A highlight of the exhibition was the trowel used to lay the foundation stone plus one of the inscribed bibles that were presented to the builders. The sun shone as we left the exhibition, reflected off the gilded cross on top of the monument and visible from afar.

An evening performance of *Tyndale's Timeline* at St Martins Church rounded off the celebration. This especially commissioned concert featured a combination of music, songs and poetry read with feeling, spanning a five hundred year timeline from the present day back to Tyndale's birth. The hymn *Word of God* was written for the 150th anniversary. Fittingly, it ended the first half with a phrase from the ceremony of inauguration in 1866: "...the light shines in England. The shut bible opens."

My final recollection of the anniversary is looking up from the road beneath Nibley Knoll on the way home to see the Tyndale Monument floodlit, with the stars of the Plough rising above it in the night sky.

Report From Councillor Sue Hope

Policies, Sites and Places DPD

Thank you to all those who responded to the Policies, Sites and Places consultation, especially those who wrote to defend the allotments and other village amenity spaces in the village. The Plan will go before a Planning Inspectorate next spring. To recap on Local Green Space Designation-(this is like Green Belt– the land cannot be built on) :

- Both the Recreation field and the Cricket & Tennis Club have been given Local Green Space Designation (LGSD) (Space has been left around the Village Hall for a possible extension).
- Hawkesbury Upton Pound LGSD
- The site of the Somerset Monument – LGSD
- The land opposite the Somerset Monument is highway land; the parish council has asked for a license to manage this land.
- The Plain has not been granted LSGD; this is adopted highway land and very unlikely to be built on.
- Hawkesbury Pound (by Pound Farm, near the church) is adopted highway land and very unlikely to be built on, but not given LGSD designation.
- The amenity areas around the village; land at Sandpits Lane (the well-used play space), land opposite the Allotments and land adjacent to 15 Highfields have had the objection removed for becoming LGSD and the outcome is awaited.
- The allotment area is allocated as housing land and the objection to this being a LGS has not been removed, although this has been contested by the Parish Council. The Council say that as long as the allotments are viable they will remain as allotments
- The Council received an objection from the landowner for Hawkesbury and Inglestone

Commons to have Local Green Space Designation (LGSD). Part of the area is covered by Site for Special Scientific Interest, but not all the Commons.

And more planning in the pipeline

The Joint Spatial Strategy will be out for consultation on November 7th this gives the strategic plan for the wider area of South Gloucestershire, Bristol, Bath & North East Somerset and North Somerset. A prediction of over 103,000 houses for the area until 2036 - nearly 40,000 more than already planned for. The areas marked for growth in South Glos are Thornbury; a new Garden Village at Buckover (A38); a further 2,600 in the Yate/Sodbury area (on top of the 3,000 houses planned); 1000 in Charfield and major developments in the Coalpit Heath area. Major transport routes are suggested including a new M4 link from the Ring Road and Yate.

Some parish councils have been invited to discuss the developments and all parish councils have been invited to an event on the Plan in early November. For further updates and to respond to the consultation check out www.southglos.gov.uk

I am aware how complicated planning seems to becoming, especially responding to such complex consultations (thankyou to all those that persevered) and I have voiced these concerns to officers. However, coming down the line are further changes to the planning process in the shape of the Housing & Planning Act, however currently there is little information on the detail on these changes.

There is local interest in **Self and Custom Build Houses**. South Gloucestershire Council holds a register for those interested; for further information; check out the Council website to register your interest.

Changes in Bin Collection.

An update on the change to the Bin Collection. The new 140 litre bins will be rolled out next summer after the weekly recycling has been introduced. The bins will be changed over area by area –we have not been told when that will be. A date will not be published for the changeover, it will just happen on a normal collection day, the old bins will be emptied, collected and a new bin delivered!!

A second Library Consultation has now been launched with more detailed information on the future of the libraries. As the mobile library has been axed and it is suggested that Community Libraries be set up. It is hoped that there could be a community centre based library in Hawkesbury Upton. Volunteers and a venue will be required. If you are interested – please get in touch

Metro Mayor –Of the approximately 2000 people that responded to the online consultation there was a slight majority in favour of a Metro Mayor.

The area will become a Mayoral Combined Authority (South Gloucestershire/Bristol/Bath & North East Somerset). If all goes ahead as planned, an election for the new Metro Mayor will take place on the 4th May 2017,

Boundary Review - We are living in a time of change – there are proposals to change the constituency boundaries –this is the area served by the Members of Parliament. There are plans to increase the size of our Thornbury & Yate constituency to include Wotton under Edge, Cam and Dursley.

It took many years to get the anti-slavery bills passed. His moral courage and strength were immense. In 1801, it was rumoured that he would be given a cabinet post. He was most anxious to gain that appointment. By his own admission, the rising ambition was crippling his life. Sunday brought the cure. Wilberforce wrote in his journal at the end of that week of furious fantasising and temptations to press for position – "Blesséd be to God for the day of rest and religious occupation, wherein earthly things assume their true size. Ambition is stunted" William Wilberforce had discovered the importance of Sunday!

Letter from the Vicar — November 2016

Dear Friends,

As I write this, we have been witness to horrible scenes of the bombing in Aleppo on our televisions screens and there have been angry voices raised in the House of Commons.

As I understand it, the eastern part of the city is controlled by the terrorists, and presumably the Syrians and Russians believe that civilians are 'harbouring' the terrorists, and are therefore 'responsible' for the bombing of their neighbourhood.

We have rightly heard Church leaders pleading for an end to the bombing of Aleppo. However, we may like to reflect upon the broader issue of what should be done when the enemy hides amongst civilians. Should we always refuse to bomb the enemy if civilians are going to get hurt?

St Augustine's Just war' theory says that civilians should not be caught up in the conflict. It also says that proportionate force should be used. Whoever is guilty for bringing civilians into the conflict, the bombing surely cannot be thought to be proportionate to the end desired?

Leave gates and property as you find them and follow paths unless wider access is available

A farmer will normally close gates to keep farm animals in, but may sometimes leave them open so the animals can reach food and water. Leave gates as you find them or follow instructions on signs. When in a group, make sure the last person knows how to leave the gates.

Follow paths unless wider access is available, such as on open country or registered common land (known as 'open access land').

If you think a sign is illegal or misleading such as a 'Private - No Entry' sign on a public path, contact the local authority.


