Stop Press! Hawkesbury Upton to get Superfast Broadband

At time of going to press, the announcement came through that South Gloucestershire Council have decided to extend their current broadband rollout to include Horton, Hawkesbury Upton and Marshfield.

Our local MP, Steve Webb got in touch to let us know, as the news was announced.

According to the Council, an additional 1,000 rural homes and businesses in South Gloucestershire are to benefit from the rollout of high-speed fibre broadband thanks to the £35.6 million Great Western Broadband (GWB) partnership between South Gloucestershire Council, Wiltshire Council and BT.

Work has progressed well with the current rollout and the project has

been extended to include the following rural communities within the existing funding: Aust, Hawkesbury Upton, Horton, Marshfield, Winterbourne and additional parts of Pucklechurch and Downend.

The current "Great Western Broadband" project runs to next April, which means that by then the main infrastructure (such as upgraded green cabinets in Horton and Hawkesbury) should be in place to allow most residents to access superfast broadband. This will, of course, be of most benefit to those closest to a green cabinet, and those further away will not be able to achieve such good speeds, but most residents should see a significant improvement on the current

situation.

The first homes and businesses in these locations will be able to order fibre broadband services from early spring next year.

Extending the rollout will increase the total number of premises served by the project to 16,000 on completion in spring 2015.

There is a public meeting on broadband which has been organised by Richard Williams of Horton which is taking place on Thursday 25th September at 7pm at Horton Village Hall. This is still going ahead and Steve Webb will be attending, hoping to provide more information about what is planned.

We'll keep you posted in the next issue of the Parish News.

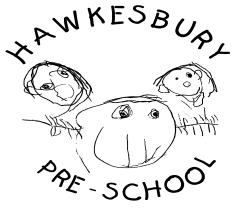

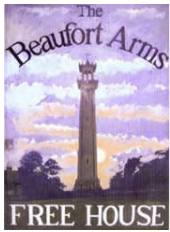

This underrated part of the gardener's

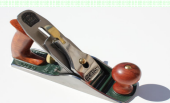

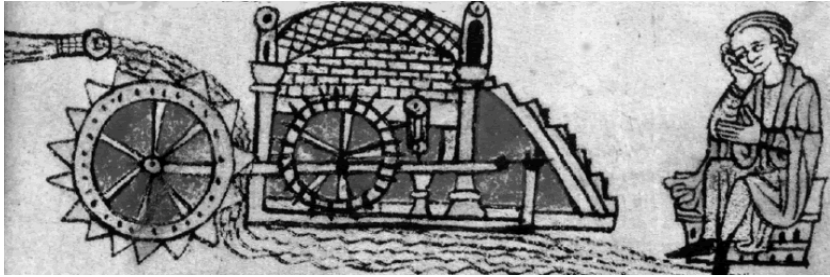

Mills of the Dursley & Wotton-under-Edge Area

At the time of the Domesday Survey, Hawkesbury was said to have three mills; these would have been water driven but their purpose was not recorded. However, there's little doubt that the mill let to Hawisia Walker at Kilcote in 1315 was a fulling mill – with a surname like that she would have 'walked' or beaten hand-woven cloth to 'full' or finish it by shrinking the weave into a solid felted fabric.

The narrow deep valleys of the western Cotswolds escarpment, through which springs '*breke forth at the sydes, knees and feete of those hills*' * and provide a fast flowing supply of clean water, are well suited to the construction of mills and their ponds. In some valleys the constant rate of flow of water, combined with the drop in elevation, produced enough reliable water power for a number of mills to operate downstream of each other at any one time. At least four were operating in Hawkesbury's Kilcote Valley at the time of the Tithe Survey (1844) and there were as many as 30 within a few miles of Wotton-under-Edge. We shall learn a great deal more about the structure, type and function of some of the '*multitude of Tuckmills and fullinge mills which heere abound*' * from:

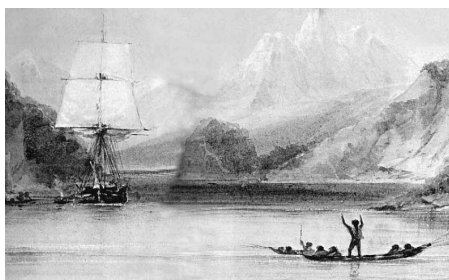

Hawkesbury Upton Neighbourhood Watch Reducing the opportunity for crime



We are reminding people to be careful of phone scammers after several reports of bogus callers claiming to be police or security companies.

There have been several incidents in North Somerset and South Gloucestershire over the last month where residents received a call on their landline from someone purporting to be from either the police or a security company.

An elderly couple in Clevedon, North Somerset, received a call from a man claiming to be from "The Crime Reduction Unit of the police". He was trying to persuade the couple to buy an alarm for £1.00 that would connect them to the local police and fire service. He also wanted to make an appointment to visit their home. They weren't sure about the man so they hung up and told their neighbour, who alerted police.

In a similar vein, an elderly lady in South Gloucestershire was made aware of a potential scam after a friend received a call. When she then got a phone call herself she was prepared.

She was called by a man who stated he was from a security company wanting to conduct a home survey. She asked for the proposal to be put in writing and for a letter to be sent with some literature to her so she could speak to her son, at which point the man put the phone down.

PC Fin Simmons from Avon and Somerset Police said: "I encourage people to take care when they received unsolicited calls from people. The two ladies who received calls did exactly the right thing in trying to get the person to prove their identity. Reputable companies or genuine callers will be happy to prove who they are and provide identification.

"It's important to reiterate the more we talk about these scams, the more people are made aware of them the less likely they are to become victims. Please spread the word to your relatives, neighbours, colleagues and friends, especially those who are elderly or vulnerable.

"If you are unsure of anyone asking you for details, we would advise you to be overly cautious. There are some simple but effective measures people can take to minimise the risk of becoming a victim of these scams."

- If someone claims to be from a company check their details, look at their website and see if they have any testimonials.
- Call the company, but don't use a number the caller gives you. Look one up on the internet or in a phone directory. Before you make the call, either use a different telephone or wait for a dialling tone to ensure the bogus callers are not still on the line.
- If the person claims to be from the local police, always ask for their collar number or staff I.D number. Every officer or staff member has one. You can then call 101 to check they are who they say they are.
- Don't release any personal information including any bank details that could be exploited unless you have confirmed the caller is genuine and reputable and you actually need what is being offered.
- The police and the banks will never ask you for banking details or PIN numbers on the phone.

If you have information about any crime, phone the police on 101 or you can call anonymously to the independent charity CRIMESTOPPERS 0800 555 111. For general information about Neighbourhood Watch nationally see the www.ourwatch.org.uk website.

Thank you very much for the donation of £321.00 for our Gaza emergency appeal, for which our receipt is enclosed. Please pass on our thanks to everyone involved in the "Songs of Praise" event.

Our partners on the ground have described widespread destruction to agricultural land and homes – the true and utterly devastating extent of which is not yet known. There is a severe shortage of medical supplies in hospitals treating the wounded. Hospitals and shelters are overwhelmed by the masses of people in need of urgent help.

Working in an incredibly dangerous environment, our partner Palestinian Medical Relief Society (PMRS) are managing to operate two mobile clinics. They are providing comprehensive and desperately needed emergency healthcare and treatment to approximately 8,000 people every day who are taking refuge in UN schools. They will be extending their work as soon as possible to reach thousands more injured people with vital medical supplies, medication and rehabilitation such as physiotherapy, as well as providing food aid.

More than 215,000 people have now fled their homes. Many are forced to sleep in doorways and stairwells without access to water, food or electricity. There is severe damage to water and sanitation facilities. In light of the critical humanitarian needs, our partner the Agricultural Development Association ("PARC") will be providing access to safe, clean drinking water to 20,000 people every day.

Despite the dangers, the Culture and Free Thought Association (CFTA) has been out on the streets of Gaza providing mattresses and hygiene kits to people who have been left effectively homeless by the continuous bombings and missile attacks. Khan Younis, the location of one of CFTA's centres, has been a major target of the ground offensive. As soon as it is safe for them to do so they will provide psychological and social support to more than 1,000 children who have suffered in unimaginable and horrific ways as a result of what they have seen and experienced.

I'm Jamming...

No, not in the Bob Marley and the Wailers sense (much as I love them), but in terms of preserving fruit.

I hadn't made jam for years, but when I ran out of jam on a Sunday after the village shop had closed, I decided to bite the bullet - or rather the gooseberry - not least because I still had last year's fruit in my freezer. I'd been lapped by the seasons.

Before dusting off my old jam kettle, hanging redundant in the larder for years, I consulted my book of jam recipes. Its pages bear so many splodges that it almost counts as scratch-and-sniff. The book reminded me what a gloriously simple process jam-making is. It's more like chemistry than cooking, and when it goes well, with the kettle full and fragrantly bubbling, it's as exciting as discovering the secret of alchemy.

When my first batch produced the perfect set, I was glad I hadn't forgotten how to do it. Jam-making is thus rather like riding a bicycle, only stickier.

And what a difference there is in the taste! Home-made jam is to factory jam as swimming in the sea is to a dip in Yate pool. It's like seeing an Old Master in a gallery rather than in a picture book, or viewing a landscape with the naked eye rather than through a camera lens. It's a genuine, all-round sensory experience.

My first taste of this batch of gleaming red gooseberry and apple jam, a tantalising medley of colour, sharpness and sweetness, put me in mind of the moment when I got my first prescription glasses and looked out of the window at the woodland on the hill beyond the garden.

"My goodness, have those trees always had so many separate leaves?" I wondered, used to seeing just a large green blur.

My biggest problem now will be to make these jars last. After all, it's never too early to start planning for the Hawkesbury Show...

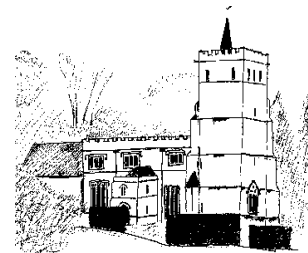

Bonfires

If you are having a bonfire, you need to be considerate towards your neighbours. Otherwise, your bonfire could be classed as a statutory nuisance under the Environmental Protection Act of 1990.

We recommend you find other ways of disposing of waste, such as recycling. With the increase in identity thief, people are increasingly starting to burn personal documents. South Gloucestershire Council advice is to purchase a shredder which is now readily available at a reasonable price.

If you go ahead with a bonfire, please follow this advice:

- Make sure the material is dry before it is burnt. This makes the combustion process more effective
- If a pile of waste has been there for some time, check there are no animals living in it
- Check the waste to make sure there are no pressurised containers or other items that are dangerous to burn
- Do not burn materials such as household rubbish, rubber tyres, paint, foam or anything containing plastic
- Do not start or encourage the fire using substances such as old engine oil, methylated spirits or petrol
- **Talk to your neighbours before having a bonfire, to avoid potential problems such as smoke blowing over clean washing or through open windows**
- **Check the wind direction before lighting your bonfire, to make sure the smoke will blow away from your neighbours**

Contrary to popular belief, there are no byelaws governing the time that you can have a bonfire. Again, the golden rule is that you must not cause a smoke nuisance.
