

### New Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator - could it be you?

Some months ago now, I mentioned that I wanted to step down as the Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator and ceased providing any reports in 2015. Having done it now for 16 years I feel it is time to let someone else have a go. However, the situation has come to a head as the Police require the Watch to sign up for another period of time and if no-one is going to take on the role **then the Watch will have to close**.

This does have a few implications and this is what the Police have reported:

"If we don't get anyone to return the forms we will sadly have to close the Hawkesbury Upton scheme. This means that you will no longer receive any messages and advice from the Police via the Alerts system. Any street signs will have to be taken down as they will no longer have any public liability insurance and the post-owner will withdraw their permission to use their property. Anyone who currently claims a discount on their household insurance must inform their insurers that they no longer belong to an active NHW, which will probably incur a policy increase." There are no signs, as we had objections by some residents to the signs some years ago, so they have gradually disappeared and have not been replaced. However, there may be an impact upon your household insurance policies for no longer being in a Watch area.

So this can be avoided if anyone will take on the role, I am happy to stay on as a Contact person and there is a network of people on email who will get alerts that relate to our area, plus a few other Contact people.



We thought we would write a little piece about Lee's Christmas lights, as there will be some families now in the village that are not aware why they are called *"Lee's Lights"*.

Lee our very special son, had a very rare muscular dystrophy condition, which meant he was unable to breathe by himself and was on a ventilator 24 hours a day, and had muscle weakness which meant he needed 24 hour care. Lee and our family were given amazing support with fundraising from the village, family and friends to allow him to live at home with us and enjoy as normal a life as possible, despite many challenges he faced & we could not have done this on our own . Originally Lee attended Claremont School in Bristol but with the support of Hawkesbury School and South Glos Council he was eventually able to attend Hawkesbury Primary School which he enjoyed so much.

Lee was so happy at school, and had lots of friends and support but unfortunately died 2nd October 2004 aged 8, following which a lovely

After Lee died we decided we would like to have something special to 'remember' him by in the village each year, and for it to be something for children to enjoy, so decided it would be nice to have Christmas lights & a fund raising evening was arranged to purchase the first set. Lee loved Christmas lights.

The first year and then for several years after we were helped by Steve and Sandra Watts, and without their help we would not have been able to get started, so again a big, big thank you to them. We were, at the time, able to put Christmas lights at the school and at the Village Hall.

After several years of doing Lee's lights on our own with Steve & Sandra's assistance, they are now funded by the Parish News, with helpers from the village to put them up. We feel very fortunate that this

has been able to continue and we are able to come along each year and remember what Christmas lights meant to Lee, and see the magic of Christmas for children in the village.



### Doorstep trading - do you know your rights?

Neighbourhood police have teamed up with trading standards officers in South Gloucestershire to remind people how to avoid unscrupulous tradespeople.

Local Policing Inspector Lee Moore said: "We've had reports of flyers being delivered in the area promoting home maintenance and gardening services.

"While many legitimate firms use leaflets to promote their business, we know that it's also a favourite tactic for so-called 'rogue traders' – people who persuade householders to have work done unnecessarily, to a poor standard or who overcharge - and we want to remind people how they can steer clear of unscrupulous traders."

You should get three quotes from reputable tradespeople and remember they have a legal right to a cooling off period before work starts.

South Gloucestershire Council holds a 'Buy with Confidence' directory.

According to South Gloucestershire Council: "Our advice is not to deal with cold callers on your doorstep. You do not know who they are, or what their history is. If you are unsure, shut the door. Rogue trading is linked with distraction burglaries and rogue traders are known to have criminal convictions for fraud, violence and Trading Standards offences.

"If you believe you may have been the victim of a rogue trader recently, or suspect a friend, neighbour or family member may have, please report this to South Gloucestershire Council Trading Standards or contact the police."

Leaflets for genuine businesses will usually include the trader's full name and address and a landline telephone number, which can be checked against the phone book or other directory. Be suspicious of any business leaflet which only contains a mobile number, with no other contact details.

The advice from trading standards is:

- get three quotes for work
- do not pay for work or materials in advance
- don't hand over a cash deposit

- don't agree to a trader starting any work straight away
- failure to provide a notice of cancellation rights is a criminal offence
- if you do not receive your cancellation rights in writing, the trader cannot hold you to the contract

If you're are suspicious of a trader's leaflets please contact the **Citizens' Advice consumer helpline** on 03454 04 05 06 or Trading Standards on 01454 868001

If you are concerned about anyone calling door-to-door in your area – especially if they are visiting elderly or vulnerable people – please call us straight away on 101, or 999 if it's an emergency.

This is Terry Truebody's Ghost Writer reporting this month. Having last month informed us that he has lived in Hawkesbury Upton for 40 years, he has absconded from his duties. I suspect he is sunning himself in some outpost of the British Isles, but rumour has it that he has been seen recently blowing his own trumpet in the nether regions of Hillesley.

We often focus our gardening thoughts on flowers and vegetables – especially around Show time, but what about the trees that adorn our village and countryside? Having been successful in making walnut liqueur (an ancient French recipe) I am amazed at the number of walnut trees that we have in our village. Most of the walnuts will become food for the local crows, magpies, rooks and the like – the odd empty shells appearing like magic on garden paths and lawns. Some even have been known to fall on people's heads (dropped, one assumes, by a passing bird). However, walnut liqueur is perhaps one of the best ways to taste walnuts. Five walnuts, picked "in the green" (ie in July), chopped up and mixed with sugar. Add 100% proof alcohol (available in French supermarkets – of course!!) – or vodka - a few litres of red wine and that's all there is. You do have to leave it for at least 4 months – or a year if you can manage it. Small sips at a time are recommended.







### Policies, Sites and Places DPD

The Policies, Sites and Places (PSP) plan for public consultation The plan provides detailed planning policies that the council will use when making decisions on planning applications and also protects some of our much valued open spaces by designating them Local Green Spaces. You may have noticed notices around the village advertising the spaces which will receive the designation however there are many areas not covered by this protection and you may wish to write and object to their exclusion; this includes the allotments, the Plain, the play space on Birgage Road, and Sandpits Lane. ### Change to Bus Timetables – 4th September

There have been changes to the Supported Bus services which include the 84 and 86 and the introduction of the new 85. Stagecoach have won the new tender and new timetables have been published, with an improvement in the service to Yate and Wotton. I have asked for further clarification on the times for the school services.

Changes to Bin Collection-will mean

- all recyclables will be collected on the same day of the week (ie plastics, paper, cardboard, glass etc.)
- No longer collecting engine oil/ car batteries taken to Sort It site.
- Residents can request additional recycling boxes.
- Paper recycling bags no longer available.
- 240 litre black bins replaced by 140 litre collected fortnightly.
- Separate nappy collections.

An officer has been invited to come along to parish council to explain the new collection.

# Grants for central heating systems now available –tight time scale

Households that currently don't have central heating may be eligible for a grant of up to £4,500 to have a new system installed.

This means that any invasive or intrusive work to the roofs will need to be done only either in the spring or late autumn, to minimise disturbance to the bats.


