



It was actually more of a tangle of brambles, nettles, elders, dandelions, dock, rabbits and scrap metal (including a motorbike). We had worried that the soil was going to be glutinous clay but we discovered to our delight that the previous 200 years of cultivation had produced a lovely loose top soil that gave little resistance to a spade and so clearing away a patch of weeds to grow some vegetables was reasonably easy. All the while Dora Thompson kept us supplied with cups of tea. My Dad showed me how to build a proper garden fire and we kept it going for many months and produced enough potash to last for years. The scrap metal filled a skip to the brim and the rabbits were discouraged from their depredations in a way that I would rather not disclose in polite company. Then on 28th August 1976 the long hot summer came to an end



Gill Morgan

On behalf of the Parish News and our readers, we would like to extend our sincere condolences to the family and friends of Gill Morgan. Without Gill and her hard work over 25 years, the Parish News simply would not exist. Gill was also an enthusiastic supporter of the magazine in its current form and commented only last year that she felt it had now been brought "well and truly into the twenty-first century". Gill was an avid fundraiser for the Children's Society, regular churchgoer at St Mary's and member of the choir, and supporter of Hawkesbury Show over the years, often viewing the proceedings on the day, whilst labouring in the raffle tent. Both Jim and Gill contributed to and supported so many groups and events in the village over many years.

Gill will be sadly missed as a daughter, mum, sister, grandma, friend and neighbour. Our thoughts are with the family at this sad time.

Tour of Britain comes to South Gloucestershire

September sees the top level cyclists arrive in South Gloucestershire as part of the Tour of Britain.

Sir Bradley Wiggins should be among the riders, along with Mark Cavendish another of the big names due to feature, after returning from the Rio Olympics. The country's premier stage race takes cyclists from Glasgow to London between September 4-11, with **Stage Five** coming to South Gloucestershire on **Thursday**, **September 8**.

The cyclists set of from Aberdare, Wales, at 11am, with the route taking the pack into England and on to Wotton-under-Edge.

They will come through the village of Kingswood, and move swiftly on to Wickwar and along the B4060 into Chipping Sodbury. There, racers will go up the High Street and down Culverhill Road, past Chipping Sodbury School and on to Wapley.

The route continues past Westerleigh Crematorium and through Pucklechurch as the competitors make their way to Bath for the finish, which is currently estimated to be at 3.30pm.

Anyone who misses the stage will have a second chance to see the event on Saturday, September 10, when Bristol will host the penultimate day of racing.

The stage will include an individual time trial as well as a circuit race, both starting on Durdham Downs.

Final times have yet to be announced, but the Bristol action is set to get going at about 10am for the time trial and about 2.30pm for the circuit race.

Gill Morgan and Hawkesbury Parish News

Gill Morgan began her long association with 'The Hawkesbury Parish News' in September 1977. The first edition of the Parish News was actually printed in January 1976, and came into existence because Iain Marchant, Hawkesbury's vicar at that time, felt that "the area Church Magazine was too expensive, too church centred and too limited for local news". An editorial team was guickly assembled, consisting of Vanda Preece as Secretary, Iris Starling as Treasurer, with assistance from Thelma Isles and in just their second month, 110 magazines were sold. The first magazine was priced at 8p per copy, had a colour picture cover (printed by Mowbray, who supplied covers for Church Magazines) and contained a 4-page Deanery insert, 'The Sign', a preprinted, compilation of articles. letters, adverts and a crossword. And of course there were the local articles, dates for the diary, news from local groups, such as the Mothers Union, WI, Football Club, Mums and Toddlers and the Primary School. There were church service

times, recipes, poems and news of people who had moved into the village - all neatly typed, ON A TYPEWRITER and printed on white, or sometimes pastel coloured paper.

Just as The Parish News was becoming established, lain was transferred to Newent, and the new vicar did not want to be involved with the magazine. This could have been the end of our local Parish magazine, but Gill stepped in, and along with Jane Hopes and John Weaver, they continued to produce a monthly Parish News, with much the same format, for the next few years. In 1981, the editorial team decided to do away with the printed covers and the Deanery insert, which had become too expensive. They chose the Hawkesbury Monument to feature on the front cover, where it has remained to the present day. The first two pages were still dedicated to Church news, times of services, readers and sidesmen, but a number of additional articles were making their appearance in the paper -Senior citizens fund information, items for sale, skittles and darts

reports and Alan Porter's thoughts and musings were included for the first time.

After editing, typing, printing and distributing The Parish News for 25 years, working with a number of different co-editors and overseeing its increase to a 20 page magazine full of information and articles, reports from a range of organisations and societies, along with 5 pages of local advertisements, Gill retired from the role of editor. In the last edition that she helped to produce, December 2001, she wrote her last editorial and a final article about how the Parish News originated and her role in its development over the years. Since she started editing The Parish News, Gill kept one copy of each edition, passing her archives to Gill Carey and Vicky Rispin, who took over the role of editors in 2002. This archive provides a great source of village history and is a wonderful legacy of Gill's amazing 25 years with The Hawkesbury Parish News. We all owe her a huge debt of gratitude for ensuring the survival and continuation of our fabulous Parish News.

Connections can be made at Yate Shopping Centre to the 86 service. Existing school journeys will remain to KLB and Chipping Sodbury schools. Service 86 – Stagecoach (Yate – Emersons Green-Kingswood - Longwell

In August 1803, Henry Jones Randolph, born in 1778, was installed as curate at St. Mary's, Hawkesbury during the incumbencies firstly of Christopher Swainson, and later John Banks Jenkinson, before being himself appointed vicar in 1813 (the year following John Banks' cousin Sir Robert Jenkinson, Baron Hawkesbury, later Lord Liverpool, being appointed prime minister).

Henry Jones Randolph was the son of William Randolph of Bristol and his wife Elizabeth. William, born in 1727, was a Bristol merchant, initially (1739) with Sedgley, Hillhouse & Randolph, and been published, with an improvement in the service to Yate and Wotton. I have asked for further clarification on the times for the school services.




