Think layered security; consider your first line of defence, the perimeter followed by the buildings within and the personal property located inside.

Timely advice from the Fire Service

• Fit smoke alarms on each level of your home and change the batteries in your alarms every year. *Never* remove the batteries.

• Make a fire action plan so that everyone in your home knows how to escape if there's a fire.

• Keep the exits from your home clear so that people can escape if there's a fire. Make sure that everyone in your home can easily find the keys for doors and windows.

• Take extra care in the kitchen – never leave cooking unattended and ensure appliances are switched off after use.

- Close all doors before going to bed.
- Don't overload electrical sockets.

• Make sure cigarettes are stubbed out disposed of carefully, *never* smoke in bed

In the event of fire, get out, stay out and dial 999.
