She suggested that you don't have to sow EVERY seed in the packet. It is allowed to sow only a few.

Now that I'm liberated from my job, I'd rather do away with my watch and my radio alarm and listen to my body clock instead. Now I no longer have to get to the office by a fixed time, I just wander into my study when I'm ready and take a seat at my desk. Surely following my body clock must make for a healthier lifestyle.

After all, it's not that long since it was common practice across the country to take the time directly from the sun. It was only the construction of the London-Bristol railway that caused this part of the country to reset its timepieces to match the capitol's. Apparently, we were far enough west for our day to run 11 minutes behind central London's. This would have made the first London-Bristol train timetables bewildering, were it not for the fact that the newly built Temple Meads Station helpfully offered passengers two clocks, one showing local time, the other "Railway Time", i.e. 11 minutes earlier.

Unfortunately, there is just one small obstacle that will stop me from giving full free rein to my body clock: my daughter still has to get to school by half past eight. So it looks as if my household will also have to keep two clocks, one for London time, the other for Debbie time. I wonder if I can persuade Hawkesbury School to do the same?

"Bristol Suffragettes" by Dawn Dyer

THEY FOUGHT FOR IT, THEY STARVED FOR IT: THE VOTE



"Go home and do the washing!" were taunts levied at women holding a mass rally on Bristol Downs in 1908.

Although women rate-payers had been entitled to vote in local elections since 1869 their right to vote to influence national policy still eluded them. The Women's Social and Political Union (WPSU), founded by Emmeline Pankhurst in 1903 had become the more militant arm of the movement for women's suffrage (the right to vote) and was well represented in the West Country. Begbrook, an old house at Frenchay, was gutted by fire and a copy of the magazine 'The Suffragette' left to identify the culprits. Winston Churchill was attacked with a dog whip at Temple Meads Station, "Take that for the women of England" and the perpetrator, Theresa Garnett, imprisoned in Holloway. Other militant suffragettes burned the University's sports pavilion only to find their headquarters attacked by students in retribution. The tactic of interrupting meetings was widely used and, more than once, suffragettes managed to hide inside the organ of the Colston Hall to disrupt political speakers.

Dawn's talk will chart the struggle for Women's Suffrage in Bristol and the South West. She has researched local and national docu-

ments relating to the Bristol fight for the vote, and will mention local women involved in the struggle, as well as militant WSPU members (the suffragettes) and the non-militant suffragists.

NB. Women had to wait until after the end of the First World War for the vote, and even then it was restricted to those over the age of 30 who were married, owned property or had a degree.





Corny Conundrum—Resolved!

Reference: your 'Corny Conundrum' letter in last month's magazine.

The field of apparently unharvested maize off Starveall Lane is a game crop, specifically planted for the sole purpose of providing cover and a food source for pheasants and partridges. As such it forms part of the Badminton Estate Shoot. You will have noticed that the crop is divided by cleared, strawed feeding rides, where on a daily basis Badminton gamekeepers broadcast supplementary game food. A supply of fresh water is also constantly available. This situation is highly attractive not only game birds but many other bird species. The maize grown is a fodder crop variety and no amount of boiling will tenderise it sufficiently for human consumption.

I hope this explains the situation. I think it good that you asked the question, as I'm sure you are not the only person to have wondered about the situation. Throughout the world, in all sorts of situations misunderstandings arise because of a lack of information. Clothes collection caution

On Sunday 21st March clothing collection bags were posted door-to-door in the village by an organisation claiming to be raising money to combat breast cancer. As my mother carries out voluntary work for Cancer Research UK, I scrutinised the material very carefully, as it did not seem quite right.

The packaging asks householders to sort any unwanted clothes and shoes for a roadside collection in aid of a 'breast cancer prevention programme'. The flyers feature a rose petal border and a pink ribbon – a symbol used by breast cancer charities worldwide. The material displayed no charity number and claimed to contribute money from the proceeds of selling the clothing to a breast cancer prevention program in Lithuania.

I did a quick internet search on the information and the company name and came up with some <u>very</u> interesting Trading Standards information, following distribution of similar collection bags in the north of England...

The flyers are very similar to those used by many charity appeals but the word 'charity' does not appear on the leaflet and neither does a registered charity number. The leaflets list the company behind the collections as Intersecond Ltd, who are appointed agents for the Do Not Delay organisation.

Intersecond Ltd lists a London address and a fax and phone number on the flyer. Apparently, it is a legitimate company but this phone number is not theirs and they have stopped doing these collections, which makes it highly likely that the flyer is bogus and the proceeds would not go to breast cancer charities. The leaflet also urges the reader to visit the Do Not Delay website (www.donotdelay.org). However the official website carries the following message on its front page:

Attention — Clothing collection has been cancelled from 01/08/2007 in the United Kingdom, (Wales and Scotland) until further notice. Any leaflet distribution or clothing collection during the period by individuals using Intersecond Ltd name are illegitimate and in no way associated with the company. The Charity Commission says it has also received complaints about the leaflet.

Any collection leaflet from a genuine charity should include a **registered charity number**. To be registered as a charity, organisations have to be established for solely charitable purposes.

If you have clothing, shoes or any items to donate, please take them to your local charity shop and avoid funding these money-making scams.

Anyone with concerns about charity collections can call Consumer Direct on 08454 04 05 06 (calls charged at local rate).

Hawkesbury Energy Group Update

The Energy Group held an Open Day on Saturday, 27th February to update villagers on its proposals. Originally formed as part of the Hawkesbury Parish Vision Plan, it has been examining options to replace the aging oil-fired boiler in the Village Hall with sustainable alternatives. The group is advocating the installation at the Village Hall of a Ground Source Heat Pump (GSHP) and (15kW, 15m) wind turbine (see plan below) to reduce its Carbon Footprint. During the two sessions, there was a good cross section of frank views and several actions were agreed, such as arranging visits to similar types of installation nearby, which will be arranged shortly.


We really want to hear from you as we need to understand everyone's views (both positive and negative) and gauge the level of support. At the same time, we are continuing to apply for the necessary capital grants in order to confirm the viability of the scheme.

Clearly the scheme will eventually require planning permission but we wish to consult and take on board everyone's views, so that concerns, questions and suggestions can be addressed at the earliest opportunity.

If in the meantime you would like to look at a similar installation, there is a wind turbine in Sainsburys car park at Emersons Green and another one is behind the Fire Station in Wotton-Under-Edge.

District Councillor Report

The Core Strategy - The new Planning Framework

The South Gloucestershire Council Cabinet agreed the Core Strategy Pre-Submission Publication Draft and supporting Sustainability Appraisal- new words for what was The Local Plan. Although the formal consultation will not start until after the election, the documents are available on the website www.southglos.gov.uk/corestrategy

The document includes new polices on the Green Infrastructure – our green open spaces, parks, public rights of way etc. and renewable and low carbon energy generation as well as identifying areas of future growth, maintaining economic prosperity, and providing housing for all. Provision has been made for a major mixed use development of up to 3000 dwellings and employment opportunities in North Yate.

The rural areas policies are to protect and conserve the distinctive character, beauty, wildlife, landscape, biodiversity and heritage of the countryside, as well as protect valuable agricultural land and opportunities for local food production. It is proposed to encourage contributions to appropriate new communication technologies. It is intended to maintain the settlement boundaries around rural settlements for the first 5 years of the Core Strategy, and reflect any change in approach to rural housing distribution, after further consultation with local communities.

Parishes are being asked to consider how they would like to consult with their communities on this document which will provide the planning framework for the next sixteen years.

Bus fare increase

Although we don't see any First Buses out in our part of the world, those who use their services, may be interested to learn that they are putting up fares from the 4th April. Adult single fares will be increased by 10p, return fares 5p. Child single and return fares will be increased by 10p. The Council has written to First expressing concern on how this will impact on bus patronage. Remember those Over 60 are entitled to a concessionary bus pass for free travel after 9.00 am.

Road Speed Review

As part of a national review, there has been a speed review on all Class A & B roads. This seems to have been done without any local consultation, and although I have pressed for further information, this does not appear to be currently forthcoming. The A46 is a very busy road, which has had a high number of accidents and local people fighting for speed reductions. It will be interesting to see what has been recommended for this road, and I will pass on this information when I receive it.

Higher Level Stewardship (HLS) for The Commons.

At the recently held meeting for Rights Holders and Graziers of the Commons, there was agreement to go ahead with forming a Rights Holders Committee which would feed into how the grazing would be managed in line with Natural England's guidance. South Gloucestershire Council has agreed to sign the HLS agreement on the understanding that the Commons would be grazed up to the required levels in the Plan. It may be necessary to fund a hayward to help with the local management and this also received general agreement. Work will go ahead on creating the agreed processes so the HLS can be delivered. Please contact me if you require further information.

Grants

Congratulations to two village organisations who received grant funding from the South Gloucestershire Council Local Area Small Grants - Hawkesbury Stallions Football Club (£700) and Hawkesbury Youth Club. (£1500). The next round of small grants opens in May.

The R. A. Lister Company in Dursley and the Bicton Park Botanical Gardens in Devon

The R.A. Lister Company was founded in Dursley in 1867 by Sir Robert Ashton Lister (1845 — 1929) to produce agricultural machinery. Robert Ashton became known as Ashton and went to school in Dursley. The company expanded in later years making sheep shearing machinery, milking machines, milk churn and barrel making, wooden garden seats, tubs and vases. Ashton Lister was always interested in the welfare and value of his staff. In 1910, the works closed for the day, so everyone could travel by charter train from Dursley to Weston-super-Mare for a day trip to the seaside.

In 1914, Lister's made petrol engines, lighting sets and munitions components. Women workers replaced men who fought during the 1914 — 1918 war. In 1926, the autotruck was introduced and made until 1973. Robert Ashton Lister died in 1929 age 84. In 1931, the Duke of York visited Lister's and toured the works. In 1939, many workers were called up to the services. In World War 2, Lister's made engines, agricultural machinery and shell cases. Queen Mary made a visit to Lister's in 1940.

The R. A. Lister works have made a large range of products during its lifetime. In 1965, the company was taken over by the Hawker Siddeley Group and was no longer a family owned business.

My late uncle Douglas Elliott from Hawkesbury Upton worked at Lister's for over 40 years from the 1940s to 1970s. He travelled to and from Dursley on his Ariel Red Hunter motorbike for many years before getting a car lift to work with Jack Hodges who lived in Sandpits Lane. It would be interesting to know if anyone living today in Hawkesbury Upton or nearby can remember the names of the men and women who worked at Lister's during the 1939—1970 years. I believe Bob Millard, Ella's husband worked there. Maybe a list of names with memories could be listed and published in a future edition of Hawkesbury Parish News.

I visit Bicton Park Botanical Gardens, East Budleigh, Budleigh Salterton, Devon, EX9 7BG many times and was pleased to have met Frederick William Lister, a grandson of the late Robert Ashton Lister. Fred Lister is the curator of the Countryside Museum at Bicton Park Botanical Gardens. In the museum there is a fine collection of traction engines, vintage machinery, traditional tools, tractors and domestic memorabilia that traces the history of rural life at Bicton and elsewhere in Britain over the past 250 years. Bicton Park Botanical Gardens and the Countryside Museum are well worth a visit to see and enjoy beautiful historic gardens, museum, railway and children's play areas. Open all year.
