Well, the Christmas parties are over, the presents have been wrapped and unwrapped, the turkey has been carved, curried and rissoled, the tree has dropped another thousand needles




and now a whole new year beckons.

A few ideas for the vegetable garden in January

Whilst it's true that the lack of both warmth and light in the garden at present is not conducive to doing much outside, there are a few things we can do to get things moving.

Broad beans can be planted now on a window sill, or in a cold greenhouse in cell trays of general purpose compost. The best variety for the present is Aquadulce Claudia which are widely available and most suited to this time of year. They should be watered on planting and then only sparingly, as over-watering can lead to the seeds rotting. If the they are looked after, a set of healthy plants will be ready for planting out in spring

Garlic can still be planted if soil conditions permit. The bulbs should be split into separate cloves and planted into soil which has been enriched with manure, compost or chicken manure pellets. The corms need to be pushed into the soil to a depth of at least 5cms. to the root end unlike onion sets and shallots which are plated on the surface. Garlic will be

happy in winter gardens as it needs a spell in cold conditions to encourage growth. Don't be tempted to use garlic from the supermarket shelf as this will invariably have come from a warm climate and be totally unsuitable for growing here. There is a good variety available in the garden centres which is easy to grow. It is a very hungry plant and will flourish even more if given a fortnightly feed of a general product such as Phostrogen(other feeds are available) once the plant is 8 to 10 cms high

First early potatoes will benefit when planted out in late March, from being started into growth now. This is done by the process of "chitting" which involves standing up the seed potato to show the end with the most root indentations uppermost to the light. It should

be done in frost- free conditions and an egg box or something similar will help to keep the potatoes upright. Care should be taken when planting, not to knock off the shoots which have developed. One or two seeds may be planted now in a bag or bucket (with drainage holes) and grown in a cold greenhouse. When shoots appear they should be watered weekly and covered with fleece if a severe frost is forecast. This is all worthwhile if a small crop of new potatoes is ready for Easter lunch.



New Commons Officer at South Gloucestershire Council

I am delighted to have taken up the post of Commons HLS Delivery Officer at South Gloucestershire Council after Mike Plumb moved on to new pastures back in the summer. Working two days per week, I will be responsible for ensuring that the council delivers the management agreed in the Higher Level Stewardship (HLS) agreement for Hawkesbury, Inglestone, Hareley and Assley Commons. HLS is an agri-environment scheme, overseen by Natural England, and the aim of the agreement is to restore the species-rich grassland of the Commons through cattle grazing and scrub control, and to implement habitat management for key species including the very special Badgeworth buttercup, which occurs on only two sites in the UK.

My background is as an ecologist and farm conservation adviser. Having studied at the University of Bristol and Harper Adams University, I have previously worked for organisations including FWAG, Wessex Water and Cleeve Common Board of Conservators. More recently I have been working as an independent adviser as an associate of FWAG South West, in particular working at Cleeve Common to deliver their Higher Level Stewardship agreement. Common land absolutely fascinates me and in addition to Cleeve Common I have been fortunate enough to work on other commons such as Painswick Beacon and Brill Common.

I am passionate about integrating land use with conservation, and common land is particularly special in this regard. You can find out more about the management of the Commons, including the current scrub clearance works, in the 'management of the commons' pages of the Hawkesbury Common website at www.hawkesburycommon.co.uk. As projects develop there will be opportunities to get involved and I would love to hear from you if you would be interested in joining in. I very much look forward to getting to know the Commons and meeting some of you and hearing your aspirations for the management of the Commons.





FROM THE VICARAGE January 2014

Dear Parishioners,

In years gone by, All Saints, Christmas, Epiphany and Candlemas were the big four winter festivals. They brought to light the cold and wintry spell of weather, and made it shine with light and celebration.

As we put Christmas to bed, we now enter upon the two last winter Feasts of the year. Epiphany (Jan 6th) and Candlemas (Feb 2nd). Epiphany remembers the arrival of the three wise men and the theme of Epiphany is recognising God in Christ. All very well, that a baby has been born, but do you see God in Him? An epiphany of God, you see. Candlemas remembers Mary and Joseph presenting the child to old Simeon in the Temple. He cries out the words of the Nunc Dimittis: 'Lord now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, according to thy word, for mine eyes have seen thy salvation....etc', words said or sung at Evensong. It traditionally became the moment, when candles were brought to church to be blessed by the Priest. And St Lawrence, Didmarton has for some years, had a service and candlelit supper to remember this important Feast.

We can also add to the Christian feasts; Burns night (Jan 25th) if you wish to join our Scottish friends and enjoy a wee spot of Haggis and whisky, with some of Robbie's poetry. We are putting on two such suppers in the Benefice, one at Hawkesbury and the other at Leighterton, both raising money for the Church.

I love the winter, and enjoying these feasts in the heart of the English countryside, is just the best. Keep safe during this icy month and if you are interested in St Wulfstan (d.1095) who was the Vicar of Hawkesbury Parish for five years, then come to an evening service at St Mary's (6pm, 19th Jan) followed by a feast in the Beaufort Arms afterwards. After all, the Parish of Hawkesbury in his day, covered Badminton, Didmarton and much else in this varied Benefice.

South Gloucestershire District Councillor Report

Surveys The Young & the not so Young.

At the recent Area Forum, I managed to secure funding to identify the youth service need in the Cotswold Edge Ward. There are over 200 young people living in the ward, with one youth club at Hawkesbury Upton. Working with the Hawkesbury Youth Club, we hope to canvass young people to learn about their requirements and how this can be achieved. Any comments, especially from young people would be most welcome.

As part of a National Survey, the local health service is conducting a Call to Action to help them form their 5 year plan. The survey can be found on <u>https://www.surveymonkey.com/s/M5P568D</u>. If you would like a paper copy please ring 0117 947 4400

The future of Frenchay Hospital, after the move to the Southmead site in May 2014 is still unknown. A planning application for nearly 500 houses on the site was recently given the go ahead. Space on the site has been left for a health and social care centre, but this has been delayed because of the referral to the Secretary of State. Plans to reduce A&E admissions and further support care for people in their own hopes are being developed.

Transport to Southmead.

Funds for a direct bus route from Yate to Southmead Hospital have been secured and announcements will be made shortly on the proposed timetables.

Defibulator

I have been asked about providing a defibulator locally, and from my personal experience, I think this is an excellent idea. I have contacted the local ambulance service for full details – if you would like to join a short term fundraising group – please get in touch.

Solar Panels – lots of them

Residents were asked for their views at an exhibition which was held recently, for developing 180 acres of solar panels on the Cotswold's AONB. Some of the fields lie adjacent to the M4, near Junction 18, other fields were south of the motorway within Tormarton Parish, A full planning application is anticipated in January.

South Gloucestershire Council is one of the few Councils in the country to have adopted its Core Strategy, providing the planning framework until 2027. As well as identifying sites for large new neighbourhoods at Cribbs Causeway/Patchway, Yate, Harry Stoke and Emersons Green to take most of the 28,355 homes, including affordable homes; it includes the creation of three new Enterprise Areas in Filton, Severnside and Emersons Green with the potential to deliver thousands of new jobs. It also outlines major transport routes, together with community facilities. The final document will be published after Christmas

After the departure of Mike Plumb, South Gloucestershire Council has appointed a new officer to manage the HLS Agreement on The Commons. Ellie Philips, who has experience in managing Commons in other parts of Gloucestershire, will be getting round the area and meeting residents. (& has an introductory piece in this parish mag).



Operators of Bristol waste firm imprisoned for fly tipping in South Gloucestershire

Partners of a Bristol-based rubbish clearance firm have been found guilty of fly tipping household waste in South Gloucestershire on 2 separate occasions. In summing up, the Magistrate stated they were jointly responsible, both corporately and individually of tipping the waste. Their actions deceived the public who thought they were employing a legitimate waste firm, and they caused significant inconvenience by blocking access to a farmer's field and the road to a residential property. **Both men were sentenced to 6 months in prison and ordered to pay £2,487 each in costs.**

Andrew Issacs, 33, of Westbury Lane, Coombe Dingle and Kemar Lewis, 29, of Havilland House, St Judes ran a waste company trading under the names of Andrew(s) & Sons and Bristol Rubbish Clearance.

In November last year, Andrew & Sons were hired to remove old garden sheds and household waste from a property in St Andrews, Bristol. The rubbish was later found fly tipped in a lane in Tormarton on December 3, 2012.

During another incident, the firm were booked by to carry out a house clearance from a property in Brislington. The householder believed they were a reputable company which was licensed to carry waste and paid them £180 to remove a full lorry load of rubbish including suitcases, glass, pictures, cans of paint and clothing on January 5 this year.

The rubbish was found tipped in the middle of Gumhurn Lane, Pilning, the next day.

There was so much rubbish it completely blocked the lane and had to be removed by the council's emergency out of hours team.

Despite illegally fly-tipping the first load of waste, the partners returned to the Brislington house a few days later to remove the rest of the rubbish, charging a further £100 for disposal. No waste transfer notes could be provided to show the second load was legally disposed of.

Isaacs' and Lewis also admitted to 11 further offences of failing to provide waste transfer notes which was taken into account. The waste transfer notes show that waste is being disposed of properly and must be kept for 2 years.

Both men pleaded guilty to the charges when the case was heard at North Avon Magistrates' Court in Yate earlier this month on November 11. The case was adjourned for pre-sentence reports and sentencing was carried out today (Tuesday 26 November). They were arrested in April this year following a joint operation with Avon & Somerset Police and officers from South Gloucestershire Council's envirocrime team.




