Welcome to the April edition of Hawkesbury Parish News.







Not Written Off

Although it's taken me a long time to label myself as a writer, writing has been at the core of all the jobs I have ever done - reporter, PR, marketeer. But what I most enjoy writing - and reading - are letters. Among my most precious possessions are airletters penned by my grandmother when, aged 8, I lived in America for a year. (Her not-so-subtle parting gift to me was a writing case, so that I might write to her too.) I cherish boxes of letters from old schoolfriends, received when I moved to Germany at the age of 14.

So I was terribly disappointed to discover last year that I'd missed by a few days the deadline to apply for a job writing letters for Steve Webb, our local MP, responding to his constituents' enquiries and requests. For a long-term supporter of the Lib Dems, what a dream job that would have been: getting paid for writing about issues that really mattered to society and playing a small but significant part in changing our nation for the better.

My disappointment was short-lived. In the wake of the General Election, as the new coalition emerged, I decided I'd had a lucky escape. I would not have relished responding to the wrath of the disillusioned masses. I began to feel sorry for Steve Webb, even though he'd been elevated to Cabinet Minister. But I still couldn't stop myself firing off a few letters to him expressing my dissatisfaction with some of the new government's policies.

Then last week I had the chance to meet him. He visited the village school to plant a tree donated by Morrisons and I was invited to take photos for the school. My disenchantment quickly melted away. He came across as a sympathetic, dedicated representative of our community with a genuine interest in our children. Some of them will not be eligible to vote for another 14 years, so no cynical fishing for votes there. He may be a Cabinet Minister, but he gave himself no airs and graces. No formal silver spade for him – he got stuck in and muddy. And no cynical kissing of babies, either – instead he played "Rock, Paper, Scissors" with the Year 6 boys.

A little later, we spoke briefly and he asked me my name.

"Ah, yes, Debbie Young," he smiled. "France Lane."

My goodness! I thought. A Cabinet minister knows where I live! What stroppy message had I put in my letters to make my address stick in his mind? But really, that doesn't matter now. Next time there's an election, I know who'll be getting my vote.

Hawkesbury Local History Society **Marianne North – a Victorian Lady from Alderley**

A talk by Gina Merritt Smith



Marianne North was a remarkable self-taught Victorian artist who, at the age of 40, began a series of trips around the world, often unaccompanied, and visiting areas virtually unknown to European travellers. Inspired by the exotic plant collections she had seen at the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew, she devoted the rest of her life to painting the flora of these distant countries. Her prolific, and often brightly coloured, oil paintings of flowers and their habitats provide an accurate record of species from all parts of the world. Having painted more than 900 species she offered her collection of paintings to Kew, and to build a gallery to house them. She had a year's break from travelling to arrange the wall to wall coverage of the paintings (well over 800) herself. Every inch of the walls was covered, and she even decorated the doors and friezes of the room, ensuring that the display of her paintings was as exotic as the flowers themselves. Marianne undertook her last great journey, in spite of failing health, in 1884, to Chile. She retired to the quiet Gloucestershire countryside and spent the last few years of her life at Alderley, where she died on August 30th 1890. The Marianne North Gal-

lery at Kew, originally opened in 1882, has recently undergone restoration and re-opened in October 2009.



TRADING STANDARDS — ATTENTION Clothing Collection Leaflets

South Gloucestershire Council's Trading Standards officers and neighbourhood police are warning people in South Gloucestershire to be wary of door-to-door leaflets asking for unwanted clothing.

There is currently a red and white flyer asking to collect clothes for a charity called 'Breaking the Waves'. The website on the flyer does not exist and the telephone number provided does not connect. The police have some concerns and are currently investigating.

The only way to guarantee that donations benefit good causes is to deal only with charities you know are genuine, or take unwanted items direct to a charity shop.

Neil Derrick, Senior Enforcement Officer with South Gloucestershire Trading Standards, said: "Clothing collections are regularly conducted throughout the area and, although some are genuinely for charitable purposes, we have concerns that others are just done for commercial gain and that the public are being misled by false claims about the use to which their donations are put and the use of bogus company details."




Instead, we need to examine the motives of our hearts and trust Him to give us exactly what we need.

Science works magic for pupils at Rose Hill Westonbirt School

Rose Hill Westonbirt pupils were left amazed after spending time travelling through the human digestive system on Thursday, February 17th, all thanks to the Explorer Dome.

District Councillor Report

Council Tax

South Gloucestershire Council agreed to freeze the Council Tax. The Council welcomed government funding for a council tax freeze. The funding, equivalent to a 2.5% rise in Council Tax, is being provided to Councils who freeze Council Tax, to help them meet demand for services without having to pass the burden on to local people. This is also supported by £2.3m from the Council's reserves. As yet –the full details of the Council budget are to be announced.

Frome Vale Area Forum

Small grants were awarded, at the last Forum meeting; Hawkesbury Youth Club received a grant of £1500 towards their running costs, however it was clear that this could not be relied upon in the future.

The local priorities were agreed from the Traffic Management Task Register for jobs under (£50k). Weight limits on local Hawkesbury and Horton roads are to be considered.

Other traffic management schemes which I have discussed with officers are the signs for directing Heavy Freight traffic and progress with a safer walking route to school; the latter will be on the Task Register; however the suggested works are over £50,000 and I have asked officers to consider a phased approach to this work.

Good News on the **recycling** front – after pressure from residents, the Council will be supplying free recycling bags to store cardboard. These will be available from nominated sites in the summer – they will not be delivered to each home.

There are big changes planned for all public services. Health protection and promotion will return to the Local authority umbrella. South Gloucestershire Council is currently consulting on a Health Strategy for our area - this concentrates on children and young people – especially combating the rise in childhood obesity. It is likely that Bristol could have a locally elected Mayor; this would impact on South Gloucestershire. There are also plans to have an elected police Chief Commissioner by 2013 for our area.

Handy Van Help

The over 60s and those of any age with disabilities can have minor household repair jobs done at a reduced rate by South Gloucestershire Council's Handy Van service. The idea is to help people maintain their properties so that they can enjoy living independently for as long as possible.

The Handy Van service is available to do a wide range of small jobs around the house – the sort of jobs that will take less than three hours. Labour is charged at a subsidised rate. Materials are charged for as necessary. They can carry out:

Odd jobs around the home such as:

- fitting curtain rails
- hanging pictures,
- laying floor coverings
- · moving furniture within the property

Plumbing jobs such as:

- taps
- washers
- leaks
- blocked sinks

Carpentry jobs such as:

- door repairs
- putting up shelves
- fixing sash cords
- assembling flat packs

window repairs

General building work:

- gutter cleaning
 - fixing slabs and cracks in paths
 - pointing and plaster repairs
- washing lines
- fencing

In addition to that the Handy Van service offers a **free home security** and safety check and where necessary will fit free door and window locks, door chains and door viewers, and free low energy light bulbs.

Some people will remember Community Action, the Community Council for the Avon area. I was a trustee of the charity, and it is very sad to report that the business had to be wound up because of lack of funding. The Parish has benefitted in many different ways from the organisation's help - with the first Housing Needs Survey, support for the youth choir, advice and help to village halls, support to village shops and our community transport scheme as well as being supportive with funding for the Parish Plan. Currently there is no other organisation offering this sort of help and support to those in rural areas.


